30			GENERAL PROVISIONS
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1 Section 101. Short title.

2 This act shall be known and may be cited as the General3 Appropriation Act of 2016.

4 Section 102. Definitions.

5 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 6 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 7 context clearly indicates otherwise:

8 "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau 9 or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant 10 superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists, 11 engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries, 12 auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians, 13 marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and 14 other assistants in any department, board or commission.

15 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding 16 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies, 17 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and 18 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and 19 telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and 20 notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel, 21 light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation, repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and 22 23 facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on 24 workers' compensation, insurance premiums on policies of liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment 25 26 insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee 27 28 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth 29 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or 30

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additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental 1 2 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of 3 General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned 4 automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred 5 through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall 6 7 include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State 8 institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside hospital, provided, that in no case shall the State institution 9 10 pay more for patient care than that provided under the State 11 medical assistance program.

(a) General Fund.--The following sums set forth in this act,
or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically
appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter
named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial

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Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, 1 2 wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly 3 elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for 4 5 the purchase or rental of goods and services, printing, public advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and 6 buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by 7 8 law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 9 10 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 11 12 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.

(b) State Lottery Fund.--The following sums set forth in 13 14 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 15 specifically appropriated from the State Lottery Fund to the 16 several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 17 18 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 19 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 20 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as 21 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 22 23 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 24 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 25 2016, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016. 26

(c) Tobacco Settlement Fund.--The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Tobacco Settlement Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of

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the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 1 2 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 3 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 4 5 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 6 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 7 8 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 9 2016, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 10 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.

11 Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account. -- The (d) 12 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may 13 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the 14 restricted receipt account established within the General Fund, 15 known as the Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account, to 16 the Judicial Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses, for 17 18 the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the 19 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of 20 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary 21 for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year 22 23 beginning July 1, 2016, and for the payment of bills incurred 24 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016. 25

(e) Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund.--The
following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may
be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the
Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund to the several
hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the

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Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services 1 2 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and 3 for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, 4 functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set 5 forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and for the 6 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of 7 8 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.

9 (f) The State Stores Fund. -- The following sums set forth in 10 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from The State Stores Fund to the 11 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the 12 13 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 14 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 15 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 16 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 17 18 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 19 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 20 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 21 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016. 22

23 (q) Motor License Fund.--The following sums, or as much 24 thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the 25 Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department for the payment of salaries, wages and 26 27 other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or 28 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for 29 contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper 30 conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes

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hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
 2016, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.

4 (h) Aviation Restricted Account.--The following sums, or as 5 much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from 6 the Aviation Restricted Account in the Motor License Fund to the 7 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department for the 8 purposes set forth herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 9 2016, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 10 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.

11 Hazardous Material Response Fund.--The following sums (i) 12 set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, 13 are hereby specifically appropriated from the Hazardous Material 14 Response Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the 15 Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of fees 16 for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 17 18 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 19 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 20 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 21 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016. 22

23 (j) Milk Marketing Fund.--The following sums set forth in 24 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 25 specifically appropriated from the Milk Marketing Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department 26 27 of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 28 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 29 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 30

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1 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 2 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 3 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 4 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 5 2016, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 6 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.

7 (k) Home Investment Trust Fund. -- The following sums set 8 forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are 9 hereby specifically appropriated from the Home Investment Trust 10 Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, 11 wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly 12 13 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the 14 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the 15 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of 16 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities 17 18 and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year 19 beginning July 1, 2016, and for the payment of bills incurred 20 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016. 21

Tuition Account Guaranteed Savings Program Fund. -- The 22 (1) 23 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may 24 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the 25 Tuition Account Guaranteed Savings Program Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the 26 27 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 28 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 29 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 30

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1 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as
2 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct
3 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
4 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
5 2016, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
6 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.

7 Banking Fund. -- The following sums set forth in this act, (m) or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically 8 9 appropriated from the Banking Fund to the hereinafter named 10 agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel 11 12 expenses of the duly appointed officers and employees of the 13 Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services 14 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and 15 for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by 16 this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set 17 18 forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of 19 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016. 20

21 Firearm Records Check Fund. -- The following sums set (n) forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are 22 23 hereby specifically appropriated from the Firearm Records Check 24 Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive 25 Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly 26 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the 27 28 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the 29 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary 30

(o) Ben Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund.--The 6 7 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may 8 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Ben 9 Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund to the 10 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the 11 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 12 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 13 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 14 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 15 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 16 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 17 18 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 19 2016, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 20 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.

21 (p) Oil and Gas Lease Fund. -- The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 22 23 specifically appropriated from the Oil and Gas Lease Fund to the 24 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the 25 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 26 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 27 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 28 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 29 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 30

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of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
 2016, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.

(q) Home Improvement Account.--The following sums set forth 5 6 in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Home Improvement Account 7 8 within the General Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the 9 Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of 10 salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for 11 the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the 12 13 purchase or rental of goods and services and for payment of any 14 other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and 15 16 for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and for the payment of bills incurred 17 18 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 19 30, 2016.

20 (r) Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter Protection Act Enforcement Fund. -- The following sums set forth in this act, or 21 as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically 22 23 appropriated from the Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter 24 Protection Act Enforcement Fund to the hereinafter named 25 agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the 26 payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers and employees of the 27 28 Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services 29 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this 30

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1 act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions 2 and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for 3 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and for the payment of 4 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal 5 year ending June 30, 2016.

7 Insurance Regulation and Oversight Fund. -- The following (t) sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be 8 9 necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the 10 Insurance Regulation and Oversight Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the 11 payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel 12 13 expenses of the duly appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services 14 15 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and 16 for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions 17 18 and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for 19 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and for the payment of 20 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016. 21

22 (u) Pennsylvania Racehorse Development Restricted Receipt 23 Account.--The following sums set forth in this act, or as much 24 thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically 25 appropriated from the Pennsylvania Racehorse Development 26 Restricted Receipt Account established within the Pennsylvania 27 Racehorse Development Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of 28 the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of 29 fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or 30 rental of goods and services and for the payment of any other

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expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.

7 Justice Reinvestment Fund. -- The following sums set forth (V) 8 in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Justice Reinvestment Fund to 9 10 the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department and government support agencies of the Commonwealth for the payment 11 of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of 12 the duly appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, 13 14 for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for 15 the purchase or rental of goods and services and for payment of 16 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities 17 18 and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year 19 beginning July 1, 2016, and for the payment of bills incurred 20 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 21 30, 2016.

(w) Multimodal Transportation Fund. -- The following sums set 22 23 forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are 24 hereby specifically appropriated from the Multimodal 25 Transportation Fund to the Department of Transportation for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel 26 expenses, for the payment of fees for contractual services 27 28 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and 29 for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, 30

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1 functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set 2 forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and for the 3 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of 4 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.

5 Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations.

6 The following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth 7 in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 8 specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive 9 10 Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses 11 of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for 12 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and for the payment of 13 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal 14 year ending June 30, 2016. Unless otherwise stated, the 15 appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal 16 year.

17 Section 106. Block grants.

(a) Appropriation.--The following sums set forth in this
act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
specifically appropriated from the block grant (BG) funds to the
several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department
of the Commonwealth for the purposes and under the restrictions
for which the funds are provided for the fiscal year beginning
July 1, 2016.

(b) Small Communities Development Block Grant.--The Small Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small cities and communities that have a high concentration of impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their low-income and moderate-income housing opportunities and to meet community development needs.

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1 (c) Community Services Block Grant.--The Community Services 2 Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and 3 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the 4 community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In 5 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old 6 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements 7 8 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to assure proper consideration of each recipient. 9

(d) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.--The
Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is
for the provision of preventive health and other health services
related to emergency medical systems, health initiative grants,
comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health
education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and domestic
violence services.

17 (e) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant. -- The 18 Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to 19 enable states to maintain and strengthen their leadership in 20 planning, promoting, coordinating and evaluating health care for preqnant women, mothers, infants and children, and children with 21 special health care needs and in providing health services for 22 23 mothers and children who do not have access to adequate health 24 care.

(f) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant.--The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income families and individuals, including energy efficiency grants for low-income dwellings. No less than 15% of the LIHEABG funds received shall be used for weatherization. LIHEABG funds

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received pursuant to a Presidential release of contingency funds
 shall be exempt from the 15% requirement.

3 (g) Social Services Block Grant.--The Social Services Block
4 Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible
5 persons.

6 (h) Mental Health Services Block Grant.--The Mental Health 7 Services Block Grant (MHSBG) provides funds for the provision of 8 services to adults with serious mental illness or children with 9 serious emotional disturbance.

(i) Substance Abuse Block Grant.--The Substance Abuse Block
Grant (SABG) provides funds to establish and maintain programs
to combat alcohol and drug abuse.

(j) Child Care and Development Fund Block Grant.--The Child Care and Development Fund Block Grant (CCDFBG) is for the provision of direct child care or to increase the quality and availability of child care for low-income families.

17 (k) Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant.-18 The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant (TANFBG)
19 provides funds for the provision of cash grants, child care,
20 training and support services, child welfare and administration
21 for eligible families and individuals.

22 Section 107. Appropriations to Pennsylvania Higher Education23 Assistance Agency.

The appropriations set forth in this act to the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency, which is an integral part and arm of the Commonwealth and which is directly controlled by the Commonwealth, shall supplement other Commonwealth funds maintained by the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency in order to fulfill its essential State governmental function of providing Commonwealth students with access to

21 Section 2004. Subgrants between Federal fund appropriations. 22 Subgrants may be made between Federal appropriations without 23 further approval of the General Assembly.
