#### AN ACT

To provide appropriations from the General Fund for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the 2 Commonwealth, the public debt and the public schools for the 3 fiscal year July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024, and for the 4 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close 5 of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023; to provide 6 7 appropriations from special funds and accounts to the Executive and Judicial Departments for the fiscal year July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024, and for the payment of bills 8 9 remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 10 11 30, 2023; to provide for the appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive and Judicial Departments for the fiscal year 12 July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024, and for the payment of bills 13 remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 14 30, 2023; and to provide for the additional appropriation of 15 Federal and State funds to the Executive and Legislative 16 Departments for the fiscal year July 1, 2022, to June 30, 17 2023, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining 18 unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022. 19 20 TABLE OF CONTENTS 21 PART I. - 29 This act shall be known and may be cited as the General
- 30 Appropriation Act of 2023.

- 9 "Current fiscal year." The fiscal year beginning July 1,
- 10 2023, and ending June 30, 2024.
- "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau
- 12 or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant
- 13 superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists,
- 14 engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries,
- 15 auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians,
- 16 marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and
- 17 other assistants in a department, board or commission.
- 18 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding
- 19 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies,
- 20 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and
- 21 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage,
- 22 telecommunication devices and telecommunication rentals and toll
- 23 charges, newspaper advertising and notices, public advertising
- 24 by or through any medium, fuel, light, heat, power and water,
- 25 minor construction and renovation, repairs or reconstruction of
- 26 equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and
- 27 equipment, premiums on workers' compensation, insurance premiums
- 28 on policies of liability insurance, insurance premiums on
- 29 medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer
- 30 workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee

- 1 and retired employee group hospital and medical insurance,
- 2 payment of Commonwealth share of Social Security taxes and
- 3 unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the
- 4 purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery
- 5 and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment
- 6 to the Department of General Services of mileage and other
- 7 charges for the use of motor vehicles and rental payments for
- 8 permanently assigned motor vehicles and of expenses or costs of
- 9 services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term
- 10 "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the
- 11 treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must
- 12 be transferred to an outside hospital, provided that in no case
- 13 shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that
- 14 provided under the State medical assistance program.
