AN ACT

- Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in assault, further providing for weapons of mass destruction; and, in theft and related
- offenses, further providing for grading of theft offenses.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Sections 2716(i) and 3903(a.2) and (d) of Title
- 8 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to
- 9 read:
- 10 § 2716. Weapons of mass destruction.
- 11 * * *
- 12 (i) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 13 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 14 subsection:
- 15 "Biological agent." A natural or genetically engineered
- 16 pathogen, toxin, virus, bacteria, prion, fungus or microorganism
- 17 which causes infections, disease or bodily harm.
- 18 ["Bomb." An explosive device used for unlawful purposes.]
- "Chemical agent." Any of the following:

- 1 (1) A nerve agent, including tabun (GA), sarin (GB),
- 2 soman (GD), GF and VX.
- 3 (2) A choking agent, including phosgene (CG) and
- 4 diphosgene (DP).
- 5 (3) A blood agent, including hydrogen cyanide (AC),
- 6 cyanogen chloride (CK) and arsine (SA).
- 7 (4) A blister agent. This paragraph includes:
- 8 (i) Mustard (H).
- 9 (ii) Sulfur mustard (HD).
- 10 (iii) HN-1.
- 11 (iv) HN-2.
- 12 (v) Nitrogen mustard (HN-3).
- 13 (vi) An arsenical, such as lewisite (L).
- 14 (vii) An urticant, such as CX.
- 15 (viii) An incapacitating agent, such as B2.
- 16 (5) Any other chemical element or compound which causes
- death or bodily harm.
- 18 "Explosive material." Explosives, blasting agents and
- 19 detonators.
- 20 "Explosives." Any chemical compound, mixture or device, the
- 21 primary or common purpose of which is to function by explosion.
- 22 The term includes, but is not limited to, dynamite and other
- 23 <u>high explosives</u>, black powder, pellet powder, initiating
- 24 explosives, detonators, safety fuses, squibs, detonating cord,
- 25 <u>igniter cord and igniters.</u>
- 26 "Nuclear agent." A radioactive material.
- "Weapon of mass destruction." A biological agent, [bomb,]
- 28 chemical agent, explosive material or nuclear agent.
- 29 § 3903. Grading of theft offenses.
- 30 * * *

- 1 (a.2) Felony of the first degree. -- Except as provided in
- 2 subsections (a) and (a.1), theft constitutes a felony of the
- 3 first degree if:
- 4 (1) in the case of theft by receiving stolen property,
- 5 the property received, retained or disposed of is a firearm
- 6 or weapon of mass destruction and the receiver is in the
- 7 business of buying or selling stolen property; [or]
- 8 (1.1) the property stolen is a weapon of mass
- 9 <u>destruction; or</u>
- 10 (2) the amount involved is \$500,000 or more.

- 12 (d) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 13 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 14 subsection:
- 15 "Manmade disaster." Any industrial, nuclear or
- 16 transportation accident, explosion, conflagration, power
- 17 failure, natural resource shortage or other condition, except
- 18 enemy action, resulting from manmade causes, such as oil spills
- 19 and other injurious environmental contamination, which threatens
- 20 or causes substantial damage to property, human suffering,
- 21 hardship or loss of life.
- "Natural disaster." Any hurricane, tornado, storm, flood,
- 23 high water, wind-driven water, tidal wave, earthquake,
- 24 landslide, mudslide, snowstorm, drought, fire, explosion or
- 25 other catastrophe which results in substantial damage to
- 26 property, hardship, suffering or possible loss of life.
- 27 "War-caused disaster." Any condition following an attack
- 28 upon the United States resulting in substantial damage to
- 29 property or injury to persons in the United States caused by use
- 30 of bombs, missiles, shellfire, nuclear, radiological, chemical

- 1 or biological means, or other weapons or overt paramilitary
- 2 actions, or other conditions such as sabotage.
- 3 <u>"Weapon of mass destruction."</u> A biological agent, chemical
- 4 agent, explosive material or nuclear agent.
- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
