## AN ACT

Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated

Statutes, in powers of department and local authorities, 2 further providing for control of public travel on private property by owner by adding provisions relating to firearms 3 4 in motor vehicles. 5 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 7 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 6113 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania 8 9 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding subsections to read: 10 § 6113. Control of public travel on private property by owner. \* \* \* 11 12 (c) Firearms in motor vehicles.--13 (1) A business entity, property owner or legal possessor 14 or public or private employer may not establish, maintain or 15 enforce a policy or rule that prohibits or has the effect of 16 prohibiting a person from transporting or storing a firearm in a motor vehicle when the vehicle is in a location where 17 the firearm is otherwise permitted to be and; 18

Τ	(1) the firearm remains inside the person's
2	attended, privately owned motor vehicle; or
3	(ii) the firearm is locked out of sight within the
4	trunk, glove box or other enclosed compartment or
5	container within or on the person's privately owned motor
6	vehicle.
7	(2) (i) A person who is injured or incurs damages as a
8	result of a violation of paragraph (1), or his survivors,
9	may bring a civil action in the appropriate court against
10	any business entity, owner or legal possessor of property
11	or public or private employer who committed or caused the
12	violation.
13	(ii) A person who is denied the opportunity to
14	transport or store a firearm by a policy or rule
15	prohibited by paragraph (1) may bring a civil action in
16	the appropriate court to enjoin any business entity,
17	owner or legal possessor of property or public or private
18	employer from violating paragraph (1).
19	(iii) In any actions brought pursuant to this
20	subsection, reasonable attorney fees and court costs
21	shall be awarded to the prevailing plaintiff.
22	(3) An employee discharged by a public or private
23	employer for a violation of a policy or rule prohibited by
24	paragraph (1) shall be awarded full recovery as specified in
25	paragraph (1). If the demand for the recovery has not been
26	satisfied within 45 calendar days, the employee may bring
27	civil action in the appropriate court against the public or
28	private employer and shall be awarded the following:
29	(i) Reinstatement to the same position held at the
30	time of the employee's termination from employment or to

1	<u>an equivalent position.</u>
2	(ii) Reinstatement of the employee's full fringe
3	benefits and seniority rights.
4	(iii) Compensation for lost wages, benefits or other
5	lost remuneration caused by the termination.
6	(iv) Payment of reasonable attorney fees and court
7	costs incurred.
8	(4) No business entity, owner or legal possessor of
9	property or public or private employer shall be held liable
10	in any civil action for damages, injuries or death resulting
11	from or arising out of another person's actions involving a
12	firearm transported or stored under paragraph (1), including
13	the theft of a firearm from an employee's or invitee's
14	automobile, unless the business entity, owner or legal
15	possessor of property or public or private employer
16	intentionally solicited or procured such other person's
17	injurious actions.
18	(5) The prohibitions in paragraph (1) shall not apply
19	<u>if:</u>
20	(i) the motor vehicle is on the grounds of an owner-
21	occupied, single-family detached residence or a tenant-
22	occupied single-family detached residence;
23	(ii) the motor vehicle is on property where the
24	possession of firearms is expressly prohibited by Federal
25	or State law;
26	(iii) the business entity, owner or legal possessor
27	of property or public or private employer reasonably
28	believes that the person illegally possesses the firearm,
29	provided that a belief based on a mistake of law shall
30	not be considered reasonable for purposes of this_

2	(iv) the person is an employee operating an
3	employer-owned motor vehicle during and in the course of
4	the employee's duties on behalf of the employer.
5	(6) It is the intent of this subsection to reinforce and
6	protect the right of each citizen to lawfully transport and
7	store firearms within his private motor vehicle for lawful
8	purposes in any place where the vehicle is otherwise
9	permitted to be. This subsection is to be liberally construed
10	to enable this purpose.
11	(d) Definitions As used in this section, the following
12	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
13	subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
14	"Firearm." The term shall have the same meaning given to it
15	in 18 Pa.C.S. § 6105(f)(4)(iii) (relating to persons not to
16	possess, use, manufacture, control, sell or transfer firearms).
17	"Motor vehicle." Any automobile, truck, minivan, sports
18	utility vehicle, motorcycle, motor scooter or any other vehicle
19	required to be registered under Pennsylvania law.
20	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
