## AN ACT

Amending Title 34 (Game) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 1 Statutes, in hunting and furtaking, further providing for the 2 offense of trespass on private property while hunting. 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 4 5 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 2314(a), (b) and (c) of Title 34 of the 6 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read: Trespass on private property while hunting. 8 General rule. -- A person, while engaged in hunting or 9 10 furtaking, commits an offense if, knowing that the person is not 11 licensed or privileged to do so, the person or a dog used by the person for hunting or furtaking: 12 13 enters or remains on any land of another without (1)14 authorization to do so, when the land is posted in a manner 15 prescribed by law or reasonably likely to come to the 16 person's attention [or is fenced or enclosed in a manner 17 manifestly designed to exclude trespassers; or]; 18 enters or remains on any land of another without

authorization and defies an order not to enter or to leave

that has been personally communicated to the person by the

owner of the land or other authorized person[.];

(3) enters or remains on any land of another without authorization to do so, when the land is fenced or enclosed in a manner manifestly designed to exclude trespassers; or

- (4) subject to subsection (b), enters or remains on any land of another without authorization to do so when notice against trespass is given by the placement of identifying purple paint marks on trees or posts on the property, which are:
- 11 (i) vertical lines of not less than eight inches in

  12 length and not less than one inch in width;
- (ii) placed in a manner so that the bottom of the
  mark is not less than three feet from the ground and not
  more than five feet from the ground; and
- (iii) placed at locations that are readily visible
  to a person approaching the property and no more than 100
  feet apart.
- 19 (b) Applicability.--[This section shall not apply to an 20 unarmed person who enters onto posted property for the sole
- 21 purpose of retrieving a hunting dog.] <u>Subsection (a)(4) shall</u>
- 22 not apply in a county of the first class or a county of the
- 23 second class.

- 24 (c) Penalty.--An offense under this section shall be graded 25 as follows:
- 26 (1) A person who violates subsection (a) (1), (3) or (4)

  27 commits a summary offense of the [third degree.] second
- 28 <u>degree and may result in forfeiture of the privilege to hunt</u>
- or take game or wildlife anywhere within this Commonwealth
- for a period of up to one year.

- 1 (2) A person who violates subsection (a) (2) commits a
  2 misdemeanor[.] and shall result in forfeiture of the
  3 privilege to hunt or take game or wildlife anywhere within
  4 this Commonwealth for a period of three years.
- 5 (3) A person who commits a second or subsequent
  6 violation of this section within a seven-year period commits
  7 a misdemeanor, and the second or subsequent violation shall
  8 result in forfeiture of the privilege to hunt or take game or
  9 wildlife anywhere within this Commonwealth for a period of
  10 [one year] <u>five years</u>.

- 12 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
