## AN ACT

To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the 1 Executive and Judicial Departments, the State Government 2 Support Agencies and the General Assembly of the 3 Commonwealth, the public debt and the public schools for the 4 5 fiscal year July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2019, for certain institutions and organizations and for the payment of bills 6 7 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018; to provide appropriations from the 8 State Lottery Fund, the Tobacco Settlement Fund, the Aviation 9 Restricted Account, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The 10 State Stores Fund, the Milk Marketing Fund, the Home 11 Investment Trust Fund, the Emergency Medical Services 12 Operating Fund, the Tuition Account Guaranteed Savings 13 Program Fund, the Banking Fund, the Firearm Records Check 14 Fund, the Ben Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund, 15 the Oil and Gas Lease Fund, the Home Improvement Account, the 16 Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter Protection Act 17 Enforcement Fund, the Insurance Regulation and Oversight 18 Fund, the Pennsylvania Racehorse Development Restricted 19 Receipt Account, the Justice Reinvestment Fund, the 20 21 Multimodal Transportation Fund, the State Racing Fund and the ABLE Savings Program Fund to the Executive Department; to 22 provide appropriations from the Judicial Computer System 23 24 Augmentation Account to the Judicial Department for the 25 fiscal year July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2019; to provide appropriations from the Motor License Fund for the fiscal 26 year July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2019, for the proper operation 27 of several departments of the Commonwealth and the 28 Pennsylvania State Police authorized to spend Motor License 29 Fund money; to provide for the appropriation of Federal funds 30 31 to the Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth 32 and for the payment of bills remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018; and to provide for the additional appropriation of Federal and State funds from the 33 34 General Fund, the State Lottery Fund and the Tobacco 35

Short title. 9 10 This act shall be known and may be cited as the General Appropriation Act of 2018. 11 12 Section 102. Definitions. 13 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 14 context clearly indicates otherwise: 15 "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau 16 17 or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists, 18 engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries, 19 auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians, 20 marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and 21 22 other assistants in any department, board or commission. "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding 23 24 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies, 25 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and 26 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and 27 telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and 28 notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel, 29 light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation, repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and 30

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facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on 1 workers' compensation, insurance premiums on policies of 2 liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment 3 4 insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee 5 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth 6 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation 7 costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or 8 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental 9 10 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of 11 General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of 12 automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred 13 through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall 14 15 include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside 16 17 hospital, provided, that in no case shall the State institution 18 pay more for patient care than that provided under the State 19 medical assistance program.

8 (a) General Fund.--The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically 9 appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter 10 11 named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial 12 Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, 13 wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, 14 15 for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services, printing, public 16 17 advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and 18 buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by 19 law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the 20 duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 21 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 22 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 23 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

(b) State Lottery Fund.--The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the State Lottery Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for

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1 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 2 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as 3 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 4 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 5 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 6 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 7 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

8 Tobacco Settlement Fund.--The following sums set forth (C) in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 9 10 specifically appropriated from the Tobacco Settlement Fund to 11 the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of 12 the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 13 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 14 15 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as 16 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 17 18 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 19 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 20 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 21 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

22 Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account.--The (d) 23 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may 24 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the 25 restricted receipt account established within the General Fund, 26 known as the Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account, to 27 the Judicial Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses, for 28 the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the 29 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of 30

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1 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary 2 for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities 3 and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year 4 beginning July 1, 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred 5 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 6 30, 2018.

Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund. -- The 7 (e) following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may 8 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the 9 10 Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund to the several 11 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the 12 Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and 13 14 for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by 15 this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set 16 forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and for the 17 18 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of 19 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

20 The State Stores Fund. -- The following sums set forth in (f) 21 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 22 specifically appropriated from The State Stores Fund to the 23 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the 24 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 25 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 26 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 27 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 28 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 29 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 30

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hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

4 Motor License Fund.--The following sums, or as much (q) thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the 5 6 Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department for the payment of salaries, wages and 7 other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or 8 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for 9 10 contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper 11 conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes 12 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 13 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018. 14

(h) Aviation Restricted Account.--The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the Aviation Restricted Account in the Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department for the purposes set forth herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

22 (i) Hazardous Material Response Fund.--The following sums 23 set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, 24 are hereby specifically appropriated from the Hazardous Material 25 Response Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the 26 Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of fees 27 for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 28 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 29 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 30

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hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

4 (j) Milk Marketing Fund. -- The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 5 6 specifically appropriated from the Milk Marketing Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department 7 of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 8 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 9 10 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 11 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 12 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 13 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 14 15 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 16 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018. 17

18 (k) Home Investment Trust Fund. -- The following sums set 19 forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are 20 hereby specifically appropriated from the Home Investment Trust 21 Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive 22 Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly 23 24 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the 25 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the 26 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of 27 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities 28 and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year 29 beginning July 1, 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred 30

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and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June
 30, 2018.

(1) Tuition Account Guaranteed Savings Program Fund. -- The 3 4 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the 5 6 Tuition Account Guaranteed Savings Program Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the 7 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 8 9 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 10 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 11 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 12 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 13 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 14 15 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 16 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018. 17

16 (x) State Racing Fund.--The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 17 18 specifically appropriated from the State Racing Fund to the 19 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the 20 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 21 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 22 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 23 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 24 25 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 26 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 27 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 28 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018. 29

30 (y) ABLE Savings Program Fund.--The following sums set forth

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in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 1 2 specifically appropriated from the ABLE Savings Program Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of 3 4 the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 5 6 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 7 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 8 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 9 10 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 11 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 12 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018. 13

14 Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations.

15 The following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 16 specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to 17 18 the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive 19 Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses 20 of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and for the payment of 21 22 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018. Unless otherwise stated, the 23 appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal 24 25 year.

26 Section 106. Block grants.

(a) Appropriation.--The following sums set forth in this
act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
specifically appropriated from the block grant (BG) funds to the
several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department

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of the Commonwealth for the purposes and under the restrictions
 for which the funds are provided for the fiscal year beginning
 July 1, 2018.

(b) Small Communities Development Block Grant.--The Small
Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small
cities and communities that have a high concentration of
impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their
low-income and moderate-income housing opportunities and to meet
community development needs.

10 (c) Community Services Block Grant.--The Community Services 11 Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and 12 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the 13 14 community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In 15 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements 16 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to 17 18 assure proper consideration of each recipient.

(d) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.--The Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is for the provision of preventive health and other health services related to emergency medical systems, health initiative grants, comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and domestic violence services.

(e) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant.--The
Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to
enable states to maintain and strengthen their leadership in
planning, promoting, coordinating and evaluating health care for
pregnant women, mothers, infants and children, and children with

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special health care needs and in providing health services for
 mothers and children who do not have access to adequate health
 care.

4 (f) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant.--The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help 5 6 lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income families and individuals, including energy efficiency grants for 7 low-income dwellings. No less than 15% of the LIHEABG funds 8 received shall be used for weatherization. LIHEABG funds 9 10 received pursuant to a Presidential release of contingency funds 11 shall be exempt from the 15% requirement.

12 (g) Social Services Block Grant.--The Social Services Block 13 Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible 14 persons.

(h) Mental Health Services Block Grant.--The Mental Health Services Block Grant (MHSBG) provides funds for the provision of services to adults with serious mental illness or children with serious emotional disturbance.

(i) Substance Abuse Block Grant.--The Substance Abuse Block
Grant (SABG) provides funds to establish and maintain programs
to combat alcohol and drug abuse.

(j) Child Care and Development Fund Block Grant.--The Child Care and Development Fund Block Grant (CCDFBG) is for the provision of direct child care or to increase the quality and availability of child care for low-income families.

(k) Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant.-The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant (TANFBG)
provides funds for the provision of cash grants, child care,
training and support services, child welfare and administration
for eligible families and individuals.

10 (b) Department of Human Services.--The Federal 11 appropriations to the Department of Human Services include any 12 prior earnings that may be received during fiscal year 2018-2019. In addition to the amounts specifically appropriated 13 herein to the Department of Human Services, all money 14 15 appropriated from the Federal Government during any previous fiscal year which are expected to be received as reimbursements 16 may be carried forward until June 30, 2019, to the extent that 17 18 obligations are carried forward. In addition, any reimbursements 19 actually received to support such obligations may also be 20 carried forward.

21 Section 2004. Subgrants between Federal fund appropriations. 22 Subgrants may be made between Federal appropriations without 23 further approval of the General Assembly. The Secretary of the Budget shall submit a list of subgrants to the chairman and 24 25 minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate 26 and the chairman and minority chairman of the Appropriations 27 Committee of the House of Representatives quarterly. No subgrant to a State agency, however, may be made from a restricted 28 receipt account without a specific appropriation by the General 29 30 Assembly.

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1 Section 2005. Utilization of emergency Federal funds.

2 (a) Natural disasters and civil disobedience.--Federal funds 3 available for costs and damages resulting from natural disasters 4 or civil disobedience may be added to an appropriation contained 5 in this act or to funds appropriated or may be used for the 6 purposes prescribed by the Federal Government.

7 (b) Other emergencies. -- In addition to the money 8 appropriated by this act, all money received from the Federal 9 Government for the purpose of disaster assistance or relief, or 10 other money received as a direct result of terrorist acts, money 11 for homeland security and defense and money for avian 12 flu/pandemic preparedness shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to the 13 departments, boards, commissions or agencies designated by the 14 15 Governor.

16 (c) Executive authorization.--In the event of any emergency 17 situation in which the General Assembly cannot act in sufficient 18 time, the Governor is authorized through executive authorization 19 to provide up to \$10,000,000 in Federal funds to alleviate the 20 emergency situation.

21 Definition. -- For the purposes of this section, (d) 22 "emergency" is defined as any situation in which there is a chance of or which may result in substantial human suffering. 23 Section 2006. Transfer of funds from TANFBG to CCDFBG and SSBG. 24 25 In accordance with Federal law which permits the transfer of 26 funds from the TANFBG to the CCDFBG and SSBG, the Department of 27 Human Services, upon approval of the Secretary of the Budget, may make such transfers of funds provided that any such transfer 28 will not result in a deficit in any appropriation from which 29 funds are transferred. The Secretary of the Budget shall provide 30

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10 days prior notification of any such transfers to the chairman 1 and the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the 2 Senate and the chairman and minority chairman of the 3 4 Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives. 5 PART XXI 6 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS 7 FOR 2018-2019 Section 2101. Prior laws unaffected. 8 9 This act is not intended to be inconsistent with or to repeal 10 any provision of any act enacted at this or any prior session of 11 the General Assembly regulating the purchase of supplies, the 12 ordering of printing and binding, the purchase, maintenance and use of automobiles, the method of making payments from the State 13 Treasury for any purpose or the functioning of any 14 15 administrative department, board or commission. Section 2102. Compliance with other law before funds available. 16 17 No appropriation made by this act to any department, board, 18 commission or agency of the Executive Department shall be 19 available unless and until the department, board, commission or 20 agency has complied with sections 615 and 616 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative 21 22 Code of 1929. 23 Section 2103. Contracts prerequisite to encumbering or 24 committing funds. 25 Funds available to agencies, boards, departments, commissions 26 or other governmental entities under this act for the 27 procurement of supplies, services or construction shall not be available for payment of or to be committed to or encumbered for 28 payment of any such procurement unless and until the agency, 29 board, department or other governmental entity has complied with 30

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1 all of the requirements applicable to the procurement that are 2 set out in 62 Pa.C.S. (relating to procurement) and in the 3 policies, procedures and regulations instituted in accordance 4 with that code.

5 Section 2104. Minority business set-asides.

6 (a) Duty to report.--Each department or other 7 instrumentality of the Commonwealth listed in Subpart A of Part 8 II authorized to contract for buildings, highways, commodities, 9 equipment, supplies or services shall report to the General 10 Assembly all information pertinent to anticipated procurement 11 needs at the beginning of each fiscal year and each fiscal 12 quarter thereafter.

(b) Definition.--As used in this section, the term "minority
business" means a minority business enterprise as defined in the
act of July 22, 1974 (P.L.598, No.206), known as the
Pennsylvania Minority Business Development Authority Act.
Section 2105. Appropriation of funds from miscellaneous

19 In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act:

20 Money received in payment for food and household (1)21 supplies furnished to employees and other persons, except 22 inmates, by an institution and money received from the 23 proceeds from the sale of any products of the soil, meats, 24 livestock, timber or other materials sold by a department or 25 agency of the Commonwealth shall be paid into the General 26 Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to the several respective institutions for the operation and 27 maintenance of the institutions. 28

29 (2) Money received from any other source, except the

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1 Section 2107. Appellate courts appropriation contingency.

The funds appropriated in Part II to the Supreme, Superior and Commonwealth Courts for justice and judge expenses are contingent upon a vouchered expense account plan being continued by the Supreme Court.

6 Section 2108. Transfer of excess funds.

7 The Governor may transfer any excess money in those funds 8 receiving proceeds of Commonwealth of Pennsylvania general 9 obligation bonds in excess of the amount necessary for the 10 purposes for which the bonds were issued to the appropriate 11 sinking fund for payment of debt service due on outstanding 12 bonds. If such excess funds, together with any available balance, exceed the amount of debt service remaining to be paid, 13 the funds shall be transferred to the General Fund or to the 14 15 appropriate special fund responsible for such debt service. 16 Section 2109. 12 The appropriation made in this act or in any other fiscal year to the Legislative Reapportionment Commission remaining 13 unexpended and unencumbered on the effective date of this 14 15 section may, upon the written concurrence of the President pro tempore of the Senate, the Majority Leader of the Senate, the 16 Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Majority Leader 17 18 of the House of Representatives, be transferred to any other 19 account of the Senate and the House of Representatives, as they 20 deem necessary.

Section 2111. Administration of Human Services Block Grant. 21 22 The Department of Human Services shall allocate and disburse appropriations in this act for the Human Services Block Grant 23 Program established under Article XIV-B of the act of June 13, 24 25 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, to 26 counties participating in that program. Each such county may 27 adjust the expenditure of its Human Services Block Grant Program allocation between those appropriations in accordance with, and 28 as authorized by, the applicable provision of Article XIV-B of 29 30 the Human Services Code.

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Section 2112. Transfers for consolidated human services
 department.

3 If legislation is enacted during the fiscal period beginning July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019, to consolidate or merge 4 the Department of Human Services, the Department of Health, the 5 Department of Aging and the Department of Drug and Alcohol 6 7 Programs, or any combination thereof, the Secretary of the 8 Budget may consolidate Federal and State appropriations and transfer funds between line items contained in sections 207, 9 10 214, 221, 222, 301, 302, 402 and 601 of this act in order to 11 effectuate and implement the consolidation or merger of 12 departments so authorized. The Secretary of the Budget shall 13 provide 10 days' prior notification of any consolidation of 14 appropriation authority or transfer of funds between line items 15 to the Chairperson and Minority Chairperson of the 16 Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the Chairperson and 17 Minority Chairperson of the Appropriations Committee of the 18 House of Representatives. The State Treasurer shall make 19 appropriate adjustments to the accounts of the Commonwealth upon 20 receipt of expenditure symbol notifications.

21 PART XXII 22 EFFECTIVE DATE Section 2201. Effective date. 23 24 This act shall take effect as follows: 25 (1)This section shall take effect immediately. 26 The remainder of this act shall take effect July 1, (2) 2018, or immediately, whichever is later. 27

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
