A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of November 2023 as "Ukrainian Holodomor-Genocide Remembrance Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Ninety years ago, Soviet leader Joseph Stalin and
- 4 his totalitarian regime committed an act of genocide through the
- 5 implementation of an engineered famine, confiscating all
- 6 foodstuffs from the Ukrainian people resulting in the deaths of
- 7 7 to 10 million innocent men, women and children; and
- 8 WHEREAS, This genocide, Holodomor, meaning "murder by
- 9 starvation," was specifically designed by the Soviet regime to
- 10 punish independent-minded Ukrainians for their resistance to
- 11 Stalin's political, economic, cultural and social subjugation;
- 12 and
- 13 WHEREAS, Even as the Soviets continued to export Ukraine's
- 14 grain to the rest of the world, Ukrainian farmers, who tended to
- 15 the farms in the breadbasket of Europe, were purposefully
- 16 starved in a slow and painful death; and
- 17 WHEREAS, At the height of the Holodomor in 1933, Ukrainians

- 1 died at the rate of 25,000 per day with nearly a third of the
- 2 victims being children under 10 years of age; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Hundreds of archival KGB documents created during
- 4 this genocide detailed and described the Soviet regime's
- 5 intention and actions to destroy Ukraine's national identity by
- 6 deporting and executing Ukraine's religious, intellectual and
- 7 cultural leaders and prosecuting or executing others who dared
- 8 to speak of the Holodomor; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Through a recently released major motion film
- 10 entitled "Mr. Jones," depicting Welsh journalist Gareth Jones
- 11 who witnessed and reported on the Holodomor, the world is
- 12 afforded an opportunity to understand the realities of the
- 13 Soviet crime; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The official recognition of the Holodomor as a
- 15 genocide by the government of Ukraine represents a significant
- 16 step in adjudicating Soviet crimes, reaffirming Ukraine's
- 17 national identity and advancing efforts to establish a
- 18 democratic and free Ukraine that is fully integrated into the
- 19 western community of nations; and
- 20 WHEREAS, The current war in Ukraine has been identified as a
- 21 genocide and is yet another example of relentless Russian
- 22 aggression attempting to suppress a freedom-loving nation and
- 23 its social, cultural, historical, economic and national
- 24 development; and
- 25 WHEREAS, In relating the historical context of the 1932-1933
- 26 Holodomor and the current war in Ukraine, the poignant theme as
- 27 we approach the upcoming 90th anniversary commemoration of the
- 28 Holodomor remains profound and significant: "Holodomor Then,
- 29 Genocide Now, Justice When?"; therefore be it
- 30 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of November

- 1 2023 as "Ukrainian Holodomor-Genocide Remembrance Month" in
- 2 Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 3 RESOLVED, That the Senate urge all individuals, groups,
- 4 organizations and institutions to remember the Holodomor with
- 5 appropriate activities designed to honor its victims and educate
- 6 the world about this tragic episode in the world's history; and
- 7 be it further
- 8 RESOLVED, That the Senate encourage the citizens of the
- 9 Commonwealth to reflect, throughout this 90th anniversary year,
- 10 upon the historical truth of the heinous crimes of totalitarian
- 11 regimes and recommit to the elimination of tyranny from our
- 12 world.
