A BILL

To provide supplemental appropriations for fiscal year 2024, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That following sums are appropriated, out of any money
4 in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the fiscal
5 year ending September 30, 2024, and for other purposes,
6 namely:

2 DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE

3 MILITARY PERSONNEL

4 MILITARY PERSONNEL, ARMY

5 For an additional amount for “Military Personnel,
6 Army”, \$207,158,000, to remain available until December
7 31, 2024, to respond to the situation in Ukraine and for
8 related expenses: *Provided*, That such amount is des-
9 ignated by the Congress as being for an emergency re-
10 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Bal-
11 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

12 MILITARY PERSONNEL, MARINE CORPS

13 For an additional amount for “Military Personnel,
14 Marine Corps”, \$3,538,000, to remain available until De-
15 cember 31, 2024, to respond to the situation in Ukraine
16 and for related expenses: *Provided*, That such amount is
17 designated by the Congress as being for an emergency re-
18 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the bal-
19 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

20 MILITARY PERSONNEL, AIR FORCE

21 For an additional amount for “Military Personnel,
22 Air Force”, \$23,302,000, to remain available until Decem-
23 ber 31, 2024, to respond to the situation in Ukraine and
24 for related expenses: *Provided*, That such amount is des-
25 ignated by the Congress as being for an emergency re-

1 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Bal-
2 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

3 MILITARY PERSONNEL, SPACE FORCE

4 For an additional amount for “Military Personnel,
5 Space Force”, \$4,192,000, to remain available until De-
6 cember 31, 2024, to respond to the situation in Ukraine
7 and for related expenses: *Provided*, That such amount is
8 designated by the Congress as being for an emergency re-
9 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Bal-
10 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

11 OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

12 OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE, ARMY

13 For an additional amount for “Operation and Main-
14 tenance, Army”, \$4,887,581,000, to remain available until
15 December 31, 2024, to respond to the situation in Ukraine
16 and for related expenses: *Provided*, That such amount is
17 designated by the Congress as being for an emergency re-
18 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Bal-
19 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

20 OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE, NAVY

21 For an additional amount for “Operation and Main-
22 tenance, Navy”, \$1,534,163,000, to remain available until
23 December 31, 2024, to respond to the situation in

7 marine industrial base and for related expenses: *Provided*
8 *further*, That such amount is designated by the Congress
9 as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to sec-
10 tion 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emer-
11 gency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

20 Deficit Control Act of 1985.

22 For an additional amount for “Operation and Main-
23 tenance, Marine Corps”, \$846,869,000, to remain avail-
24 able until December 31, 2024, to respond to the situation
25 in Ukraine and for related expenses: *Provided*, That such

1 amount is designated by the Congress as being for an
2 emergency requirement pursuant to section
3 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
4 Deficit Control Act of 1985.

5 OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE, SPACE FORCE

6 For an additional amount for “Operation and Main-
7 tenance, Space Force”, \$8,443,000, to remain available
8 until December 31, 2024, to respond to the situation in
9 Ukraine and for related expenses: *Provided*, That such
10 amount is designated by the Congress as being for an
11 emergency requirement pursuant to section
12 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
13 Deficit Control Act of 1985.

14 OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE, DEFENSE-
15 WIDE

16 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

17 For an additional amount for “Operation and Main-
18 tenance, Defense-Wide”, \$29,086,892,000, to remain
19 available until December 31, 2024, to respond to the situ-
20 ations in Ukraine, and Taiwan and for related expenses:
21 *Provided*, That of the total amount provided under this
22 heading in this Act, \$13,772,460,000, to remain available
23 until September 30, 2025, shall be for the Ukraine Secu-
24 rity Assistance Initiative: *Provided further*, That such
25 funds for the Ukraine Security Assistance Initiative shall

1 be available to the Secretary of Defense under the same
2 terms and conditions as are provided for under this head-
3 ing in the Additional Ukraine Supplemental Appropria-
4 tions Act, 2023 (division M of Public Law 117–12 328),
5 and shall be available notwithstanding section 8135 of the
6 Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2023 (division
7 C of Public Law 117–328) or any similar provision in any
8 other Act making appropriations for the Department of
9 Defense: *Provided further*, That up to \$13,414,432,000,
10 to remain available until September 30, 2025, may be
11 transferred to accounts under the headings “Operation
12 and Maintenance”, ““Procurement”, and “Revolving and
13 Management Funds” for replacement, through new pro-
14 curement or repair of existing unserviceable equipment, of
15 defense articles from the stocks of the Department of De-
16 fense, and for reimbursement for defense services of the
17 Department of Defense and military education and train-
18 ing, provided to or identified for provision to the Govern-
19 ment of Ukraine or to foreign countries that have provided
20 support to Ukraine at the request of the United States:
21 *Provided further*, That up to \$1,900,000,000, to remain
22 available until September 30, 2025, may be transferred
23 to accounts under the headings “Operation and Mainte-
24 nance”, “Procurement”, and “Revolving and Management
25 Funds” for replacement, through new procurement or re-

1 pair of existing unserviceable equipment, of defense arti-
2 cles from the stocks of the Department of Defense, and
3 for reimbursement for defense services of the Department
4 of Defense and military education and training, provided
5 to or identified for provision to the Government of Taiwan
6 or to foreign countries that have provided support to Tai-
7 wan at the request of the United States: *Provided further*,
8 That funds transferred pursuant to the preceding three
9 provisos shall be merged with and available for the same
10 purposes and for the same time period as the appropria-
11 tions to which the funds are transferred: *Provided further*,
12 That the Secretary of Defense shall notify the congres-
13 sional defense committees of the details of such transfers
14 not less than 15 days before any such transfer: *Provided*
15 *further*, That upon a determination that all or part of the
16 funds transferred from this appropriation are not nec-
17 essary for the purposes provided herein, such amounts
18 may be transferred back and merged with this appropria-
19 tion: *Provided further*, That any transfer authority pro-
20 vided herein is in addition to any other transfer authority
21 provided by law: *Provided further*, That such amount is
22 designated by the Congress as being for an emergency re-
23 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Bal-
24 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

4 For an additional amount for “Weapons Procure-
5 ment, Navy”, \$706,976,000, to remain available until

7 Ukraine and for related expenses: *Provided*, That such
8 amount is designated by the Congress as being for an
9 emergency requirement pursuant to section
10 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
11 Deficit Control Act of 1985.

12 SHIPBUILDING AND CONVERSATION, NAVY

13 For an additional amount for “Shipbuilding and Con-
14 version, Navy”, \$2,155,000,000, to remain available until
15 September 30, 2028, to support improvements to the sub-
16 marine industrial base and for related expenses: *Provided*,
17 That of the total amount provided under this heading in
18 this Act, funds shall be available as follows: Columbia
19 Class Submarine (AP), \$1,955,000,000; and Virginia
20 Class Submarine (AP), \$200,000,000: *Provided further*,
21 That such amount is designated by the Congress as being
22 for an emergency requirement pursuant to section

8 be to respond to the situation in Ukraine and for related
9 expenses: *Provided further*, That of the total amount pro-
10 vided under this heading in this Act, \$293,570,000 shall
11 be to support improvements to the submarine industrial
12 base and for related expenses: *Provided further*, That such
13 amount is designated by the Congress as being for an
14 emergency requirement pursuant to section
15 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
16 Deficit Control Act of 1985.

18 For an additional amount for “Procurement, Marine
19 Corps”, \$212,443,000, to remain available until Sep-

23 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Bal-
24 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

1 MISSILE PROCUREMENT, AIR FORCE

2 For an additional amount for “Missile Procurement,
3 Air Force” \$366,001,000, to remain available until Sep-
4 tember 30, 2026, to respond to the situation in Ukraine
5 and for related expenses: *Provided*, That such amount is
6 designated by the Congress as being for an emergency re-
7 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Bal-
8 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

9 OTHER PROCUREMENT, AIR FORCE

10 For an additional amount for “Other Procurement,
11 Air Force”, \$2,808,678,000, to remain available until
12 September 30, 2026, to respond to the situation in
13 Ukraine and for other expenses: *Provided*, That such
14 amount is designated by the Congress as being for an
15 emergency requirement pursuant to section
16 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
17 Deficit Control Act of 1985.

18 PROCUREMENT, DEFENSE-WIDE

19 For an additional amount for “Procurement, De-
20 fense-Wide”, \$46,780,000, to remain available until Sep-
21 tember 30, 2026, to respond to the situations in Ukraine
22 and for related expenses: *Provided*, That such amount is
23 designated by the Congress as being for an emergency re-
24 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Bal-
25 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

1 DEFENSE PRODUCTION ACT PURCHASES

2 For an additional amount for “Defense Production
3 Act Purchases”, \$331,200,000, to remain available until
4 expended, for activities by the Department of Defense pur-
5 suant to sections 108, 301, 302, and 303 of the Defense
6 Production Act of 1950 (50 U.S.C. 4518, 4531, 4532, and
7 4533): *Provided*, That such amounts shall be obligated
8 and expended by the Secretary of Defense as if delegated
9 the necessary authorities conferred by the Defense Pro-
10 duction Act of 1950: *Provided further*, That such amount
11 is designated by the Congress as being for an emergency
12 requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the
13 Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of

23 *vided*, That such amount is designated by the Congress
24 as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to sec-

1 tion 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emer-
2 gency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

3 RESEARCH, DEVELOPMENT, TEST AND EVALUATION,
4 NAVY

5 For an additional amount for “Research, Develop-
6 ment, Test and Evaluation, Navy”, \$20,825,000, to re-
7 main available until September 30, 2025, to respond to
8 the situation in Ukraine, to support improvements to the
9 submarine industrial base, and for related expenses: *Pro-*
10 *vided*, That of the total amount provided under this head-
11 ing in this Act, \$13,825,000 shall be to respond to the
12 situation in Ukraine and for related expenses: *Provided*
13 *further*, That of the total amount provided under this
14 heading in this Act, \$7,000,000 shall be to support im-
15 provements to the submarine industrial base and for re-
16 lated expenses: *Provided further*, That such amount is des-
17 igned by the Congress as being for an emergency re-
18 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Bal-
19 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

2 as being for an emergency requirement pursuant to sec-
3 tion 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emer-
4 gency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

5 RESEARCH, DEVELOPMENT, TEST AND EVALUATION,
6 DEFENSE-WIDE

7 For an additional amount for “Research, Develop-
8 ment, Test and Evaluation, Defense-Wide”,
9 \$194,125,000, to remain available until September 30,
10 2025, to respond to the situation in Ukraine and for re-
11 lated expenses: *Provided*, That such amount is designated
12 by the Congress as being for an emergency requirement
13 pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budg-
14 et and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

16 INTELLIGENCE COMMUNITY MANAGEMENT ACCOUNT

17 For an additional amount for “Intelligence Commu-
18 nity Management Account”, \$2,000,000, to remain avail-
19 able until September 30, 2024, to respond to the situation
20 in Ukraine and for related expenses: *Provided*, That such
21 amount is designated by the Congress as being for an
22 emergency requirement pursuant to section
23 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency

1 GENERAL PROVISIONS—THIS TITLE

2 SEC. 1001. (a) Upon the determination of the Sec-
3 retary of Defense that such action is necessary in the na-
4 tional interest, the Secretary may, with the approval of
5 the Office of Management and Budget, transfer up to
6 \$1,000,000,000 between the appropriations or funds made
7 available to the Department of Defense in this Act: *Pro-*
8 *vided*, That the Secretary shall notify the Congress
9 promptly of each transfer made pursuant to the authority
10 in this paragraph: *Provided further*, That the authority
11 provided in this paragraph is in addition to any other
12 transfer authority otherwise provided by law and is subject
13 to the same terms and conditions as the authority pro-
14 vided in section 8005 of the Department of Defense Ap-
15 propriations Act, 2023, or any similar provision in any
16 subsequent Act making appropriations for the Department
17 of Defense for Fiscal Year 2024, except for monetary limi-
18 tations concerning the amount of authority available.

19 (b) Upon the determination of the Secretary of De-
20 fense that such action is necessary in the national interest,
21 the Secretary may, with the approval of the Office of Man-
22 agement and Budget, transfer up to \$250,000,000 of the
23 funds made available to the Director of National Intel-
24 ligence for the National Intelligence Program in this Act
25 between such appropriations or funds or any subdivision

1 thereof, to be merged with and to be available for the same
2 purposes, and for the same time period, as the appropria-
3 tion or fund to which the amount is transferred: *Provided*,
4 That the Director of National Intelligence shall notify the
5 Congress promptly of all transfers made pursuant to this
6 authority: *Provided further*, That the transfer authority
7 provided by this paragraph is in addition to any transfer
8 authority otherwise provided by law.

15 For an additional amount for “Defense Nuclear Non-
16 proliferation”, \$143,915,000, to remain available until
17 September 30, 2025, to respond to the situation in
18 Ukraine and for related expenses: *Provided*, That such
19 amount is designated by the Congress as being for an
20 emergency requirement pursuant to section
21 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
22 Deficit Control Act of 1985.

23 FEDERAL SALARIES AND EXPENSES

24 For an additional amount for “Federal Salaries and
25 Expenses”, \$5,540,000, to remain available until Sep-

1 tember 30, 2025, to respond to the situation in Ukraine
2 and for related expenses: *Provided*, That such amount is
3 designated by the Congress as being for an emergency re-
4 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Bal-
5 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

10 FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY

11 OPERATIONS AND SUPPORT

12 For an additional amount for “Federal Emergency
13 Management Agency—Operations and Support”,
14 \$10,000,000, to remain available until September 30,
15 2027, for necessary expenses related to the administration
16 of nonprofit security grants: *Provided*, That such amount
17 is designated by the Congress as being for an emergency
18 requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the
19 Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of
20 1985.

21 FEDERAL ASSISTANCE

22 For an additional amount for “Federal Emergency
23 Management Agency—Federal Assistance”,
24 \$390,000,000, of which \$160,000,000 shall remain avail-
25 able until September 30, 2024, and \$230,000,000 shall

1 remain available until September 30, 2026, for Nonprofit
2 Security Grant Program under section 2009 of the Home-
3 land Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 609a) for eligible
4 nonprofit organizations to prevent, prepare for, protect
5 against, and respond to acts of terrorism or other threats:
6 *Provided*, That the Administrator of the Federal Emer-
7 gency Management Agency shall make programmatic ad-
8 justments as necessary to expedite the disbursement of,
9 and provide flexibility in the use of, amounts made avail-
10 able under this heading in this Act: *Provided further*, That
11 notwithstanding any provision of 6 U.S.C. 609a, and in
12 addition to amounts available under 6 U.S.C. 609a(c)(2),
13 the Administrator of the Federal Emergency Management
14 Agency may permit a State to use up to two percent of
15 a grant awarded under this heading in this Act to provide
16 outreach and technical assistance to eligible nonprofit or-
17 ganizations to assist them with applying for Nonprofit Se-
18 curity Grant Program awards under this heading in this
19 Act: *Provided further*, That such outreach and technical
20 assistance should prioritize rural and underserved commu-
21 nities and nonprofit organizations that are traditionally
22 underrepresented in the Program: *Provided further*, That
23 such amount is designated by the Congress as being for
24 an emergency requirement pursuant to section

1 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
2 Deficit Control Act of 1985.

7 ADMINISTRATION FOR CHILDREN AND

9 REFUGEE AND ENTRANT ASSISTANCE

10 For an additional amount for “Refugee and Entrant
11 Assistance”, \$2,334,000,000, to remain available until
12 September 30, 2025, for refugee and entrant assistance
13 activities authorized by section 414 of the Immigration
14 and Nationality Act and section 501 of the Refugee Edu-
15 cation Assistance Act of 1980: *Provided*, That amounts
16 made available under this heading in this Act may be used
17 for grants or contracts with qualified organizations, in-
18 cluding nonprofit entities, to provide culturally and lin-
19 guistically appropriate services, including wraparound
20 services, housing assistance, medical assistance, legal as-
21 sistance, and case management assistance: *Provided fur-*
22 *ther*, That amounts made available under this heading in
23 this Act may be used by the Director of the Office of Ref-
24 ugee Resettlement (Director) to issue awards or supple-
25 ment awards previously made by the Director: *Provided*

1 *further*, That the Director, in carrying out section
2 412(c)(1)(A) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8
3 U.S.C. 1552(c)(1)(A)) with amounts made available under
4 this heading in this Act, may allocate such amounts
5 among the States in a manner that accounts for the most
6 current data available: *Provided further*, That such
7 amount is designated by the Congress as being for an
8 emergency requirement pursuant to section
9 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
10 Deficit Control Act of 1985.

22 MILITARY CONSTRUCTION, NAVY, AND MARINE CORPS

23 For an additional amount for “Military Construction,
24 Navy and Marine Corps”, \$281,914,000, to remain avail-
25 able until September 30, 2028, to support improvements

1 to the submarine industrial base and for related expenses:
2 *Provided*, That not later than 60 days after the date of
3 enactment of this Act, the Secretary of the Navy, or their
4 designee, shall submit to the Committees on Appropria-
5 tions of the House of Representatives and the Senate an
6 expenditure plan for funds provided under this heading
7 in this Act: *Provided further*, That such funds may be obli-
8 gated or expended for planning and design and military
9 construction projects not otherwise authorized by law:
10 *Provided further*, That such amount is designated by the
11 Congress as an emergency requirement pursuant to sec-

25 remain available until expended, which shall be made

1 available for a contribution to the International Develop-
2 ment Association Special Program to Enhance Crisis Re-
3 sponse Window: *Provided*, That such amount is designated
4 by the Congress as being for an emergency requirement
5 pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budg-

7 GENERAL PROVISIONS—THIS TITLE

8 (INCLUDING TRANSFERS OF FUNDS)

9 SEC. 5001. During fiscal year 2024, up to
10 \$250,000,000 of funds deposited in the Consular and Bor-
11 der Security Programs account in any fiscal year that are
12 available for obligation may be transferred to, and merged
13 with, funds appropriated by any Act making appropria-
14 tions for the Department of State, foreign operations, and
15 related programs under the headings “Diplomatic Pro-
16 grams” (including for Worldwide Security Protection) and
17 “Emergencies in the Diplomatic and Consular Service” for
18 emergency evacuations or to prevent or respond to security
19 situations and related requirements: *Provided*, That such
20 transfer authority is in addition to any other transfer au-
21 thority provided by law, and any such transfers are subject
22 to prior consultation with, and the regular notification
23 procedures of, the Committees on Appropriations.

24 SEC. 5002. During fiscal year 2024, section
25 506(a)(1) of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22

1 U.S.C. 2318(a)(1)) shall be applied by substituting
2 “\$7,800,000,000” for “\$100,000,000”.

3 SEC. 5003. During fiscal year 2024, section
4 506(a)(2)(B) of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22
5 U.S.C. 2318(a)(2)(B)) shall be applied by substituting
6 “\$400,000,000” for “\$200,000,000” in the matter pre-
7 ceding clause (i), and by substituting “\$150,000,000” for
8 “\$75,000,000” in clause (i).

9 SEC. 5004. During fiscal year 2024, section
10 552(c)(2) of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22
11 U.S.C. 2348a(c)(2)) shall be applied by substituting
12 “\$50,000,000” for “\$25,000,000”.

13 SEC. 5005. Unobligated balances from amounts ap-
14 propriated in prior Acts under the heading “Multilateral
15 Assistance—International Financial Institutions—Con-
16 tributions to the International Monetary Fund Facilities
17 and Trust Funds” shall be available to cover the cost, as
18 defined in section 502 of the Congressional Budget Act
19 of 1974 (2 U.S.C. 661a), of loans made by the Secretary
20 of the Treasury only to the Poverty Reduction and Growth
21 Trust of the International Monetary Fund, following con-
22 sultation with the appropriate congressional committees:
23 *Provided*, That such funds shall be available to subsidize
24 gross obligations for the principal amount of direct loans
25 not to exceed \$21,000,000,000 in the aggregate, and the

1 Secretary of the Treasury is authorized to make such
2 loans.

3 SEC. 5006. Section 17(a)(6) of the Bretton Woods
4 Agreements Act (22 U.S.C. 286e–2(a)(6)) is amended by
5 striking “December 31, 2025” and inserting “December
6 31, 2030”.

7 SEC. 5007. (a) Funds appropriated by this Act under
8 the headings “International Disaster Assistance” and
9 “Migration and Refugee Assistance” may be transferred
10 to, and merged with, funds appropriated by this Act under
11 such headings.

12 (b) Funds appropriated by this Act under the head-
13 ings “Economic Support Fund” and “Assistance for Eu-
14 rope, Eurasia and Central Asia” to respond to the situa-
15 tion in Ukraine and in countries impacted by the situation
16 in Ukraine may be transferred to, and merged with, funds
17 made available under the headings “United States Inter-
18 national Development Finance Corporation—Corporate
19 Capital Account”, “United States International Develop-
20 ment Finance Corporation—Program Account”, “Export-
21 Import Bank of the United States—Program Account”,
22 and “Trade and Development Agency” for such purpose.

23 (c) Funds appropriated by this Act under the heading
24 “International Narcotics Control and Law Enforcement”
25 for assistance for countries in the Middle East may be

1 transferred to, and merged with, funds appropriated by
2 this Act under the headings “Nonproliferation, Anti-ter-
3 rorism, Demining and Related Programs”, “Peacekeeping
4 Operations”, and “Foreign Military Financing Program”
5 for such purpose.

6 (d) The transfer authorities provided by this section
7 are in addition to any other transfer authority provided
8 by law, and are subject to prior consultation with, and
9 the regular notification procedures of, the Committees on
10 Appropriations.

11 (e) Upon a determination that all or part of the funds
12 transferred pursuant to the authorities provided by this
13 section are not necessary for such purposes, such amounts
14 may be transferred back to such appropriations.

15 SEC. 5008. Section 1705 of the Additional Ukraine
16 Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2023 (division M of
17 Public Law 117–328) shall apply to funds appropriated
18 by this Act under the heading “Economic Support Fund”
19 for assistance for Ukraine.

20 SEC. 5009. None of the funds appropriated or other-
21 wise made available by this title in this Act may be made
22 available for assistance for the Governments of the Rus-
23 sian Federation or Belarus, including entities owned or
24 controlled by such Governments.

1 SEC. 5010. (a) Section 2606 of the Ukraine Supple-
2 mental Appropriations Act, 2022 (division N of Public
3 Law 117–103) is amended as follows:

4 (1) in subsection (a), by striking “and North
5 Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) allies” and in-
6 serting “, North Atlantic Treaty Organization
7 (NATO) allies, major non-NATO allies, and the
8 Indo-Pacific region”; by striking “\$4,000,000,000”
9 and inserting “\$8,000,000,000”; and by striking “,
10 except that such rate may not be less than the pre-
11 vailing interest rate on marketable Treasury securi-
12 ties of similar maturity”; and

13 (2) in subsection (b), by striking “and NATO
14 allies” and inserting “, NATO allies, major non-
15 NATO allies, and the Indo-Pacific region; by strik-
16 ing “\$4,000,000,000” and inserting
17 “\$8,000,000,000”; and by inserting at the end of
18 the second proviso “except for guarantees of loans
19 by the Federal Financing Bank”.

20 (b) Funds made available for the costs of direct loans
21 and loan guarantees for major non-NATO allies and the
22 Indo-Pacific region pursuant to section 2606 of division
23 N of Public Law 117–103, as amended by subsection (a),
24 may only be made available from funds appropriated by
25 this Act under the heading “Foreign Military Financing

1 Program” and available balances from under such heading
2 in prior Acts making appropriations for the Department
3 of State, foreign operations, and related programs: *Pro-*
4 *vided*, That such funds may only be made available if the
5 Secretary of State certifies and reports to the appropriate
6 congressional committees, not less than 15 days prior to
7 the obligation of such funds, that such direct loan or loan
8 guarantee is in the national security interest of the United
9 States, is being provided in response to exigent cir-
10 cumstances, is addressing a mutually agreed upon emer-
11 gency requirement of the recipient country, and the recipi-
12 ent country has a plan to repay such loan: *Provided fur-*
13 *ther*, That not less than 60 days after the date of enact-
14 ment of this Act, the Secretary of State shall consult with
15 such committees on the implementation of this subsection.

16 (c) Amounts repurposed pursuant to this section that
17 were previously designated by the Congress as an emer-
18 gency requirement pursuant to a concurrent resolution on
19 the Budget are designated as an emergency requirement
20 pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budg-
21 et and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

22 SEC. 5011. Funds appropriated under the headings
23 “Economic Support Fund” and “Assistance for Europe,
24 Eurasia and Central Asia” in this title in this Act may

1 be made available as contributions, following consultation
2 with the Committees on Appropriations.

3 SEC. 5012. None of the funds appropriated or other-
4 wise made available by this division and division B of this
5 Act, and prior Acts making appropriations for the Depart-
6 ment of State, foreign operations, and related programs,
7 may be made available for a contribution, grant, or other
8 payment to the United Nations Relief and Works Agency,
9 notwithstanding any other provision of law.

10 SEC. 5013. (a) CERTIFICATION.—The Secretary of
11 State shall certify and report to the appropriate congres-
12 sional committees not later than March 1, 2024, that—

13 (1) oversight policies, processes, and procedures
14 have been established by the Department of State
15 and the United States Agency for International De-
16 velopment, as appropriate, and are in use to prevent
17 the diversion, misuse, or destruction of assistance,
18 including through international organizations, to
19 Hamas and other terrorist and extremist entities in
20 Gaza; and

21 (2) such policies, processes, and procedures
22 have been developed in coordination with other bilat-
23 eral and multilateral donors and the Government of
24 Israel, as appropriate.

1 (b) OVERSIGHT POLICY AND PROCEDURES.—The
2 Secretary of State and the USAID Administrator shall
3 submit to the appropriate congressional committees, con-
4 current with the submission of the certification required
5 in subsection (a), a written description of the oversight
6 policies, processes, and procedures for funds appropriated
7 by this title that are made available for assistance for
8 Gaza, including specific actions to be taken should such
9 assistance be diverted, misused, or destroyed, and the role
10 of Israel in the oversight of such assistance.

11 (c) REQUIREMENT TO INFORM.—The Secretary of
12 State and USAID Administrator shall promptly inform
13 the appropriate congressional committees of each instance
14 in which funds appropriated by this title that are made
15 available for assistance for Gaza have been diverted, mis-
16 used, or destroyed, to include the type of assistance, a de-
17 scription of the incident and parties involved, and an ex-
18 planation of the response of the Department of State or
19 USAID, as appropriate.

20 (d) THIRD-PARTY MONITORING.—Funds appro-
21 priated by this title shall be made available for third-party
22 monitoring of assistance for Gaza, including end use moni-
23 toring, following consultation with the appropriate con-
24 gressional committees.

25 (e) OFFICES OF INSPECTORS GENERAL.—

1 (1) DEPARTMENT OF STATE.—Of the funds ap-
2 propriated by this title under the heading “Office of
3 Inspector General” for the Department of State,
4 \$7,000,000 shall be made available for the oversight
5 and monitoring of assistance made available for
6 Gaza by this title and in prior Acts making appro-
7 priations for the Department of State, foreign oper-
8 ations, and related programs.

9 (2) UNITED STATES AGENCY FOR INTER-
10 NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT.—Of the funds appro-
11 priated by this title under the heading “Office of In-
12 spector General” for USAID, \$3,000,000 shall be
13 made available for the oversight and monitoring of
14 assistance made available for Gaza by this title and
15 in prior Acts making appropriations for the Depart-
16 ment of State, foreign operations, and related pro-
17 grams.

18 (f) REPORT.—Not later than 90 days after the initial
19 obligation of funds appropriated by this title that are
20 made available for assistance for Gaza, and every 90 days
21 thereafter until all such funds are expended, the Secretary
22 of State and the USAID Administrator shall jointly sub-
23 mit to the appropriate congressional committees a report
24 detailing the amount and purpose of such assistance pro-

1 vided during each respective quarter, including a descrip-
2 tion of the specific entity implementing such assistance.

3 (g) ASSESSMENT.—Not later than 90 days after the
4 date of enactment of this Act and every 90 days thereafter
5 until September 30, 2025, the Secretary of State, in con-
6 sultation with the Director of National Intelligence and
7 other heads of elements of the intelligence community that
8 the Secretary considers relevant, shall submit to the ap-
9 propriate congressional committees a report assessing
10 whether funds appropriated by this title and made avail-
11 able for assistance for the West Bank and Gaza have been
12 diverted by Hamas or other terrorist and extremist enti-
13 ties in the West Bank and Gaza: *Provided*, That such re-
14 port shall include details on the amount and how such
15 funds were made available and used by such entities: *Pro-*
16 *vided further*, That such report may be submitted in classi-
17 fied form, if necessary.

18 (h) CONSULTATION.—Not later than 30 days after
19 the date of enactment of this Act but prior to the initial
20 obligation of funds made available by this title for humani-
21 tarian assistance for Gaza, the Secretary of State and
22 USAID Administrator, as appropriate, shall consult with
23 the Committees on Appropriations on the amount and an-
24 ticipated uses of such funds.

1 SEC. 5014. Prior to the initial obligation of funds
2 made available in this title in this Act, the Secretary of
3 State, USAID Administrator, and the Secretary of the
4 Treasury, as appropriate, shall submit to the Committees
5 on Appropriations—

6 (1) spend plans, as defined in section
7 7034(s)(4) of the Department of State, Foreign Op-
8 erations, and Related Programs Appropriations Act,
9 2023 (division K of Public Law 117–328), at the
10 country, account, and program level, for funds ap-
11 propriated by this Act under the headings “Eco-
12 nomic Support Fund”, “Transition Initiatives”, “As-
13 sistance for Europe, Eurasia and Central Asia”,
14 “International Narcotics Control and Law Enforce-
15 ment”, “Nonproliferation, Anti-terrorism, Demining
16 and Related Programs”, “Peacekeeping Oper-
17 ations”, “Foreign Military Financing Program”, and
18 “Contribution to the International Development As-
19 sociation”: *Provided*, That plans submitted pursuant
20 to this paragraph shall include for each program no-
21 tified—(A) total funding made available for such
22 program, by account and fiscal year; (B) funding
23 that remains unobligated for such program from
24 prior year base or supplemental appropriations; (C)
25 funding that is obligated but unexpended for such

1 program; and (D) funding committed, but not yet
2 notified for such program; and

3 (2) operating plans, as defined in section 7062
4 of the Department of State, Foreign Operations, and
5 Related Programs Appropriations Act, 2023 (divi-
6 sion K of Public Law 117–328), for funds appro-
7 priated by this title under the headings “Diplomatic
