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1 Section 102. Definitions.

The following words and phrases when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

5 "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau 6 or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant 7 superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists, 8 engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries, auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians, 9 10 marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and 11 other assistants in any department, board or commission. 12 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding 13 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies, 14 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and 15 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and 16 telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel, 17 18 light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation, 19 repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and 20 facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on 21 workers' compensation, insurance premiums on policies of liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment 22 23 insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on 24 employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee 25 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth 26 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation 27 costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or 28 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental 29 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of 30 General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of

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automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned 1 2 automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall 3 include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State 4 institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside 5 hospital, provided, that in no case shall the State institution 6 7 pay more for patient care than that provided under the State 8 medical assistance program.

(a) General Fund.--The following sums set forth in this act,
or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically
appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter
named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial
Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries,
wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly
elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth,

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for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for 1 2 the purchase or rental of goods and services, printing, public 3 advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by 4 law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the 5 duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 6 hereinafter set forth for the portion of the fiscal year 7 8 beginning July 1, 2015, through October 31, 2015, and for the 9 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of 10 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015.

11 State Lottery Fund. -- The following sums set forth in (b) this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 12 13 specifically appropriated from the State Lottery Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department 14 15 of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 16 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 17 18 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 19 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 20 21 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the portion of the fiscal year 22 23 beginning July 1, 2015, through October 31, 2015, and for the 24 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015. 25

(c) Tobacco Settlement Fund.--The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Tobacco Settlement Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other

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1 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 2 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 3 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as 4 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 5 6 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the portion of the fiscal year 7 8 beginning July 1, 2015, through October 31, 2015, and for the 9 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of 10 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015.

11 Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account. -- The (d) 12 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may 13 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the 14 restricted receipt account established within the General Fund, 15 known as the Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account, to 16 the Judicial Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses, for 17 18 the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the 19 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of 20 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary 21 for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the portion of 22 23 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015, through October 31, 24 2015, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 25 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015. 26 Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund. -- The (e)

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Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services 1 2 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and 3 for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, 4 functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set 5 forth for the portion of the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015, 6 through October 31, 2015, and for the payment of bills incurred 7 8 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015. 9

10 (f) The State Stores Fund.--The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 11 specifically appropriated from The State Stores Fund to the 12 13 hereinafter named agency of the Executive Department of the 14 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 15 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 16 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 17 18 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 19 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 20 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the portion of the fiscal year 21 beginning July 1, 2015, through October 31, 2015, and for the 22 23 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of 24 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015.

Unless otherwise stated, the appropriations include any 30 carryovers from the prior fiscal year.

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1 Section 106. Block grants.

(a) Appropriation.--The following sums set forth in this
act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
specifically appropriated from the block grant (BG) funds to the
several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department
of the Commonwealth for the purposes and under the restrictions
for which the funds are provided for the portion of the fiscal
year beginning July 1, 2015, through October 31, 2015.

9 (b) Small Communities Development Block Grant.--The Small 10 Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small 11 cities and communities that have a high concentration of 12 impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their 13 low-income and moderate-income housing opportunities and to meet 14 community development needs.

15 (c) Community Services Block Grant.--The Community Services 16 Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and 17 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on 18 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the 19 community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In 20 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old 21 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements 22 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to 23 assure proper consideration of each recipient.

(d) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.--The
Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is
for the provision of preventive health and other health services
related to emergency medical systems, health initiative grants,
comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health
education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and domestic
violence services.

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1 Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant. -- The (e) 2 Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to 3 enable states to maintain and strengthen their leadership in planning, promoting, coordinating and evaluating health care for 4 pregnant women, mothers, infants and children, and children with 5 special health care needs and in providing health services for 6 7 mothers and children who do not have access to adequate health 8 care.

9 (f) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant.--The Low-10 Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income 11 families and individuals, including energy efficiency grants for 12 13 low-income dwellings. No less than 15% of the LIHEABG funds 14 received shall be used for weatherization. LIHEABG funds 15 received pursuant to a Presidential release of contingency funds 16 shall be exempt from the 15% requirement.

(g) Social Services Block Grant.--The Social Services Block Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible persons.

(h) Mental Health Services Block Grant.--The Mental Health
Services Block Grant (MHSBG) provides funds for the provision of
services to adults with serious mental illness or children with
serious emotional disturbance.

(i) Substance Abuse Block Grant.--The Substance Abuse Block
Grant (SABG) provides funds to establish and maintain programs
to combat alcohol and drug abuse.

(j) Child Care and Development Fund Block Grant.--The Child Care and Development Fund Block Grant (CCDFBG) is for the provision of direct child care or to increase the quality and availability of child care for low-income families.
