## AN ACT

- Amending Title 34 (Game) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in preliminary provisions, further providing for 2 definitions; in Pennsylvania Game Commission, further 3 providing for powers and duties of commission and for 4 accountability; in hunting and furtaking, providing for 5 senior hunting license holders; and, in special licenses and 6 permits, further providing for authority to issue permits. 7 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. Section 102 of Title 34 of the Pennsylvania 11 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding definitions to read:
- 12  $\S$  102. Definitions.
- 13 Subject to additional definitions contained in subsequent
- 14 provisions of this title which are applicable to specific
- 15 provisions of this title, the following words and phrases when
- 16 used in this title shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 17 section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 18 \* \* \*
- 19 "Carrying capacity." The maximum number of animals of a

- 1 species that a habitat or ecosystem may support and sustain.
- 2 \* \* \*
- 3 "Council." The Forest and Wildlife Advisory Council
- 4 <u>established under section 328 (relating to accountability).</u>
- 5 \* \* \*
- 6 "Ecosystem." An ecological environment consisting of all the
- 7 <u>living organisms</u>, such as plants and animals, in the unit of
- 8 space, as well as all the nonliving, physical components of the
- 9 <u>environment with which the organisms interact, such as air,</u>
- 10 soil, water and sunlight. The term may be represented by a unit
- 11 of space, including a drop of water, lake, forest or mountain.
- 12 The term may include a wildlife management unit as described by
- 13 the commission.
- 14 \* \* \*
- 15 "Habitat." A natural area, such as a forest, field or body
- 16 of water, where an animal commonly lives or where individuals of
- 17 a population live and that provides essential food, water, cover
- 18 and living space.
- 19 \* \* \*
- 20 "Maximum sustained yield." The management of game animals,
- 21 including white-tailed deer, toward producing the maximum number
- 22 of animals for consumptive use that may be sustained over time,
- 23 thus maximizing the recreational aspects of the harvest.

- 25 Section 2. Section 322(a) and (c) of Title 34 are amended to
- 26 read:
- 27 § 322. Powers and duties of commission.
- 28 (a) Duties.--It shall be the duty of the commission to
- 29 protect, propagate, manage and preserve the game or wildlife of
- 30 this Commonwealth and to enforce, by proper actions and

- 1 proceedings, the laws of this Commonwealth relating thereto. In\_
- 2 fulfilling the duty, the commission shall focus primarily on
- 3 serving the interest of sportsmen and the special heritage of
- 4 recreational hunting and furtaking in this Commonwealth.
- 5 \* \* \*
- 6 (c) Specific powers and duties. -- In order to administrate
- 7 and enforce this title, the commission through proper action
- 8 shall:
- 9 (1) Subject to section 2102(b) (relating to seasons,
- 10 possession, bag limits and devices), fix seasons, daily
- 11 shooting or taking hours, and any modification thereof, and
- daily, season and possession limits for any species of game
- or wildlife[.], provided that the antlerless deer rifle
- 14 <u>season may not exceed three days during a license year and</u>
- occurs only after the end of the antlered deer rifle season.
- 16 (2) Remove protection, declare an open season or increase, reduce or close a season.
- 18 (3) Increase or reduce bag limits or possession limits.
- 19 (4) Define geographic limitations or restrictions,
- 20 <u>except that each county of this Commonwealth shall constitute</u>
- 21 a separate wildlife management unit.
- 22 (5) Fix the type and number of devices which may be used
- 23 to take game or wildlife.
- 24 (6) Limit the number of hunters or furtakers in any
- designated area and prescribe the lawful methods of hunting
- or taking furbearers in these areas[.], except that the
- 27 <u>annual number of antlerless deer permits shall be issued</u>
- according to each county-based wildlife management unit.
- 29 Regarding deer management, the total annual number of
- 30 antlerless deer licenses that are allocated by the commission

- for each wildlife management unit shall be the number

  recommended by the council under section 328(f)(5) (relating
  - (7) Govern the use of recorded calls or sounds or amplified calls or sounds of any description for taking or hunting game or wildlife.
  - (8) Add to or change the classification of any wild bird or wild animal.
    - (9) Prohibit the possession, importation, exportation or release of any species of birds or animals which may be considered dangerous or injurious to the general public or to the wildlife of this Commonwealth.
    - Manage and develop its lands and waters and other government or private lands and waters under agreement with the owners as it considers advisable and, by proper action and proceedings, enact and enforce regulations to insure the prudent and proper use of these lands. In order to assist the commission in performing its duties under this title, the organization selected by the council under section 328(f)(4) shall design a habitat enhancement program that benefits deer and other forest-dwelling game and nongame species of wildlife and that serves the interests of sportsmen for recreational hunting, State camp lessee interests, the outdoor recreation interests of the general public and the economic interests of rural communities and the outdoor industry. The organization shall direct and facilitate the development and maintenance of this habitat enhancement program on State game lands and in State forests and the commission and Department of Conservation and Natural Resources shall cooperate with the organization in expediting

- 3 (11) Collect, classify and preserve such statistics,
  4 data and information as in its judgment will tend to promote
  5 the object of this title and take charge of and keep all
  6 reports, books, papers and documents which shall, in the
  7 discharge of its duties, come into its possession or under
- 8 its control.
- 9 (12) Take any necessary action to accomplish and assure 10 the purposes of this title.
- 11 (13) Serve the interest of sportsmen by preserving and
  12 promoting our special heritage of recreational hunting and
  13 furtaking by providing ample game and adequate opportunity to
  14 hunt and trap the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth.
- 15 (14) Provide the maximum sustained yield of game for

  16 sport hunting and trapping, including white-tailed deer, as

  17 prescribed by the carrying capacity of the ecosystem to

  18 support and maintain respective populations of game.
- (15) Enhance deer and wildlife habitat by increasing the
  carrying capacity of the ecosystem for the maximum sustained
  yield of game, including white-tailed deer, and for
- 22 <u>optimizing densities of nongame species of birds and mammals.</u>
- 23 Section 3. Section 328 of Title 34 is amended by adding a
- 24 subsection to read:
- 25 § 328. Accountability.

- 27 (f) Deer management accountability.--
- 28 <u>(1) The Forest and Wildlife Advisory Council is</u>
- 29 established to provide the General Assembly and the
- 30 commission with scientific data and management

2	management. Recommendations of the council shall assist the
3	commission in performing its duties under this title, assure
4	commission accountability to sportsmen and provide the
5	General Assembly with the scientific and quality assurance
6	capabilities that are needed to ensure that the commission is
7	performing its duties under this title.
8	(2) The council shall consist of voting members,
9	composed of and appointed in accordance with the following:
10	(i) The Governor shall appoint a representative of a
11	Pennsylvania-based organization whose primary mission is
12	to serve the grassroots sportsmen of this Commonwealth by
13	providing regulatory relief and legislative help. The
14	appointee under this subparagraph shall serve as
15	chairperson of the council.
16	(ii) The Speaker of the House of Representatives
17	<pre>shall appoint:</pre>
18	(A) A representative of an organization located
19	in a county of the second class whose primary mission
20	is to serve sportsmen.
21	(B) A representative of a Pennsylvania-based,
22	nonpartisan organization whose primary mission is to
23	provide Pennsylvania gun owners and outdoors
24	enthusiasts with the information necessary to
25	understand individual rights under the Second
26	Amendment of the United States Constitution.
27	(iii) The President pro tempore of the Senate shall
28	appoint:
29	(A) A representative of an organization serving
30	and dedicated to preserving individual rights of gun

1	owners under the Second Amendment of the United
2	States Constitution in counties of the second class
3	A, third class, fourth class and sixth class.
4	(B) A representative of a Pennsylvania-based
5	organization whose primary mission is to protect the
6	rights of State forest leased campsite owners and
7	associates in this Commonwealth.
8	(iv) The chairperson may appoint two additional
9	members to the council with recognized expertise,
10	knowledge and experience in a relevant field, who shall
11	be designated at-large members.
12	(3) Membership under paragraph (2) will be for a term of
13	six years and members may be reappointed.
14	(4) Council membership shall be voluntary and members
15	shall not receive compensation or reimbursement for expenses
16	incurred in the discharge of their duties.
17	(5) (i) Within 60 days of the effective date of this
18	subsection, the council shall select by a majority vote
19	of the members a Pennsylvania-based, private, nonprofit,
20	independent, scientific organization to be designated as
21	the Forest and Wildlife Advisory Service.
22	(ii) The council shall enter into a contract by a
23	majority vote with the Forest and Wildlife Advisory
24	Service.
25	(iii) The council and the Forest and Wildlife
26	Advisory Service shall negotiate and agree to the terms
27	of the contract. The purpose of the contract shall be to
28	annually provide the scientific forest and wildlife
29	services that are set forth in this subsection. The
30	council shall determine the criteria to be used for

1	selecting the Forest and Wildlife Advisory Service.
2	Notice of the contract shall be given to the advisory
3	service and the commission.
4	(iv) The commission shall, under 62 Pa.C.S. Pt. I
5	(relating to Commonwealth Procurement Code), enter into
6	the contract, as negotiated under subparagraph (iii),
7	with the Forest and Wildlife Advisory Service within 60
8	days of receipt of the council's selection.
9	(6) To ensure accountability, any contract entered into
10	under this subsection shall contain specific performance
11	measures that the council may use to evaluate compliance with
12	the terms of the contract. If the Forest and Wildlife
13	Advisory Service fails to meet the performance measures, the
14	council shall, by a majority vote of the members, terminate
15	the contract and replace the Forest and Wildlife Advisory
16	Service.
17	(7) Provisions for payment shall be as set forth in an
18	estimate or contract provided to the council by the Forest
19	and Wildlife Advisory Service and may be amended in writing
20	or supplemented with subsequent estimates for services to be
21	rendered by the Forest and Wildlife Advisory Service if
22	recommended by the council. The commission shall fund the
23	contract from any money appropriated or made available to the
24	commission.
25	(8) The Forest and Wildlife Advisory Service shall
26	conduct annual scientific assessments to determine the
27	condition of the forest and its capacity to sustain optimum
28	populations of deer and other wildlife toward maintaining a
29	balanced ecosystem and the maximum sustained yield of deer

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for sport hunting, and shall prepare an annual report that

1 <u>recommends the total number of antlerless deer licenses that</u>

2 should be allocated for each wildlife management unit. The

Forest and Wildlife Advisory Service shall submit the report

to the council to assist the council in performing its duties

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(9) The council shall provide an annual report to the

Governor, the General Assembly and the Board of Game

Commissioners. The annual report shall include the council's

recommended number of antlerless deer license allocations for

each wildlife management unit. The commission shall post the

recommendation on the commission's publicly accessible

Internet website and in the commission's Pennsylvania Hunting

(10) To assist the council in performing its duties under this title, specifically the duties under section 322(c) (relating to powers and duties of commission), the Forest and Wildlife Advisory Service shall design a habitat enhancement program that benefits deer and other forestdwelling game and nongame species of wildlife and serves the interests of sportsmen for recreational hunting, State camp lessee interests, the outdoor recreation interests of the general public and the economic interests of rural communities and the outdoor industry. The Forest and Wildlife Advisory Service shall direct and facilitate the development and maintenance of this habitat enhancement program on State game lands and State forests and the commission and the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources shall cooperate with the Forest and Wildlife Advisory Service in expediting operations of the habitat enhancement program under the precepts of the program.

- 1 Section 4. Title 34 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 2 <u>§ 2321.1. Senior hunting license holders.</u>
- 3 A person who holds a valid Pennsylvania senior hunting
- 4 <u>license may hunt and kill with an authorized weapon one deer</u>
- 5 that has two or more points to one antler or that has one antler
- 6 three or more inches in length during an antlered deer season.
- 7 Section 5. Section 2901 of Title 34 is amended by adding a
- 8 subsection to read:
- 9 § 2901. Authority to issue permits.
- 10 \* \* \*
- 11 (b.1) Deer management. -- Publicly owned lands within this
- 12 Commonwealth may not be included in any deer management
- 13 <u>assistance program area established by the commission.</u>
- 14 \* \* \*
- 15 Section 6. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
