## AN ACT

1 2 3	Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in firearms and other dangerous articles, prohibiting certain assault weapons.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
8	<u>§ 6121.1. Certain assault weapons prohibited.</u>
9	(a) Offense definedExcept as set forth in subsection (b),
10	a person may not do any of the following:
11	(1) Possess, use, control, sell, transfer or manufacture
12	<u>an assault weapon or obtain a license to possess, use, </u>
13	control, sell, transfer or manufacture an assault weapon.
14	(2) Obtain a license to do, in this Commonwealth, any of
15	the acts under paragraph (1).
16	(b) ExceptionSubsection (a) shall not apply to a member
17	of the armed forces of the United States or a reserve component

1	of the armed forces of the Unit	ed States, the National Guard or	
2	<u>a law enforcement officer while</u>	performing official duties or	
3	<u>traveling to or from an authori</u>	zed place of duty if possession

7	accept a detachable magazine and has at least two of the
8	following:
9	(A) an ammunition magazine that attaches to the
10	pistol outside of the pistol grip;
11	(B) a threaded barrel capable of accepting a
12	barrel extender, flash suppressor, forward handgrip
13	<u>or silencer;</u>
14	(C) a shroud that is attached to, or partially
15	or completely encircles, the barrel and that permits
16	the shooter to hold the firearm with the nontrigger
17	hand without being burned;
18	(D) a manufactured weight of 50 ounces or more
19	when the pistol is unloaded; and
20	(E) a semiautomatic version of an automatic
21	<u>firearm; or</u>
22	<u>(iii) a semiautomatic shotgun that has at least two</u>
23	of the following:
24	(A) a folding or telescoping stock;
25	(B) a pistol grip that protrudes conspicuously
26	beneath the action of the weapon;
27	(C) a fixed magazine capacity in excess of five
28	rounds; and
29	(D) an ability to accept a detachable magazine.

- 6 The term "assault weapon" does not include any firearm modified
- 7 to render it permanently inoperable.
- 8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
