AN ACT

1 2 3 4	Designating a bridge, identified as Bridge Key 52767, carrying West High Street (State Route 4031), crossing the Ghost Town Trail, located in Ebensburg Borough, Cambria County, as the Corpsman Charles Doerr, United States Navy, Memorial Bridge.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Corpsman Charles Doerr, United States Navy, Memorial
8	Bridge.
9	(a) FindingsThe General Assembly finds and declares as
10	follows:
11	(1) Corpsman Charles (Chuck) William Doerr was born in
12	Ebensburg on June 24, 1930.
13	(2) Corpsman Doerr attended Ebensburg-Cambria High
14	School where he played football and basketball and ran track.
15	(3) Prior to departing for Korea, Corpsman Doerr was
16	notified by the Captain of his ship that he had received a
17	football scholarship from UCLA set to begin at the conclusion
18	of his tour of duty.
19	(4) Corpsman Doerr was Vice President of his class in

his junior year and also President and Secretary of his
 homeroom.

3 (5) After graduating high school in 1949, Corpsman Doerr
4 was employed for one year before enlisting in the United
5 States Navy.

6 (6) In 1950, Corpsman Doerr married Sally Ball and they7 had one son, Charles Robert Doerr.

8 (7) Corpsman Doerr enlisted in the military in September 9 1950 and completed boot camp at Great Lakes, Illinois, later 10 serving at Pensacola, Florida, and Bainbridge, Maryland.

(8) Corpsman Doerr received his 3rd class rating on October 3 and was scheduled for a rest leave when the communist push canceled all leaves.

14 (9) Corpsman Doerr served as a Hospital Corpsman with
15 the Fleet Marines, assigned to the First Marine Division in
16 Korea.

(10) Corpsman Doerr was killed in action on Bunker Hill while volunteering to accompany a rifle squad on a mission to reinforce a mortar and artillery barrage.

20 (11) Corpsman Doerr administered first aid to the21 numerous casualties struck down by the initial burst of fire.

(12) At the time of his death, Corpsman Doerr's brother,
Christian, was serving in the United States Navy 70 miles
from where Corpsman Doerr was killed.

(13) Corpsman Doerr's twin brother, Robert, was
stationed with the United States Army in Yokohama, Japan, and
shipped out of the state of Washington the day Corpsman Doerr
was killed.

(14) Corpsman Doerr was posthumously awarded the Silver
Star and Purple Heart medals, the Combat Action Ribbon, the

1 Korean Service Medal, the United Nations Service Medal, The 2 National Defense Service Medal, The Korean Presidential Unit Citation and the Republic of Korea War Service Medal. 3 Designation.--The bridge, identified as Bridge Key 4 (b) 52767, carrying West High Street (State Route 4031), crossing 5 the Ghost Town Trail, located in Ebensburg Borough, Cambria 6 County, is designated as the Corpsman Charles Doerr, United 7 8 States Navy, Memorial Bridge.

9 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and 10 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to 11 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

12 Section 2. Effective date.

13 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
