JUDICIAL COMPUTER SYSTEM AUGMENTATION ACCOUNT TO THE JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2015, TO JUNE 30, 2 2016; TO PROVIDE APPROPRIATIONS FROM THE MOTOR LICENSE FUND 3 FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2015, TO JUNE 30, 2016, FOR THE PROPER OPERATION OF SEVERAL DEPARTMENTS OF THE COMMONWEALTH 4 5 AND THE PENNSYLVANIA STATE POLICE AUTHORIZED TO SPEND MOTOR LICENSE FUND MONEY; TO PROVIDE FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF 7 FEDERAL FUNDS TO THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT OF THE COMMONWEALTH 8 9 AND FOR THE PAYMENT OF BILLS REMAINING UNPAID AT THE CLOSE OF THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2015; AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE 10 ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION OF FEDERAL AND STATE FUNDS FROM THE 11 GENERAL FUND AND THE STATE LOTTERY FUND FOR THE EXECUTIVE 12 DEPARTMENT OF THE COMMONWEALTH FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 13 2014, TO JUNE 30, 2015, AND FOR THE PAYMENT OF BILLS INCURRED 14 AND REMAINING UNPAID AT THE CLOSE OF THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING 15 JUNE 30, 2014," FURTHER PROVIDING FOR ADDITIONS TO 16 APPROPRIATIONS AND REPLACEMENT OF APPROPRIATIONS FROM THE 17 GENERAL FUND FOR THE EXPENSES OF THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT, 18 THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND GOVERNMENT SUPPORT AGENCIES OF THE 19 COMMONWEALTH AND THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 20 1, 2015, TO JUNE 30, 2016, FOR CERTAIN INSTITUTIONS AND 21 ORGANIZATIONS AND FOR THE PAYMENT OF BILLS INCURRED AND 22 REMAINING UNPAID AT THE CLOSE OF THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 23 30, 2015; PROVIDING FOR REPLACEMENT OF APPROPRIATIONS FROM 24 THE TOBACCO SETTLEMENT FUND TO THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT; 25 FURTHER PROVIDING FOR ADDITIONS TO APPROPRIATIONS FROM THE 26 PENNSYLVANIA RACEHORSE DEVELOPMENT RESTRICTED RECEIPT ACCOUNT 27 TO THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT; AND PROVIDING FOR REQUIRED 28 LAPSING OF MONEY IN THE GENERAL FUND. 29 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 31 Section 1.
