AN ACT

To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the Executive and Judicial Departments, the State Government 2 Support Agencies and the General Assembly of the Commonwealth, the public debt and the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 2015, to June 30, 2016, for certain 5 institutions and organizations, and for the payment of bills 6 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year 7 ending June 30, 2015; to provide appropriations from the State Lottery Fund, the Tobacco Settlement Fund, the Aviation 9 Restricted Account, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The 10 State Stores Fund, the Milk Marketing Fund, the Home 11 Investment Trust Fund, the Emergency Medical Services 12 13 Operating Fund, the Tuition Account Guaranteed Savings Program Fund, the Banking Fund, the Firearm Records Check 14 Fund, the Ben Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund, 15 16 the Oil and Gas Lease Fund, the Home Improvement Account, the 17 Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter Protection Act Enforcement Fund, the Insurance Regulation and Oversight 18 Fund, the Pennsylvania Racehorse Development Restricted 19 Receipt Account, the Justice Reinvestment Fund and the 20 Multimodal Transportation Fund to the Executive Department; 21 to provide appropriations from the Judicial Computer System 22 23 Augmentation Account to the Judicial Department for the 24 fiscal year July 1, 2015, to June 30, 2016; to provide 25 appropriations from the Motor License Fund for the fiscal year July 1, 2015, to June 30, 2016, for the proper operation 26 of several departments of the Commonwealth and the 27

- Pennsylvania State Police authorized to spend Motor License Fund money; to provide for the appropriation of Federal funds 2 to the Executive Department of the Commonwealth and for the 3 payment of bills remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal 4 year ending June 30, 2015; and to provide for the additional 5 appropriation of Federal and State funds from the General 7 Fund and the State Lottery Fund for the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the fiscal year July 1, 2014, to June 30, 2015, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining 8 9 unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2014.

- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 PART I
- 10 GENERAL PROVISIONS
- 11 Section 101. Short title.
- 12 This act shall be known and may be cited as the General
- 13 Appropriation Act of 2015.
- 14 Section 102. Definitions.
- The following words and phrases when used in this act shall

- 25 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding
- 26 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies,
- 27 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and
- 28 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and
- 29 telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and
- 30 notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel,

- 1 light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation,
- 2 repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and
- 3 facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on
- 4 workers' compensation, insurance premiums on policies of
- 5 liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment
- 6 insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on
- 7 employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee
- 8 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth
- 9 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation
- 10 costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or
- 11 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental
- 12 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of
- 13 General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of
- 14 automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned
- 15 automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred
- 16 through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall
- 17 include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State
- 18 institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside
- 19 hospital, provided, that in no case shall the State institution
- 20 pay more for patient care than that provided under the State
- 21 medical assistance program.
