Use of force in self-protection. 9 * * * 10 (b) Limitations on justifying necessity for use of force.--11 12 The use of force is not justifiable under this (1)13 section: 14 (i) to resist an arrest which the actor knows is being made by a peace officer, although the arrest is 15 16 unlawful; [or] (ii) to resist force used by the occupier or 17 18 possessor of property or by another person on his behalf, 19 where the actor knows that the person using the force is 20 doing so under a claim of right to protect the property, 21 except that this limitation shall not apply if: 22 the actor is a public officer acting in the (A) 23 performance of his duties or a person lawfully 24 assisting him therein or a person making or assisting 25 in a lawful arrest; 26 (B) the actor has been unlawfully dispossessed 27 of the property and is making a reentry or recaption justified by section 507 of this title (relating to 28 29 use of force for the protection of property); or 30 (C) the actor believes that such force is

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1 necessary to protect himself against death or serious
2 bodily injury[.];

3 (iii) if the actor knows that he can avoid the
4 necessity of using such force with complete safety by
5 retreating; or

(iv) if the actor was instructed by a peace officer or public safety dispatcher to not pursue another person.

8 (2) The use of deadly force is not justifiable under 9 this section unless the actor believes that such force is 10 necessary to protect himself against death, serious bodily 11 injury, kidnapping or sexual intercourse compelled by force 12 or threat; nor is it justifiable if:

(i) the actor, with the intent of causing death or
serious bodily injury, provoked the use of force against
himself in the same encounter; [or]

16 (ii) the actor knows that he can avoid the necessity of using such force with complete safety by retreating[, 17 18 except the actor is not obliged to retreat from his 19 dwelling or place of work, unless he was the initial 20 aggressor or is assailed in his place of work by another 21 person whose place of work the actor knows it to be.]; or 22 (iii) the actor was instructed by a peace officer or 23 a public safety dispatcher to not pursue another person. * * * 24

(2.2) The presumption set forth in paragraph (2.1)
 does not apply if:

(i) the person against whom the force is used has
the right to be in or is a lawful resident of the
dwelling, residence or vehicle, such as an owner or
lessee;

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1 (ii) the person sought to be removed is a child or 2 grandchild or is otherwise in the lawful custody or under 3 the lawful guardianship of the person against whom the 4 protective force is used;

5 (iii) the actor is engaged in a criminal activity or 6 is using the dwelling, residence or occupied vehicle to 7 further a criminal activity; [or]

8 (iv) the person against whom the force is used is a 9 peace officer acting in the performance of his official 10 duties and the actor using force knew or reasonably 11 should have known that the person was a peace officer[.];

(vi) the actor was instructed by a peace officer or

[(2.3) An actor who is not engaged in a criminal activity, who is not in illegal possession of a firearm and who is attacked in any place where the actor would have a duty to retreat under paragraph (2)(ii) has no duty to retreat and has the right to stand his ground and use force, including deadly force, if:

23 (i) the actor has a right to be in the place where24 he was attacked;

(ii) the actor believes it is immediately necessary
to do so to protect himself against death, serious bodily
injury, kidnapping or sexual intercourse by force or
threat; and

Use of force by persons with special responsibility for 7 care, discipline or safety of others. 8 (a) Justifiable use of force. -- The use of force upon or toward the person of another is justifiable if: 9 10 The actor is the parent or guardian or other person (1)11 similarly responsible for the general care and supervision of 12 a minor or a person acting at the request of such parent, 13 quardian or other responsible person and: 14 the force is used for the purpose of (i) 15 safequarding or promoting the welfare of the minor, 16 including the preventing or punishment of his misconduct; 17 and 18 (ii) the force used is not designed to cause or 19 known to create a substantial risk of causing death, serious bodily injury, disfigurement, extreme pain or 20 21 mental distress or gross degradation. 22 The actor is a teacher or person otherwise entrusted (2) 23 with the care or supervision for a special purpose of a minor 24 and: 25 the actor believes that the force used is (i) 26 necessary to further such special purpose, including the maintenance of reasonable discipline in a school, class 27 28 or other group, and that the use of such force is 29 consistent with the welfare of the minor; and (ii) the degree of force, if it had been used by the 30

6 (i) the force is used for the purpose of 7 safeguarding or promoting the welfare of the 8 incapacitated, mentally ill or mentally retarded person, 9 including the prevention of his misconduct, and there is 10 no reasonable alternative to the use of such force; and

(ii) the force used is not designed to cause or known to create a substantial risk of causing death, bodily injury, disfigurement, unnecessary pain, mental distress, or humiliation.

15 (4) The actor is a doctor or other therapist or a person16 assisting him at his direction; and:

(i) the force is used for the purpose of administering a recognized form of treatment not prohibited by law of this Commonwealth which the actor believes to be adapted to promoting the physical or mental health of the patient; and

22 (ii) the treatment is administered with the consent 23 of the patient, or, if the patient is a minor or an 24 incapacitated person with the consent of his parent or 25 guardian or other person legally competent to consent in 26 his behalf, or the treatment is administered in an 27 emergency when the actor believes that no one competent 28 to consent can be consulted and that a reasonable person, 29 wishing to safequard the welfare of the patient, would 30 consent.

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(5) The actor is a warden or other authorized official
 of a correctional institution; and:

3 (i) he believes that the force used is necessary for the purpose of enforcing the lawful rules or procedures 4 of the institution, unless his belief in the lawfulness 5 of the rule or procedure sought to be enforced is 6 7 erroneous and his error is due to ignorance or mistake as 8 to the provisions of this title, any other provision of the criminal law or the law governing the administration 9 10 of the institution;

11 (ii) the nature or degree of force used is not 12 forbidden by law; and

13 (iii) if deadly force is used, its use is otherwise14 justifiable under this chapter.

15 (6) The actor is a person responsible for the safety of 16 a vessel or an aircraft or a person acting at his direction; 17 and:

(i) he believes that the force used is necessary to
prevent interference with the operation of the vessel or
aircraft or obstruction of the execution of a lawful
order, unless his belief in the lawfulness of the order
is erroneous and his error is due to ignorance or mistake
as to the law defining his authority; and

24 (ii) if deadly force is used, its use is otherwise25 justifiable under this chapter.

(7) The actor is a person who is authorized or required
by law to maintain order or decorum in a vehicle, train or
other carrier or in a place where others are assembled; and:
