Section 913(e) and the definition of "court facility" in subsection (f) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania 8 Consolidated Statutes are amended to read: 10 § 913. Possession of firearm or other dangerous weapon in court 11 facility. * * * 12 13 [Facilities for checking firearms or other dangerous 14 weapons .-- Each county shall make available at or within the 15 building containing a court facility by July 1, 2002, lockers or 16 similar facilities at no charge or cost for the temporary

checking of firearms by persons carrying firearms under section

6106(b) or 6109 or for the checking of other dangerous weapons

- 6 (f) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 7 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this

- 9 "Court facility." The courtroom of a court of record; a
- 10 courtroom of a community court; the courtroom of a magisterial
- 11 district judge; a courtroom of the Philadelphia Municipal Court;
- 12 a courtroom of the Pittsburgh Magistrates Court; a courtroom of
- 13 the Traffic Court of Philadelphia; judge's chambers; witness
- 14 rooms; jury deliberation rooms; attorney conference rooms;
- 15 prisoner holding cells; offices of court clerks, the district
- 16 attorney, the sheriff and probation and parole officers; and any
- 17 <u>lobbies or adjoining corridors.</u>

- 19 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
