## AN ACT

1	Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), entitled
2	"An concerning elections, including general, municipal,
3	special and primary elections, the nomination of candidates,
4	primary and election expenses and election contests; creating
5	and defining membership of county boards of elections;
6	imposing duties upon the Secretary of the Commonwealth,
7	courts, county boards of elections, county commissioners;
8	imposing penalties for violation of the act, and codifying,
9	revising and consolidating the laws relating thereto; and
10	repealing certain acts and parts of acts relating to
11	elections," providing for early in-person voting in
12	elections; in voting by qualified absentee electors, further
13	providing for canvassing of official absentee ballots and
14	mail-in ballots; and, in Election Integrity Grant Program,
15	further providing for funding for elections.
16	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
17	hereby enacts as follows:
18	Section 1. The act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known
19	as the Pennsylvania Election Code, is amended by adding an
20	article to read:
21	<u>ARTICLE XII-A</u>
22	EARLY IN-PERSON VOTING IN ELECTIONS
23	Section 1201-A. Period for early in-person voting.

- 1 Notwithstanding any other provision of this act, a county
- 2 board shall provide for early in-person voting, which shall
- 3 begin 30 days prior to the date of each election established
- 4 <u>under Article VI. The early in-person voting period shall</u>
- 5 continue through the end of the day before the date of the
- 6 election established under Article VI.
- 7 <u>Section 1202-A. Polling places for early in-person voting.</u>
- 8 (a) Designation. -- A county board shall designate polling
- 9 places for early in-person voting where electors may cast
- 10 ballots during the early in-person voting period established
- 11 under section 1201-A. The polling places may include the main
- 12 office of the county board and any other site designated by the
- 13 <u>county board.</u>
- 14 (b) Equipment and staff. -- At each polling place designated
- 15 for early in-person voting, a county board shall:
- 16 (1) Make available the same equipment under Article XI
- as would be used on the day of the election.
- 18 (2) Provide the same level of staff as would be provided
- on the day of the election.
- 20 (c) Number. -- During each election:
- 21 (1) A county board in a county with a population of
- 22 500,000 or more shall establish at least four permanent
- 23 <u>polling places for early in-person voting.</u>
- 24 (2) A county board in a county with a population of
- 25 250,000 or more but less than 500,000 shall establish at
- least three permanent polling places for early in-person
- voting.
- 28 (3) A county board in a county with a population of
- 29 <u>100,000 or more but less than 250,000 shall establish at</u>
- 30 least two permanent polling places for early in-person

- 1 <u>voting.</u>
- 2 (4) A county board in a county with a population of less
- 3 than 100,000 shall establish at least one permanent polling
- 4 place for early in-person voting.
- 5 (d) Location.--
- 6 (1) The polling places designated for early in-person
- 7 <u>voting shall be geographically located to provide electors in</u>
- 8 <u>the election district an equal opportunity to cast a ballot.</u>
- 9 (2) A polling place designated for early in-person
- 10 voting within a county shall not be located within two miles
- of another polling place designated for early in-person
- 12 <u>voting within the county unless the polling place is within a</u>
- county with a population of 500,000 or more.
- 14 <u>(e) Population figures.--All population figures enumerated</u>
- 15 <u>in this section shall be determined by the most recent Federal</u>
- 16 <u>decennial census.</u>
- 17 Section 1203-A. Days and times for early in-person voting.
- 18 A county board shall designate the days and hours that
- 19 polling places designated for early in-person voting shall be
- 20 open. The polling places shall:
- 21 (1) Have uniform days and hours.
- 22 (2) Be open eight hours each weekday.
- 23 (3) Be open a minimum of an aggregate eight hours each
- 24 weekend.
- 25 (4) Not open prior to 7:00 a.m., Eastern Standard Time.
- 26 (5) Not close prior to 7:00 p.m., Eastern Standard Time.
- 27 Section 1204-A. Notice of early in-person voting.
- 28 During the week immediately preceding the commencement of
- 29 early in-person voting, a county board shall give notice of
- 30 early in-person voting by newspaper publication in the county in

- 1 accordance with the provisions of section 106. The following
- 2 apply:
- 3 (1) The notice shall be published twice in counties of
- 4 <u>the first class and once in all other counties.</u>
- 5 (2) The county board shall post the notice on the county
- 6 <u>board's publicly accessible Internet website.</u>
- 7 (3) The notice shall be made available at the main
- 8 <u>office of the county board.</u>
- 9 Section 1205-A. Notice to Secretary of the Commonwealth.
- 10 At least 10 days before the commencement of early in-person
- 11 voting, each county board shall provide the Secretary of the
- 12 Commonwealth with a list of all polling places designated for
- 13 <u>early in-person voting and the hours that each polling place</u>
- 14 will be open for early in-person voting.
- 15 Section 1206-A. Voter's certificate.
- 16 As provided under section 1203, a county board shall prepare
- 17 a suitable number of voter's certificates at each polling place
- 18 designated for early in-person voting.
- 19 Section 1207-A. Proof of identification.
- 20 An elector who appears to vote at a polling place designated
- 21 for early in-person voting shall complete a voter's certificate
- 22 and shall present to an election officer proof of identification
- 23 as provided under section 1210.
- 24 Section 1208-A. Voting check list.
- 25 A county board shall maintain a voting check list as provided
- 26 under section 1212 in a manner to ensure that each elector is
- 27 prohibited from casting an additional ballot at a polling place
- 28 designated for early in-person voting or on the day of an
- 29 <u>election at the elector's precinct.</u>
- 30 Section 1209-A. Disposition of returns.

- 1 A county board shall track votes by precinct but may not
- 2 tabulate votes prior to the close of the polls on election day.
- 3 Section 2. Section 1308(g)(1.1) of the act is amended to
- 4 read:
- 5 Section 1308. Canvassing of Official Absentee Ballots and
- 6 Mail-in Ballots.--\* \* \*
- 7 (q) \* \* \*
- 8 (1.1) The county board of elections shall meet no earlier
- 9 than [seven o'clock A.M. on] <u>fourteen (14) days before</u> election
- 10 day to pre-canvass all ballots received prior to the meeting. A
- 11 county board of elections shall provide at least forty-eight
- 12 hours' notice of a pre-canvass meeting by publicly posting a
- 13 notice of a pre-canvass meeting on its publicly accessible
- 14 Internet website. One authorized representative of each
- 15 candidate in an election and one representative from each
- 16 political party shall be permitted to remain in the room in
- 17 which the absentee ballots and mail-in ballots are pre-
- 18 canvassed. No person observing, attending or participating in a
- 19 pre-canvass meeting may disclose the results of any portion of
- 20 any pre-canvass meeting prior to the close of the polls.

- 23 2022 (P.L.1577, No.88), is amended to read:
- 24 Section 1602-A. Funding for elections.

- 26 (j) Grant agreement. -- The grant agreement between the
- 27 department and the county under this section shall include the
- 28 following requirements for counties:
- 29 [(1) The county shall begin pre-canvassing at 7 a.m. on
- 30 election day and shall continue without interruption until

- each mail-in ballot and absentee ballot received by 7 a.m. on
- 2 election day is pre-canvassed.]

- 4 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
