1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14	Amending the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220, No.39), entitled "An act licensing and regulating the practice of social work; providing penalties; and making an appropriation," further providing for legislative intent, for definitions, for license required, for State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and Professional Counselors, for powers and functions of board, for qualifications for licensure examination, for reciprocity, for endorsement of out-of-State licenses and for reinstatement of license; providing for restriction on use of title "licensed professional art therapist" and related titles; and further providing for unlawful practice.
15	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
16	hereby enacts as follows:
17	Section 1. Section 2 of the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220,
18	No.39), known as the Social Workers, Marriage and Family
19	Therapists and Professional Counselors Act, is amended to read:
20	Section 2. Legislative intent.
21	The practice of social work, marriage and family therapy
22	[and]_ professional counseling and professional art therapy_
23	within this Commonwealth is hereby declared to affect the public
24	safety and welfare and to be subject to regulation and control

in the public interest to protect the public from 1 2 unprofessional, improper, unauthorized and unqualified practice 3 of licensed social work, licensed marriage and family therapy [and], licensed professional counseling and licensed 4 professional art therapy. This act regulates only those who hold 5 themselves out as licensed social workers, licensed clinical 6 7 social workers, licensed marriage and family therapists [or as], 8 licensed professional counselors or as licensed professional art therapists. Acquisition of a license under this act shall not be 9 10 made a condition of the employment of a person by the Commonwealth or any of its political subdivisions or by 11 12 nonprofit agencies. 13 Section 2. The definitions of "board" and "diagnosis" in

14 section 3 of the act are amended and the section is amended by 15 adding definitions to read:

16 Section 3. Definitions.

17 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 18 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 19 context clearly indicates otherwise:

21 "Board." The State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and 22 Family Therapists [and], Professional Counselors <u>and</u>

23 <u>Professional Art Therapists</u> under the Bureau of Professional and
24 Occupational Affairs within the Department of State.

25 <u>"Certified art therapist." An individual holding national</u>
26 <u>board certification from the Art Therapy Credentials Board.</u>
27 * * *

28 "Diagnosis." The term includes the following:

29 (1) A clinical social work assessment, a marriage and
30 family therapist assessment [or], a professional counselor

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1 assessment or a professional art therapy assessment.

2 The utilization of currently accepted diagnostic (2) 3 classifications by a clinical social worker, a marriage and family therapist [or], a professional counselor or a 4 5 professional art therapist, including, but not limited to, the American Psychiatric Association's Diagnostic and 6 7 Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, as amended and 8 supplemented, but only to the extent of the clinical social 9 worker's, marriage and family therapist's [or], professional 10 counselor's or professional art therapist's education, 11 training, experience and scope of practice as established by 12 this act. * * * 13 14 "Independent practice of professional art therapy." The application of professional art therapy knowledge and skills by 15 16 an individual: 17 (1) who styles oneself as a professional art therapist; 18 (2) who regulates and is responsible for his or her own 19 practice and treatment procedures; and

20 (3) whose practice is not affiliated with any other

21 practice, health care facility, government agency or

22 government-regulated social service agency.

24 "Licensed professional art therapist." An individual who

25 engages in the practice of professional art therapy and who

26 holds a current license under this act.

27 * * *

28 "Practice of professional art therapy." The integrative

29 application of psychotherapeutic principles and methods with

30 specialized training in strategic use of art media, the

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neurobiological implications of art making and art-based 1 assessment models. The term includes the following: 2 3 (1) The evaluation, assessment, diagnosis and treatment of normal and abnormal cognitive, developmental, behavioral 4 and emotional disorders in individuals, families and groups. 5 (2) Strategic application of therapeutic art 6 7 interventions, in the context of applied psychological theory 8 in a psychotherapeutic relationship. (3) Facilitation of visual, nonverbal and verbal 9 10 receptive and expressive communication and implementation of treatment plans to help clients improve cognitive and sensory 11 12 motor functions, increase self-awareness and self-esteem, 13 cope with traumatic experience and grief, reduce symptoms of 14 depression, anger and distress and improve educational performance, vocational performance and social functioning. 15 * * * 16 "Professional art therapy assessment." The professional 17 18 application of psychotherapeutic and art therapy theories and 19 techniques to evaluate, identify and establish plans for treatment of individuals, families and groups with emotional, 20 mental, addiction and behavioral disorders. The term includes a 21 mental health examination and psychological history. 22 * * * 23 Section 3. Sections 4, 5 heading, (a), (k) and (l) and 6(2) 24 25 and (3) of the act are amended to read: 26 Section 4. License required. 27 It shall be unlawful for any person to hold himself or herself forth as a licensed bachelor social worker, licensed 28 29 social worker, licensed clinical social worker, licensed marriage and family therapist [or], licensed professional 30

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counselor <u>or licensed professional art therapist</u> unless he or
 she shall first have obtained a license pursuant to this act.
 Section 5. State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family
 Therapists [and], Professional Counselors <u>and</u>
 <u>Professional Art Therapists</u>.

6 (a) Creation. -- There is hereby created the State Board of 7 Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists [and], 8 Professional Counselors and Professional Art Therapists, a departmental administrative board in the Department of State. 9 10 The board shall consist of [13] 15 members who are citizens of the United States and who have been residents of this 11 12 Commonwealth for a two-year period, two of whom shall be public 13 members; five of whom shall be licensed social workers, at least 14 one of whom shall be a licensed clinical social worker and at least one of whom shall be a licensed social worker; two of whom 15 16 shall be licensed marriage and family therapists; two of whom shall be licensed professional counselors; one of whom shall be 17 18 either a licensed marriage and family therapist or a licensed professional counselor whose membership shall rotate between 19 20 those professions at the expiration of the member's second term; 21 two of whom shall be licensed professional art therapists; and 22 one of whom shall be the Commissioner of Professional and 23 Occupational Affairs.

(k) Notice.--Reasonable notice of all meetings shall be given in conformity with [the act of July 3, 1986 (P.L.388, No.84), known as the Sunshine Act] <u>65 Pa.C.S. Ch. 7 (relating to</u> <u>open meetings)</u>.

(1) Operating procedures.--The board shall meet within 30days after the appointment of its new members and set up

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operating procedures and develop application forms for licensing 1 2 clinical social workers, marriage and family therapists [and], 3 professional counselors and professional art therapists. It shall be the responsibility of the board to circulate these 4 forms and educate the public to the requirements of licensing in 5 order to hold oneself out as a licensed bachelor social 6 7 worker, licensed social worker, licensed clinical social worker, 8 licensed marriage and family therapist [or], licensed professional counselor or licensed professional art therapist 9 10 within the Commonwealth. Section 6. Powers and functions of board. 11 12 The board shall have the following powers: * * * 13 14 (2) To adopt and, from time to time, revise such rules 15 and regulations as may be necessary to carry into effect the 16 provisions of this act. Such regulations may include, but 17 shall not be limited to, standards of professional practice 18 and conduct for licensed bachelor social workers, licensed 19 social workers, licensed clinical social workers, licensed 20 marriage and family therapists [and], licensed professional counselors and licensed professional art therapists in 21 22 Pennsylvania.

(3) To examine for, deny, approve, issue, revoke,
suspend or renew licenses of bachelor social workers, social
workers, clinical social workers, marriage and family
therapists [and], professional counselors <u>and professional</u>
<u>art therapists</u> pursuant to this act and to conduct hearings
in connection therewith.

Procedures for licensing. * * 13 14 (b) Issuance of license.--The board shall issue to each 15 person who meets the licensure requirements of this act a 16 certificate setting forth that such person is licensed to hold 17 himself or herself out as a licensed bachelor social worker, a 18 licensed social worker, a licensed clinical social worker, a 19 licensed marriage and family therapist [or], a licensed professional counselor or a licensed professional art therapist. 20 Section 6. Exemption from licensure examination. * * * 24 25 (d) Professional art therapists. -- The requirements of 26 section 7(h)(5) shall not apply and a license shall be issued without examination to an applicant who meets all of the 27 following requirements: 28 29 (1) Has submitted an application for a professional art therapist license, accompanied by the required fee, within 30

15	educational institution with a course of study that the

18	purposes of meeting the education requirements for
19	registration as an art therapist.
20	(4) Holds a current credential as a certified art
21	therapist and has passed the national board certification
22	examination of the Art Therapy Credentials Board.

24	Section 10. Reciprocity.
25	(a) General ruleThe board shall have the power to grant a
26	reciprocal license to an applicant who is licensed or certified
27	as a bachelor social worker, social worker, clinical social
28	worker, marriage and family therapist $[or]_{\mathcal{L}}$ professional
29	counselor or professional art therapist in another state and has
30	demonstrated qualifications which equal or exceed those required
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pursuant to this act in the determination of the board, provided 1 2 that no license shall be granted under this section to an 3 applicant unless the state in which the applicant is licensed affords reciprocal treatment to persons who are residents of 4 this Commonwealth and who are licensed pursuant to this act. 5 Emergencies.--The board shall have the power to allow an 6 (b) individual who is licensed or certified as a clinical social 7 8 worker, a marriage and family therapist [or], a professional counselor or a professional art therapist in another state to 9 practice in this Commonwealth without licensure for no more than 10 60 days as part of a relief effort related to a state of 11 12 emergency as declared by the Federal Government or the Governor. 13 Section 8. Endorsement of out-of-State licenses. 16 * * * 17 (d) Professional art therapist license.--The board may issue 18 a professional art therapist license without examination to an 19 applicant holding a professional art therapist or equivalent 20 mental health license in another state who submits proof 21 satisfactory to the board of all of the following: 22 (1) The applicant is of good moral character. 23 (2) The applicant meets the educational requirements as 24 specified in section 7(h)(2). 25 (3) The applicant has completed a minimum of 3,000 hours 26 of supervised clinical experience acceptable to the board. (4) The applicant holds a license that is in good 27 28 standing from another state. 29 (5) The applicant has, at a minimum, been actively engaged in the practice of professional art therapy work for 30

29	Unless ordered to do so by Commonwealth Court or an appeal
30	therefrom, the board shall not reinstate the license of a person
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to practice as a bachelor social worker, social worker, clinical 1 2 social worker, marriage and family therapist [or], professional counselor or professional art therapist pursuant to this act, 3 which has been revoked. Any person whose license has been 4 revoked may apply for reinstatement, after a period of at least 5 five years, but must meet all of the licensing qualifications of 6 7 this act, including the examination requirement, if he or she 8 desires to practice as a bachelor social worker, social worker, 9 clinical social worker, marriage and family therapist [or], professional counselor or professional art therapist pursuant to 10 11 this act at any time after such revocation. 12 Section 10. The act is amended by adding a section to read: Section 16.5. Restriction on use of title "licensed 13 14 professional art therapist" and related titles. (a) General rule. -- Only individuals who have received 15 licenses as licensed professional art therapists under this act 16 may engage in the independent practice of professional art 17 therapy, use the letters "L.P.A.T." in connection with their 18 19 names or represent themselves to the public as licensed professional art therapists, professional art therapists or art 20 21 therapists. It shall be unlawful for an individual to style oneself as a professional art therapist, advertise or engage in_ 22 23 the independent practice of professional art therapy or use any 24 words or symbols indicating or tending to indicate that the individual is a licensed professional art therapist, 25 26 professional art therapist or otherwise qualified to practice professional art therapy without holding a license in good_ 27 28 standing under this act. 29 (b) Nonapplicability.--This section shall not apply to the 30 following:

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1	(1) A person employed by the Commonwealth in an art
2	therapist position on the effective date of this subsection,
3	during the time of employment by the Commonwealth in that
4	position.
5	(2) A person who holds a valid license or is certified
6	or regulated pursuant to another professional licensure law

14	or herself as a licensed professional art therapist or

16	(4) A student enrolled in an art therapy academic
17	program with an accredited educational institution while
18	practicing art therapy under qualified supervision and as
19	part of an approved course of study if the student does not
20	represent himself or herself as a professional art therapist
21	or art therapist. A student enrolled in an art therapy
22	program may identify himself or herself only as an "art_
23	therapy student" or "art therapy intern."

28	(b) Civil penaltyIn addition to any other civil remedy or

29 criminal penalty provided for in this act, the board, by a vote 30 of the majority of the maximum number of the authorized

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membership of the board as provided by law, or by a vote of the 1 2 majority of the duly qualified and confirmed membership or a 3 minimum of three members, whichever is greater, may levy a civil penalty of up to \$10,000 on any current licensee who violates 4 any provision of this act, on any person who engages in the 5 independent practice of clinical social work, the independent 6 practice of marriage and family therapy [or], the independent 7 8 practice of professional counseling or the independent practice of professional art therapy without being licensed pursuant to 9 10 this act or on any person who holds himself or herself out as a licensed bachelor social worker, licensed social worker, 11 12 licensed clinical social worker, licensed marriage and family 13 therapist, licensed professional counselor or marriage and 14 family therapist or licensed professional art therapist or professional art therapist without being so licensed pursuant to 15 16 this act. The board shall levy this penalty only after affording the accused party the opportunity for a hearing, as provided in 17 18 Title 2 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes (relating to 19 administrative law and procedure).

21 Section 18. License renewal; records and fees.

(b) Records.--A record of all persons licensed to practice
as bachelor social workers, social workers, clinical social
workers, marriage and family therapists [and], professional
counselors and professional art therapists in Pennsylvania shall
be kept in the office of the board and shall be open to public
inspection and copying upon payment of a nominal fee for copying
the record.

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1 Section 20. Unlawful practice.

2 Unlawful practice prohibited. -- It shall be unlawful for (a) 3 any person to engage in the independent practice of clinical social work, the independent practice of marriage and family 4 therapy [or], the independent practice of professional 5 counseling or the independent practice of professional art_ 6 7 therapy or hold himself or herself out as a licensed bachelor 8 social worker, licensed social worker, licensed clinical social worker, marriage and family therapist [and], professional 9 counselor and licensed professional art therapist without 10 11 possessing a valid, unexpired, unrevoked and unsuspended license 12 issued under this act.

13 * * *

14 Section 12. Within 60 days of the effective date of this 15 section, the Governor shall nominate two professional members to 16 serve as the licensed professional art therapist members of the State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists, 17 18 Professional Counselors and Professional Art Therapists. The professional members initially appointed pursuant to this 19 20 section need not be licensed by the licensure examination adopted by the State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and 21 Family Therapists, Professional Counselors and Professional Art 22 23 Therapists but, at the time of appointment, must satisfy all 24 other requirements of this act for licensure as a professional art therapist. 25

Section 13. The State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists, Professional Counselors and Professional Art Therapists shall promulgate final regulations to carry out the provisions of this act within 18 months of the effective date of this section.

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Section 14. This act shall take effect as follows:
 (1) The amendment or addition of sections 4, 16.5, 17(b)
 and 20(a) of the act shall take effect in 24 months.
 (2) The remainder of this act shall take effect in 60
 days.
