A JOINT RESOLUTION

1 2 3	Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, further providing for exemptions and special provisions.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby resolves as follows:
6	Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
7	Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with Article XI:
8	That section 2(c) of Article VIII be amended and the section
9	be amended by adding subsections to read:
10	§ 2. Exemptions and special provisions.

12	(c) Citizens and residents of this Commonwealth, who [served
13	in any war or armed conflict in which the United States was
14	engaged and] were honorably discharged or released under
15	honorable circumstances from active service, shall be exempt
16	from the payment of all real property taxes upon the residence
17	occupied by the said citizens and residents of this Commonwealth

imposed by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or any of its 1 2 political subdivisions if, as a result of military service, they 3 are blind, paraplegic or double or quadruple amputees or have a service-connected disability declared or rated by the United 4 States [Veterans Administration] Department of Veterans Affairs 5 or its successor to be [a total or 100% permanent disability] 6 7 100%, and if the State Veterans' Commission determines that such 8 persons are in need of the tax exemptions granted herein. This exemption shall be extended to the unmarried surviving spouse 9 10 upon the death of an eligible veteran provided that the State 11 Veterans' Commission determines that such person is in need of 12 the exemption.

13 (d) The surviving spouse of any member of the armed forces 14 of the United States who was killed in action in any war or armed conflict as determined by the United States Department of 15 16 Defense, or who died as a result of injuries received while in active service in any war or armed conflict, shall be exempt 17 18 from the payment of all real property taxes on the surviving 19 spouse's primary place of residence imposed by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or any of its political subdivisions if the 20 21 State Veterans Commission determines that such person is in need of the exemption. There shall be no restriction on a surviving_ 22 23 spouse who is eligible for an exemption under this subsection if 24 the surviving spouse relocated to another primary place of residence or the surviving spouse resides outside of this 25 26 Commonwealth at the time of death of the member of the armed forces of the United States. The exemption under this subsection_ 27 28 shall cease if the surviving spouse remarries and shall not be 29 claimed thereafter. (e) After an exemption has been approved under subsection 30

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(c) or (d), the amount of real property taxes due for the 1 applicable tax year shall be prorated from the date the 2 application for the exemption is received by the assessment 3 office of the county in which the exemption is sought. If a 4 claimant has submitted payment for any real estate tax liability 5 for the year in which an exemption has been awarded, the 6 claimant shall be awarded a refund for an amount equal to the 7 8 real estate tax liability paid minus the determined prorated 9 amount.

10 Section 2. The addition of section 2(d) of Article VIII of the Constitution of Pennsylvania shall apply to the surviving 11 spouse of any member of the armed forces of the United States 12 13 who, on or after the ratification of this proposed 14 constitutional amendment by the qualified electors of this 15 Commonwealth, was killed in action in any war or armed conflict 16 as determined by the United States Department of Defense or died as a result of injuries received while in active service in any 17 war or armed conflict. 18

Section 3. The following procedure applies to the proposed constitutional amendment in this joint resolution:

(1) Upon the first passage by the General Assembly of
the amendment, the Secretary of the Commonwealth shall
proceed immediately to comply with the advertising
requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the Constitution
of Pennsylvania.

(2) Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of
the amendment, the Secretary of the Commonwealth shall
proceed immediately to comply with the advertising
requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the Constitution
of Pennsylvania. The Secretary of the Commonwealth shall

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1	submit the amendment to the qualified electors of this
2	Commonwealth at the first primary, general or municipal
3	election which meets the requirements of section 1 of Article
4	XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania.
