AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 30 (Fish) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 2 Statutes, providing for at-risk, derelict and abandoned
- boats; and imposing penalties.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 30 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

- 1 § 5701. Scope of chapter.
- 2 This chapter relates to at-risk boats, derelict boats and
- 3 abandoned boats.
- 4 § 5702. Definitions.
- 5 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 6 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 7 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 8 <u>"Abandoned boat." A boat that is presumed to be abandoned</u>
- 9 <u>under section 5703 (relating to abandoned boats).</u>
- 10 "At-risk boat." As follows:
- 11 (1) A boat that is at risk of becoming a derelict boat.
- 12 (2) The term may involve any of the following
- 13 <u>circumstances:</u>
- 14 <u>(i) The boat is taking on or has taken on water</u>
- 15 <u>without an effective means to dewater.</u>
- 16 <u>(ii) Spaces on the boat that are designed to be</u>
- 17 enclosed are incapable of being sealed off or remain open
- to the elements for extended periods of time.
- 19 (iii) The boat has broken loose or is in danger of
- 20 breaking loose from its anchor.
- 21 <u>(iv) The boat does not have an effective means of</u>
- 22 propulsion for safe navigation.
- 23 "Derelict boat." A boat that is on the waters of this
- 24 Commonwealth or other public property and may involve any of the
- 25 following circumstances:
- 26 (1) The boat is sunk or partially sunk.
- 27 (2) The boat is aground without the ability to extricate
- itself absent mechanical assistance.
- 29 (3) The boat remains on waters of this Commonwealth or
- 30 other public property after a boating accident, fire or

1	weather event.	
2	(4) The boat is in a neglected or deteriorating	
3	condition such that the boat's hull, steering or propulsion	
4	systems are compromised due to missing, incomplete, damaged,	
5	broken or inoperable components.	
6	"Law enforcement agency." An agency that employs a law	
7	enforcement officer.	
8	"Law enforcement officer." As follows:	
9	(1) An individual who, by virtue of the individual's	
10	office or public employment, is vested by law with a duty to	
11	maintain public order or make arrests for offenses, whether	
12	that duty extends to all offenses or is limited to specific	
13	offenses.	
14	(2) The term includes an individual who is employed or	
15	elected by the Commonwealth or a municipality and whose duty	
16	it is to preserve the peace, make arrests or enforce the laws	_
17	of this Commonwealth.	
18	"Municipality." A county, city, borough, incorporated town	
19	or township of this Commonwealth.	
20	§ 5703. Abandoned boats.	
21	(a) Presumption Subject to subsection (b), a boat is	
22	presumed to be abandoned under any of the following	<
23	circumstances: IF THE OWNER OF THE BOAT CANNOT BE CONTACTED AND	<
24	THE BOAT:	
25	(1) The boat is physically inoperable and is left	<
26	unattended on waters of this Commonwealth or other public	
27	property-;	<
28	(2) The boat has remained illegally on waters of this	<
29	Commonwealth or other public property-;	<
30	(3) The boat is left unattended on or along waters of	<

1	this Commonwealth or other public property and does not bear	
2	a valid registration-; OR	<-
3	(4) The boat has remained on the private property of a	<-
4	salvor for 20 30 CALENDAR days.	<-
5	(b) Rebutting presumption The presumption under subsection	_
6	(a) is rebuttable by a preponderance of the evidence.	
7	§ 5704. Investigations, notice and related actions.	
8	(a) Authorization A municipality or law enforcement agency	_
9	may investigate at-risk boats, derelict boats and abandoned	
10	boats within the jurisdiction of the municipality or law	
11	enforcement agency, in collaboration with the commission.	
12	(b) Notice to commission If an investigation under	
13	subsection (a) uncovers an at-risk boat, derelict boat or	
14	abandoned boat, the municipality or law enforcement agency	
15	shall, within five SEVEN CALENDAR days of the discovery of the	<-
16	at-risk boat, derelict boat or abandoned boat, notify the	
17	commission in writing of the following:	<-
18	(1) The name and contact information of the municipality	-
19	or law enforcement agency that made the discovery.	
20	(2) The location of the at-risk boat, derelict boat or	
21	abandoned boat.	
22	(3) The condition of the at-risk boat, derelict boat or	
23	abandoned boat.	
24	(4) Identifying information regarding the at-risk boat,	
25	derelict boat or abandoned boat, including registration,	
26	license, capacity plate and name of the owner, if known.	
27	(c) Notice to owner	
28	(1) Following notification under subsection (b), the	
29	municipality or law enforcement agency shall, in	
30	collaboration with the commission, make reasonable efforts to	_

1	notify the owner by certified mail, return receipt requested,
2	IN PERSON OR BY VERIFIABLE ELECTRONIC MEANS, SUCH AS PUBLICLY <
3	ACCESSIBLE DIGITAL MEDIA, of the at-risk boat, derelict boat
4	or abandoned boat.
5	(2) Notice under this subsection shall contain the
6	<pre>following:</pre>
7	(i) Identification of the at-risk boat, derelict
8	boat or abandoned boat that must be removed from its
9	current location, repaired, salvaged, securely stored or
10	junked.
11	(ii) The location and condition of the at-risk boat,
12	derelict boat or abandoned boat.
13	(iii) The name and contact information of the
14	municipality or law enforcement agency that is providing
15	the notice.
16	(iv) Contact information for the commission.
17	(v) A statement that if, within 10 14 CALENDAR days <
18	after receipt of the notice under this subsection, the
19	at-risk boat, derelict boat or abandoned boat is not
20	removed from its current location, repaired, salvaged,
21	securely stored or junked, or alternate arrangements are
22	not made with the municipality, law enforcement agency or
23	<pre>commission:</pre>
24	(A) The at-risk boat, derelict boat or abandoned
25	boat shall be removed and, as appropriate, stored or
26	junked at the expense of the owner of the at-risk
27	boat, derelict boat or abandoned boat.
28	(B) The owner of the at-risk boat, derelict boat
29	or abandoned boat shall be subject to a fine <
30	RESTITUTION COSTS and any other penalty prescribed by <

1	<u>law.</u>
2	(d) Public notice If notice under subsection (c) cannot be
3	accomplished, the municipality or law enforcement agency shall,
4	in collaboration with the commission, take steps to publish the
5	notice described in subsection (c) in a newspaper of general
6	circulation OR BY VERIFIABLE ELECTRONIC MEANS, SUCH AS PUBLICLY <
7	ACCESSIBLE DIGITAL MEDIA, within the municipality or
8	jurisdiction of the law enforcement agency that provided the
9	notice under subsection (c), except that the statement under
10	subsection (c)(2)(v) shall refer to a time frame that is 10 14
11	CALENDAR days after publication of the notice under this
12	subsection.
13	(e) Actions by owner
14	(1) Within 10 14 CALENDAR days of receipt of the notice <
15	under subsection (c) or of publication of the notice under
16	subsection (d), the owner of the at-risk boat, derelict boat
17	or abandoned boat shall:
18	(i) remove, repair, salvage, securely store or junk
19	the at-risk boat, derelict boat or abandoned boat, as
20	appropriate; or
21	(ii) make alternate arrangements with the
22	municipality, law enforcement agency or commission, which
23	may include the relinquishment of the at-risk boat,
24	derelict boat or abandoned boat to the custody of the
25	municipality, law enforcement agency or commission.
26	(2) In the case of an at-risk boat, the owner of the at-
27	risk boat that is removed and stored after the time period
28	specified in the notice under subsection (c) or (d):
29	(i) May, subject to State EXISTING law, including a <
30	rule or regulation established by the commission, claim

Τ	the at-risk boat upon paying the accided costs of removar	
2	and storage of the at-risk boat and any applicable fine	
3	regarding the at-risk boat. WITHIN 30 CALENDAR DAYS OF <	
4	THE ORIGINAL NOTICE UNDER SUBSECTION (B).	
5	(ii) Commits a misdemeanor of the third degree IF <	
6	RECOVERY AND DISPOSAL COSTS EXCEED \$2,500 AND THE OWNER	
7	WAS PROPERLY NOTIFIED OTHERWISE THAT THE PENALTY WOULD BE	
8	A SUMMARY OFFENSE OF THE FIRST DEGREE and shall, upon	
9	conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than <	
10	\$5,000. AND RESTITUTION COSTS OF THE RECOVERING ENTITY.	
11	(3) In the case of a derelict boat or abandoned boat,	
12	after the time period specified in the notice under	
13	subsection (c) or (d):	
14	(i) The owner of the derelict boat or abandoned boat	
15	shall have no right to claim the derelict boat or	
16	abandoned boat- AFTER 30 CALENDAR DAYS FOLLOWING THE <	
17	ORIGINAL NOTICE UNDER SUBSECTION (B).	
18	(ii) The owner of the derelict boat or abandoned	
19	boat shall be responsible for the expenses to remove or	
20	junk the derelict boat or abandoned boat.	
21	(iii) The owner of the derelict boat or abandoned	
22	<pre>boat commits a misdemeanor of the third degree IF</pre>	:
23	RECOVERY AND DISPOSAL COSTS EXCEED \$2,500 AND THE OWNER	
24	WAS PROPERLY NOTIFIED OTHERWISE THAT THE PENALTY WOULD BE	
25	A SUMMARY OFFENSE OF THE FIRST DEGREE and shall, upon	
26	conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than	
27	\$5,000. AND RESTITUTION COSTS OF THE RECOVERING ENTITY.	:
28	(f) Recovery of costs A municipality, a law enforcement	
29	agency or the commission may commence an action to recover the	
30	costs incurred by the municipality, law enforcement agency or	

- 1 commission regarding:
- 2 (1) the removal or storage of an at-risk boat; or
- 3 (2) the removal or junking of a derelict boat or
- 4 abandoned boat.
- 5 (G) LIABILITY. -- A PERSON INVOLVED IN THE NOTIFICATION,
- 6 INVESTIGATION, RECOVERY OR STORAGE OF A BOAT UNDER THIS CHAPTER
- 7 SHALL NOT BE LIABLE FOR ANY CLAIM OF PROPERTY DAMAGE RELATED TO
- 8 THE BOAT.
- 9 § 5705. Forms.
- 10 (a) Development. -- The commission shall develop forms to be
- 11 <u>used by municipalities and law enforcement agencies to provide</u>
- 12 <u>notice in accordance with section 5704(b) and (c) (relating to</u>
- 13 <u>investigations</u>, notice and related actions).
- 14 (b) Posting. -- The forms described under subsection (a) shall
- 15 be posted on the publicly accessible Internet website of the
- 16 commission.
- 17 (c) Submittal. -- A municipality or law enforcement agency may
- 18 submit the notice described under section 5704(b) to the
- 19 commission by electronic means or as otherwise provided by the
- 20 commission.
- 21 § 5706. Nuisances.
- This chapter is not intended to alter or supersede any law or
- 23 ordinance regarding the investigation, removal, abatement or
- 24 prevention of nuisances under the jurisdiction of the State or a
- 25 <u>municipality or any available enforcement mechanism, remedy or</u>
- 26 penalty relating to nuisances under State law or municipal
- 27 ordinance.
- 28 § 5707. Rules and regulations.
- 29 The commission may adopt or promulgate rules or regulations
- 30 relating to at-risk boats, derelict boats or abandoned boats,

- 1 <u>including the transfer of ownership of or interest in at-risk</u>
- 2 boats, derelict boats or abandoned boats.
- 3 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 180 days.
