1 2 3 4 5	Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in firearms and other dangerous articles, providing for firearm safety certificate and establishing the Firearm Safety and Enforcement Fund; and imposing penalties.

8	Section 1. Chapter 61 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
9	Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a subchapter to read:

- 4 § 6191. Legislative intent.
- 5 <u>It is the intent of the General Assembly to:</u>
- 6 (1) Promote safe and responsible firearm ownership.
- 7 (2) Require persons who obtain firearms to have a basic
- 8 <u>familiarity with and understanding of firearm use and</u>
- 9 <u>operation</u>.
- 10 (3) Ensure that firearm owners understand the
- 11 <u>fundamental legal aspects of firearm possession, carry and</u>
- 12 use, including self-defense and the restrictions on the use
- of deadly force.
- 14 (4) Ensure that firearm owners know and understand how
- to safely store and handle firearms.
- 16 § 6192. Definitions.
- 17 The following words and phrases when used in this subchapter
- 18 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 19 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 20 "Applicant." An individual seeking a firearm safety
- 21 <u>certificate.</u>
- 22 <u>"Certificate" or "firearm safety certificate." A certificate</u>
- 23 issued by the Pennsylvania State Police in accordance with this
- 24 subchapter indicating that the holder has successfully completed
- 25 firearm safety training.
- 26 "Certified instructors" or "instructor." A person certified
- 27 <u>as a firearm safety instructor under this subchapter.</u>
- 28 "Firearm." As defined in section 6102 (relating to
- 29 <u>definitions</u>).
- 30 "Firearm capable of being concealed upon the person." The

- 1 term shall apply to and include any firearm which is capable of
- 2 being concealed or in any way hidden or confined upon a person.
- 3 <u>"Fund." The Firearm Safety and Enforcement Fund established</u>
- 4 <u>under section 6196 (relating to Firearm Safety and Enforcement</u>
- 5 Fund).
- 6 "Handgun." A pistol or revolver or other firearm capable of
- 7 being concealed upon the person.
- 8 "Law enforcement agency." The term shall include:
- 9 <u>(1) The Pennsylvania State Police.</u>
- 10 (2) A municipal police department.
- 11 (3) The Office of Attorney General.
- 12 (4) The Federal Bureau of Investigation or other Federal
- 13 law enforcement agency.
- 14 (5) A police department of another State or
- 15 jurisdiction.
- 16 "Law enforcement official." The term includes the following:
- 17 (1) The Attorney General and authorized employees.
- 18 (2) A district attorney of a county and authorized
- 19 employees.
- 20 (3) A Pennsylvania State Police trooper.
- 21 (4) A municipal police officer.
- 22 (5) A Federal law enforcement officer or agent who is
- 23 <u>authorized to possess or carry a concealed firearm in any</u>
- jurisdiction in the United States.
- 25 "Written authorization." The verifiable written
- 26 certification from the head of a law enforcement agency by which
- 27 the purchaser or transferee of a firearm is employed,
- 28 identifying the employee as an individual authorized to conduct
- 29 the transaction and authorizing the transaction for the
- 30 exclusive use of the law enforcement agency by which that person

- 1 is employed.
- 2 § 6193. Firearm safety certificate.
- 3 (a) Certificate required. -- Notwithstanding any provision of
- 4 this chapter or any other law or regulation to the contrary, a
- 5 person shall not:
- 6 (1) Purchase or receive a firearm, except an antique
- 7 <u>firearm as defined in section 6118 (relating to antique</u>
- 8 <u>firearms</u>) or a firearm which is a curio or relic, as defined
- 9 <u>in 27 CFR 478.11 (relating to meaning of terms), without a</u>
- 10 valid firearm safety certificate, except that in the case of
- 11 <u>a firearm which is a handgun, an expired firearm safety</u>
- 12 <u>certificate may be used.</u>
- 13 (2) Sell, deliver, loan or transfer a firearm, except an
- 14 <u>antique firearm or a firearm which is a curio or relic under</u>
- 27 CFR 478.11, to any person who does not have a valid
- 16 <u>firearm safety certificate, except that, in the case of a</u>
- firearm which is a handgun, an expired firearm safety
- 18 certificate may be used.
- 19 (b) Exceptions to firearm safety certificate requirement.--
- 20 Notwithstanding subsection (a), the following persons shall be
- 21 exempt from the firearm safety certificate requirement under
- 22 subsection (a):
- 23 (1) A law enforcement official.
- 24 (2) An active or honorably retired peace officer as
- 25 defined in section 501 (relating to definitions).
- 26 (3) An active or honorably retired Federal law
- 27 <u>enforcement officer or agent.</u>
- 28 (4) A person who has successfully completed municipal
- 29 police officers' education and training in accordance with 53
- 30 Pa.C.S. Ch. 21 Subch. D (relating to municipal police

- 1 <u>education and training</u>).
- 2 (5) A firearm dealer licensed in accordance with
- 3 sections 6112 (relating to retail dealer required to be
- 4 <u>licensed</u>) and 6113 (relating to licensing of dealers) who is
- 5 <u>acting in the course and scope of his activities as a</u>
- 6 licensed dealer.
- 7 (6) An active or honorably retired member of the United
- 8 States Armed Forces or a reserve component of the United
- 9 <u>States Armed Forces as defined in 10 U.S.C. § 101 (relating</u>
- 10 to definitions).
- 11 (c) Certain exemption by operation of law.--The following
- 12 persons who take title or possession of a firearm by operation
- 13 of law in a representative capacity, until or unless they
- 14 <u>transfer title ownership of the firearm to themselves in a</u>
- 15 personal capacity, shall be exempt from the requirements of
- 16 subsection (a):
- 17 (1) The executor or administrator of an estate.
- 18 (2) A secured creditor or an agent or employee of a
- 19 secured creditor when a firearm is possessed as collateral
- for, or as a result of, a default under a security agreement
- 21 under 13 Pa.C.S. (relating to commercial code).
- 22 (3) A writ server who is directed to execute a writ or
- 23 serve other court documents under 42 Pa.C.S. (relating to
- judiciary and judicial procedure).
- 25 (4) A receiver performing the functions of a receiver
- 26 under the laws of this Commonwealth.
- 27 (5) A trustee in bankruptcy performing the duties of a
- trustee.
- 29 (6) An assignee for the benefit of creditors performing
- 30 the functions of an assignee.

- 1 (d) Holder of hunting license. -- A person who holds a valid
- 2 <u>unexpired hunting license which was issued for the hunting</u>
- 3 season immediately preceding the calendar year in which the
- 4 person receives or takes possession of a firearm shall be exempt
- 5 from the requirements of subsection (a), except as to a firearm
- 6 which is a handgun.
- 7 (e) Law enforcement exemption. -- This section shall not apply
- 8 to a sale, delivery or transfer of firearms made to a law
- 9 <u>enforcement official representing a law enforcement agency for</u>
- 10 the exclusive use by that law enforcement agency if, prior to
- 11 the sale, delivery or transfer of the firearms, written
- 12 <u>authorization from the head of the law enforcement agency</u>
- 13 authorizing the transaction is presented to the person from whom
- 14 the purchase, delivery or transfer is being made.
- 15 § 6194. Pennsylvania State Police.
- 16 <u>(a) Administration and enforcement.--The Pennsylvania State</u>
- 17 Police shall administer and enforce the provisions of this
- 18 <u>subchapter</u>.
- 19 (b) Duties of Pennsylvania State Police. -- To carry out the
- 20 provisions of this subchapter, the Pennsylvania State Police
- 21 shall:
- 22 (1) Develop a program for the certification of persons
- 23 <u>to provide firearm safety instruction to individuals seeking</u>
- firearm safety certification in accordance with the
- 25 <u>provisions of this subchapter.</u>
- 26 (2) Develop a firearm safety manual and make the manual
- 27 <u>available to firearm dealers licensed under sections 6112</u>
- 28 (relating to retail dealer required to be licensed) and 6113
- 29 (relating to licensing of dealers). Each firearm dealer shall
- 30 make the manual available to the general public. A firearm

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- 2 including the manual or essential portions of the manual in a
- 3 pamphlet developed by the dealer that summarizes the
- 4 <u>Commonwealth's firearms law, by posting the instructions</u>
- 5 <u>manual or essential portions of the manual on the dealer's</u>
- 6 publicly accessible Internet website or by providing a link
- 7 <u>to the Pennsylvania State Police's publicly accessible</u>
- 8 <u>Internet website on the dealer's publicly accessible Internet</u>
- 9 <u>website.</u>
- 10 (3) Establish a link on its publicly accessible Internet
- 11 <u>website for dealers and other persons to download the firearm</u>
- 12 <u>safety manual.</u>
- 13 (4) Develop audiovisual materials for use by certified
- instructors to conduct firearm safety training.
- 15 (5) Solicit input from a reputable association or
- organization, including a law enforcement association which
- has as one of its objectives the promotion of firearm safety,
- in the development of audiovisual materials and other
- 19 instructional materials.
- 20 (6) Prescribe a minimum level of skill, knowledge and
- 21 <u>competency to be required of all firearm safety instructors.</u>
- 22 (7) Develop quidelines to govern the certification of
- 23 persons as firearm safety training instructors.
- 24 (8) Develop guidelines to govern the issuance and
- 25 renewal of firearm safety certificates. The guidelines may,
- at the discretion of the Pennsylvania State Police, require
- 27 <u>the holder of the expiring or expired certificate to pass an</u>
- 28 objective test.
- 29 (9) Develop a written objective test, prescribe the
- 30 objective test's content and the form and manner in which the

1	objective test may be administered by certified instructors
2	and make the objective test available to certified
3	instructors. The Pennsylvania State Police may establish a
4	secure link on its publicly accessible Internet website for
5	certified instructors or other authorized persons to download
6	the objective tests.
7	(10) Develop procedures for the oral administration of
8	the objective test to persons with disabilities or language
9	barriers.
_0	(11) Update objective test materials for firearm safety
1	training when determined appropriate, but not less than once
_2	every five years.
13	(12) Require licensed dealers or employees of licensed
_4	dealers who are also certified instructors under this
15	subchapter to designate a separate room or partitioned area
16	for a person to take the objective test and maintain adequate
L 7	supervision to ensure that no acts of collusion occur while
8	the objective test is being administered.
_9	(c) Certification of instructors
20	(1) The Pennsylvania State Police shall certify persons
21	as firearm safety training instructors in this Commonwealth.
22	(2) The Pennsylvania State Police may require applicants
23	for certification as firearm safety training instructors in
24	this Commonwealth to have prior certification or firearm
25	training from one of the following agencies or organizations:
26	(i) The Federal Law Enforcement Training Center of
27	the United States Department of Homeland Security,
28	Firearm Instructor Training Program, range master
29	training or other Federal weapons training program as
30	determined by the Pennsylvania State Police.

Τ	(11) The Pennsylvania State Police or a municipal
2	police department of this Commonwealth or of another
3	state, as approved by the Pennsylvania State Police.
4	(iii) A United States Armed Forces marksmanship or
5	weapons training instructor program, provided, however,
6	that a person's assignment as a range officer or safety
7	officer shall not be deemed sufficient for training
8	purposes.
9	(iv) The National Rifle Association or a sportsmen
10	or gun club.
11	(v) The Municipal Police Officers' Education and
12	Training Commission established under 53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 21
13	Subch. D (relating to municipal police education and
14	<pre>training).</pre>
15	(vi) An accredited institution of higher education
16	in this Commonwealth which offers a class or course of
17	study in firearm training or safety.
18	(3) Nothing in this subsection shall preclude the
19	Pennsylvania State Police from automatically certifying a
20	person as a certified instructor, provided that the person
21	applying for the certification holds a valid firearm safety
22	certificate or firearms or weapons instructor certification
23	from an agency or organization under paragraph (2).
24	(d) Content of objective test The objective test developed
25	by the Pennsylvania State Police for firearm safety
26	certification shall include, but not be limited to, the
27	<pre>following:</pre>
28	(1) The laws applicable to carrying and handling
29	firearms in this Commonwealth, particularly a firearm that is
30	<u>a handgun.</u>

- 1 (2) The responsibilities of ownership of firearms,
- 2 particularly a firearm that is a handqun.
- 3 (3) Provisions of law which relate to the private sale
- 4 <u>and transfer of firearms.</u>
- 5 (4) Provisions of law which relate to the permissible
- 6 use of lethal force.
- 7 (5) What constitutes safe storage of firearms.
- 8 (6) Issues associated with bringing firearms into a home
- 9 <u>with children, especially a firearm that is a handgun.</u>
- 10 (7) Harm prevention strategies to address issues
- associated with bringing firearms into a home.
- 12 (e) Firearm safety certificate. -- The Pennsylvania State
- 13 Police shall develop a firearm safety certificate to be issued
- 14 by certified instructors to persons seeking firearm safety
- 15 certification and who successfully passed a firearm safety
- 16 objective test in accordance with the requirements of this
- 17 subchapter. A firearm safety certificate shall include, but not
- 18 be limited to, the following:
- 19 (1) A unique firearm safety certificate identification
- 20 number.
- 21 (2) The holder's full name and date of birth.
- 22 (3) The holder's driver's license number or State
- identification card number.
- 24 (4) The holder's signature.
- 25 (5) The signature of the issuing instructor.
- 26 (6) The date of issuance and expiration.
- 27 § 6195. Issuance of firearm safety certificate, requirements
- and compliance.
- 29 <u>(a) Compliance required for issuance.--A certified</u>
- 30 instructor shall not issue a firearm safety certificate to a

- 1 person who has not complied with this subchapter. Proof of
- 2 compliance shall be forwarded to the Pennsylvania State Police
- 3 by certified instructors in the form and manner and at the times
- 4 <u>as the Pennsylvania State Police shall prescribe.</u>
- 5 <u>(b) Objective test required.--</u>
- 6 (1) An applicant for a firearm safety certificate shall
- 7 <u>successfully pass the objective test developed by the</u>
- 8 <u>Pennsylvania State Police in accordance with section 6194(d)</u>
- 9 <u>(relating to Pennsylvania State Police) with a passing grade</u>
- 10 <u>of at least 75%.</u>
- 11 (2) An applicant who fails to pass the objective test
- 12 <u>upon the first attempt shall be offered additional</u>
- instructional materials by the instructor, such as the
- firearm safety manual, a videotape or instructional materials
- as may be approved by the Pennsylvania State Police. The
- following shall apply:
- 17 (i) A person may not retake the objective test under
- any circumstances until 24 hours have elapsed after the
- 19 <u>failure to pass the objective test upon the first</u>
- 20 <u>attempt</u>.
- 21 (ii) A person failing the objective test on the
- 22 <u>first attempt shall take another version of the objective</u>
- test upon the second attempt.
- 24 (iii) A person who fails the objective test on a
- 25 second or subsequent attempt may not retake the objective
- test until five days have elapsed after failure to pass
- 27 the objective test on the second and each subsequent
- attempt.
- 29 (iv) When feasible, all objective tests shall be
- 30 retaken from the same instructor except upon permission

1	by the Pennsylvania State Police, which shall be granted
2	only for good cause shown.
3	(v) The instructor shall make himself or herself
4	available to the applicant during regular business hours
5	in order to retake the objective test.
6	(c) Issuance of certificate A person receiving a passing
7	grade on the objective test in accordance with subsection (b) (1)
8	shall immediately be issued a firearm safety certificate by the
9	certified instructor. A certified instructor shall not issue a
10	firearm safety certificate to any person who is under 18 years
11	of age.
12	(d) Expiration and renewal of certificate
13	(1) Each firearm safety certificate issued under
14	subsection (b)(1) shall expire five years from the date
15	issued by the certified instructor.
16	(2) In the case of the loss or destruction of a firearm
17	safety certificate, the issuing instructor or the
18	Pennsylvania State Police shall issue a duplicate certificate
19	upon request and proof of identification to the certificate
20	holder. A duplicate firearm safety certificate shall be valid
21	for the balance of the unexpired term of the original
22	certificate.
23	<u>(e) Fees</u>
24	(1) In addition to a fee or charge which may be imposed
25	by a certified instructor for firearm training, each
26	certified instructor shall charge a fee of \$30 for the
27	issuance of a firearm safety certificate. Twenty dollars of
28	the fee shall be remitted to the Pennsylvania State Police
29	for deposit into the fund in accordance with section 6196
30	(relating to Firearm Safety and Enforcement Fund).

- 1 (2) A person seeking to renew an expiring or expired
- 2 <u>firearm safety certificate may be required to pass the</u>
- 3 <u>objective test, as determined by the Pennsylvania State</u>
- 4 <u>Police. For the renewal of an expiring or expired</u>
- 5 <u>certificate, each certified instructor shall charge a fee of</u>
- \$25, \$15 of which shall be remitted to the Pennsylvania State
- 7 Police for deposit into the fund in accordance with section
- 8 6196.
- 9 <u>(3) In the case of the loss or destruction of a firearm</u>
- safety certificate, the Pennsylvania State Police may
- 11 <u>authorize the issuing instructor to charge a fee of \$15 for a</u>
- duplicate certificate, \$10 of which shall be remitted to the
- 13 <u>Pennsylvania State Police for deposit into the fund in</u>
- 14 <u>accordance with section 6196.</u>
- 15 § 6196. Firearm Safety and Enforcement Fund.
- 16 <u>The following apply:</u>
- 17 (1) The Firearm Safety and Enforcement Fund is
- 18 established as a restricted account in the State Treasury.
- 19 <u>Money in the fund shall be expended by the Pennsylvania State</u>
- 20 Police for the sole and exclusive purpose of administering
- and enforcing this subchapter.
- 22 (2) The fund shall consist of all money received and
- 23 deposited into the fund by the Pennsylvania State Police in
- 24 accordance with section 6195(e) (relating to issuance of
- 25 safety certificate and compliance) and any interest thereon,
- 26 money which may be appropriated by the General Assembly and
- 27 <u>any other contributions, payments or deposits which may be</u>
- 28 made available to the fund.
- 29 § 6197. Violations and penalties.
- 30 (a) Revocation of instructor certificate. -- A violation of

this subchapter by a certified instructor may be grounds for the 1 Pennsylvania State Police to revoke the instructor's authority 2 to provide firearm safety training to persons seeking a firearm safety certificate and to issue firearm safety certificates to 4 5 those persons. 6 (b) Acts of collusion. --7 (1) A person shall not commit an act of collusion as 8 specified in paragraph (2). 9 (2) For purposes of paragraph (1), an act of collusion may include the following activities: 10 (i) Answering questions for an applicant taking the 11 12 objective test for a firearm safety certificate while the 13 objective test is being administered. 14 (ii) Knowingly grading an objective test for a firearm safety certificate falsely. 15 16 (iii) Providing an advance copy of the objective test to an applicant seeking a firearm safety 17 18 certificate. 19 (iv) Taking or allowing another person to take 20 firearm safety training for the applicant seeking a 21 firearm safety certificate. 22 (v) Taking or allowing another person to take the 23 objective test for the applicant seeking a firearm safety 24 certificate. 25 (vi) Using or allowing another to use an applicant's 26 identification for the purpose of obtaining a firearm safety certificate. 27 28 (vii) Allowing persons to give an applicant for a 29 firearm safety certificate unauthorized assistance during

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administration of the objective test.

- 1 (viii) Using unauthorized materials while taking the
- 2 <u>objective test and cheating by the applicant.</u>
- 3 (c) Additional violations.--It shall be unlawful for a
- 4 person to do any of the following:
- 5 (1) Alter, counterfeit or falsify a firearm safety
- 6 <u>certificate</u>.
- 7 (2) Use or attempt to use any altered, counterfeited or
- 8 <u>falsified firearm safety certificate to purchase a firearm.</u>
- 9 (d) Penalty. -- A person who violates subsections (b) and (c)
- 10 commits a misdemeanor.
- 11 § 6198. Immunity from liability.
- 12 The Pennsylvania State Police shall be immune from any
- 13 liability which may arise from administering, implementing or
- 14 enforcing any provisions of this subchapter.
- 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
