AN ACT

- Amending the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220, No.39), entitled "An 1 act licensing and regulating the practice of social work; 2 providing penalties; and making an appropriation," further 3 providing for definitions, for license required, for State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and 5 Professional Counselors, for powers and functions of board, for qualifications for license, for procedures for licensing, 7 for reciprocity and for reinstatement of license; providing 8 for restrictions on use of title "Licensed Associate Marriage and Family Therapist"; and further providing for penalties, 10 for license renewal and records and fees and for unlawful 11 practice. 12
- 13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 14 hereby enacts as follows:
- 15 Section 1. Section 3 of the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220,
- 16 No.39), known as the Social Workers, Marriage and Family
- Therapists and Professional Counselors Act, is amended by adding 17
- 18 definitions to read:
- 19 Section 3. Definitions.
- 20 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 21
- context clearly indicates otherwise: 22

- 1 * * *
- 2 "Licensed associate marriage and family therapist." An
- 3 <u>individual licensed as an associate marriage and family</u>
- 4 therapist under this act who is obtaining experience under
- 5 professional direct supervision for the purpose of becoming
- 6 <u>licensed as a marriage and family therapist.</u>
- 7 * * *
- 8 <u>"Practice of associate marriage and family therapy." The</u>
- 9 professional application of psychotherapeutic and family systems
- 10 theories and techniques to the evaluation, assessment, diagnosis
- 11 and treatment of mental and emotional disorders, whether
- 12 cognitive, affective or behavioral, while under direct clinical
- 13 <u>supervision of a licensed supervisor approved by the American</u>
- 14 Association of Marriage and Family Therapy. The term includes
- 15 the evaluation and assessment of mental and emotional disorders
- 16 in the context of significant interpersonal relationships and
- 17 the delivery of psychotherapeutic services to individuals,
- 18 couples and families.
- 19 * * *
- Section 2. Sections 4, 5(1) and 6(2) and (3) of the act are
- 21 amended to read:
- 22 Section 4. License required.
- 23 It shall be unlawful for any person to hold himself or
- 24 herself forth as a licensed bachelor social worker, licensed
- 25 social worker, licensed clinical social worker, <u>licensed</u>
- 26 associate marriage and family therapist, licensed marriage and
- 27 family therapist or licensed professional counselor unless he or
- 28 she shall first have obtained a license pursuant to this act.
- 29 Section 5. State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family
- 30 Therapists and Professional Counselors.

- 2 (1) Operating procedures. -- The board shall meet within 30
- 3 days after the appointment of its new members and set up
- 4 operating procedures and develop application forms for licensing
- 5 clinical social workers, associate marriage and family
- 6 therapists, marriage and family therapists and professional
- 7 counselors. It shall be the responsibility of the board to
- 8 circulate these forms and educate the public to the requirements
- 9 of licensing in order to hold oneself out as a licensed bachelor
- 10 social worker, licensed social worker, licensed clinical social
- 11 worker, <u>licensed associate marriage and family therapist</u>,
- 12 licensed marriage and family therapist or licensed professional
- 13 counselor within the Commonwealth.
- 14 Section 6. Powers and functions of board.
- 15 The board shall have the following powers:
- 16 * * *
- 17 (2) To adopt and, from time to time, revise such rules
 18 and regulations as may be necessary to carry into effect the
 19 provisions of this act. Such regulations may include, but
 20 shall not be limited to, standards of professional practice
 21 and conduct for licensed bachelor social workers, licensed
 22 social workers, licensed clinical social workers, licensed
- 23 <u>associate marriage and family therapists</u>, licensed marriage
- and family therapists and licensed professional counselors in
- 25 Pennsylvania.
- 26 (3) To examine for, deny, approve, issue, revoke,
- suspend or renew licenses of bachelor social workers, social
- 28 workers, clinical social workers, <u>associate marriage and</u>
- 29 <u>family therapists</u>, marriage and family therapists and
- 30 professional counselors pursuant to this act and to conduct

- 1 hearings in connection therewith.
- 2 * * *
- 3 Section 3. Section 7 of the act is amended by adding
- 4 subsections to read:
- 5 Section 7. Qualifications for license.
- 6 * * *
- 7 (e.1) Associate marriage and family therapist license.--An
- 8 applicant shall be qualified for a license to hold oneself out
- 9 <u>as a licensed associate marriage and family therapist if the</u>
- 10 applicant submits:
- 11 (1) Proof that the applicant is at least 21 years of
- 12 <u>age.</u>
- 13 (2) Proof that the applicant is of good moral character.
- 14 (3) Proof that the applicant has satisfied the
- educational requirements under subsection (e) (2).
- 16 (4) A clinical marriage and family therapy plan of
- 17 supervision, which shall include a detailed job description
- and the location or locations where client contact and
- 19 supervision will occur.
- 20 (5) The supervisor's resume or curriculum vitae, which
- 21 <u>shall document that the supervisor has no less than five</u>
- full-time years of professional marriage and family therapy
- 23 <u>practice experience or the equivalent and holds a current and</u>
- 24 active license to practice as a marriage and family
- 25 <u>therapist</u>.
- 26 (6) An application accompanied by the application fee.
- 27 (7) Proof that the applicant has not been convicted of a
- felony under The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and
- 29 Cosmetic Act, or of an offense under the laws of another
- jurisdiction, which, if committed in this Commonwealth, would

1	be a felony under The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and
2	Cosmetic Act, unless:
3	(i) at least 10 years have elapsed from the date of
4	<pre>conviction;</pre>
5	(ii) the applicant satisfactorily demonstrates to
6	the board that the applicant has made significant
7	progress in personal rehabilitation since the conviction,
8	such that licensure of the applicant should not be
9	expected to create a substantial risk of harm to the
10	health and safety of the applicant's clients or the
11	public or a substantial risk of further criminal
12	violations; and
13	(iii) the applicant otherwise satisfies the
14	qualifications contained in or authorized by this act. As
15	used in this paragraph, the term "convicted" shall
16	include a judgment, an admission of guilt or a plea of
17	<pre>nolo contendere.</pre>
18	(e.2) Expiration of associate marriage and family therapist
19	license An associate marriage and family therapist license
20	shall expire six years after issuance and shall permanently
21	expire 30 days after completion of the required clinical
22	supervised hours under subsection (e)(2). The board may renew an
23	associate marriage and family therapist license for no more than
24	two years under extenuating circumstances or for good cause
25	shown.
26	(e.3) Limitations on associate marriage and family therapist
27	license A licensed associate marriage and family therapist
28	shall work under the supervision of a licensed marriage and
29	family therapist who holds a clinical supervisor license to
30	supervise and direct the activities of the licensed associate

- 1 marriage and family therapist. Licensed associate marriage and
- 2 <u>family therapists may not practice in a private setting without</u>
- 3 the direct supervision of a licensed marriage and family
- 4 therapist clinical supervisor. Nothing in this section shall be
- 5 construed to prohibit a licensed associate marriage and family
- 6 therapist to take the National Association of Marriage and
- 7 Family Therapy Regulatory Boards Exam during the time between
- 8 graduation and completing the required clinical supervised hours
- 9 <u>under subsection (e)(2) in order to meet licensure requirements.</u>

- 11 Section 4. Sections 8(b), 10(a) and 12 of the act are
- 12 amended to read:
- 13 Section 8. Procedures for licensing.
- 14 * * *
- 15 (b) Issuance of license. -- The board shall issue to each
- 16 person who meets the licensure requirements of this act a
- 17 certificate setting forth that such person is licensed to hold
- 18 himself or herself out as a licensed bachelor social worker, a
- 19 licensed social worker, a licensed clinical social worker, a_
- 20 <u>licensed associate marriage and family therapist</u>, a licensed
- 21 marriage and family therapist or a licensed professional
- 22 counselor.
- 23 Section 10. Reciprocity.
- 24 (a) General rule. -- The board shall have the power to grant a
- 25 reciprocal license to an applicant who is licensed or certified
- 26 as a bachelor social worker, social worker, clinical social
- 27 worker, associate marriage and family therapist, marriage and
- 28 family therapist or professional counselor in another state and
- 29 has demonstrated qualifications which equal or exceed those
- 30 required pursuant to this act in the determination of the board,

- 1 provided that no license shall be granted under this section to
- 2 an applicant unless the state in which the applicant is licensed
- 3 affords reciprocal treatment to persons who are residents of
- 4 this Commonwealth and who are licensed pursuant to this act.
- 5 * * *
- 6 Section 12. Reinstatement of license.
- 7 Unless ordered to do so by Commonwealth Court or an appeal
- 8 therefrom, the board shall not reinstate the license of a person
- 9 to practice as a bachelor social worker, social worker, clinical
- 10 social worker, associate marriage and family therapist, marriage
- 11 and family therapist or professional counselor pursuant to this
- 12 act, which has been revoked. Any person whose license has been
- 13 revoked may apply for reinstatement, after a period of at least
- 14 five years, but must meet all of the licensing qualifications of
- 15 this act, including the examination requirement, if he or she
- 16 desires to practice as a bachelor social worker, social worker,
- 17 clinical social worker, marriage and family therapist or
- 18 professional counselor pursuant to this act at any time after
- 19 such revocation.
- 20 Section 5. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 21 Section 16.5. Restrictions on use of title "Licensed Associate"
- 22 <u>Marriage and Family Therapist."</u>
- 23 Only individuals who have received licenses as licensed
- 24 associate marriage and family therapists under this act may
- 25 style themselves as licensed associate marriage and family
- 26 therapists and use the letters "L.A.M.F.T." in connection with
- 27 their names, and it shall be unlawful for an individual to style
- 28 <u>himself or herself as a licensed associate marriage and family</u>
- 29 therapist or use any words or symbols indicating or tending to
- 30 indicate that the individual is a licensed associate marriage

- 1 and family therapist without holding a license in good standing
- 2 under this act.
- 3 Section 6. Sections 17(b), 18(b) and 20(a) of the act are
- 4 amended to read:
- 5 Section 17. Penalties.
- 6 * * *
- 7 (b) Civil penalty. -- In addition to any other civil remedy or
- 8 criminal penalty provided for in this act, the board, by a vote
- 9 of the majority of the maximum number of the authorized
- 10 membership of the board as provided by law, or by a vote of the
- 11 majority of the duly qualified and confirmed membership or a
- 12 minimum of three members, whichever is greater, may levy a civil
- 13 penalty of up to \$10,000 on any current licensee who violates
- 14 any provision of this act, on any person who engages in the
- 15 independent practice of clinical social work, the independent
- 16 practice of marriage and family therapy or the independent
- 17 practice of professional counseling without being licensed
- 18 pursuant to this act or on any person who holds himself or
- 19 herself out as a licensed bachelor social worker, licensed
- 20 social worker, licensed clinical social worker, <u>licensed</u>
- 21 <u>associate marriage and family therapist</u> licensed marriage and
- 22 family therapist, licensed professional counselor or marriage
- 23 and family therapist without being so licensed pursuant to this
- 24 act. The board shall levy this penalty only after affording the
- 25 accused party the opportunity for a hearing, as provided in
- 26 Title 2 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes (relating to
- 27 administrative law and procedure).

- 29 Section 18. License renewal; records and fees.
- 30 * * *

- 1 (b) Records.--A record of all persons licensed to practice
- 2 as bachelor social workers, social workers, clinical social
- 3 workers, associate marriage and family therapists, marriage and
- 4 family therapists and professional counselors in Pennsylvania
- 5 shall be kept in the office of the board and shall be open to
- 6 public inspection and copying upon payment of a nominal fee for
- 7 copying the record.
- 8 * * *
- 9 Section 20. Unlawful practice.
- 10 (a) Unlawful practice prohibited.--It shall be unlawful for
- 11 any person to engage in the independent practice of clinical
- 12 social work, the independent practice of marriage and family
- 13 therapy or the independent practice of professional counseling
- 14 or hold himself or herself out as a licensed bachelor social
- 15 worker, licensed social worker, licensed clinical social worker,
- 16 <u>licensed associate marriage and family therapist</u>, marriage and
- 17 family therapist and professional counselor without possessing a
- 18 valid, unexpired, unrevoked and unsuspended license issued under
- 19 this act.

- 21 Section 7. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
