AN ACT

Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania 1 Consolidated Statutes, in firearms and other dangerous 2 articles, providing for identification required for purchase 3 of firearm ammunition. 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 hereby enacts as follows: 7 Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a section to read: 8 § 6128. Identification required for purchase of firearm 10 ammunition. 11 (a) Identification. -- Except as provided under subsection 12 (b), no individual or business shall sell or deliver firearm ammunition to a purchaser or transferee unless the purchaser or 1.3 14 transferee presents an official form of photographic 15 identification, including, but not limited to, a driver's 16 license, official Pennsylvania photo identification card or official government photo identification card. 17

(b) Exception. -- An individual who is a member of a

- 1 recognized religious sect or community whose tenets forbid or
- 2 <u>discourage the taking of photographs of members of that sect or</u>
- 3 community may present a valid-without-photo driver's license or
- 4 <u>a combination of documents, as prescribed by the Pennsylvania</u>
- 5 State Police, containing the individual's name, address, date of
- 6 birth and signature.
- 7 (c) Penalties. -- An individual or business that violates this
- 8 section shall be liable for civil damages in the amount of:
- 9 <u>(1) \$1,000 for a first offense.</u>
- 10 (2) \$2,000 for a second offense.
- 11 (3) \$3,000 for a third or subsequent offense.
- 12 (d) Prohibition on ammunition sales. -- An individual or
- 13 <u>business that violates this section shall be prohibited from</u>
- 14 selling ammunition for 30 days following a third or subsequent
- 15 offense.
- 16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
