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AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in student supports, further providing for definitions and for student supports and 6 providing for the Pennsylvania Mental Health First Aid 7 Training Program; and, in school safety and security, further 8 providing for the School Safety and Security Grant Program. 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 11 12 Section 1. Section 1301-A of the act of March 10, 1949 13 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is 14 amended by adding definitions to read: 15 Section 1301-A. Definitions. -- As used in this article, * * * 16 17 "Department" shall mean the Department of Education of the 18 Commonwealth. 19 "Nonpublic school" shall mean any school, other than a public 20 school within this Commonwealth, wherein a resident of this Commonwealth may legally fulfill the compulsory school

- 1 attendance requirements of this act and which meets the
- 2 requirements of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (Public
- 3 Law 88-352, 78 Stat. 241).
- 4 * * *
- 5 "School-wide staff" shall mean any individual within the
- 6 control of, or acting on behalf of, the district, including:
- 7 (1) district employes;
- 8 (2) after-school providers;
- 9 <u>(3) contractors;</u>
- 10 (4) consultants;
- 11 (5) volunteers;
- 12 (6) vendors;
- 13 (7) school security personnel;
- 14 (8) school resource officers as defined in section 1301-C;
- 15 and
- 16 <u>(9) service providers.</u>
- 17 * * *
- 18 Section 2. Section 1302-A(b)(3) of the act is amended and
- 19 subsection (b)(1) is amended by adding a subparagraph to read:
- 20 Section 1302-A. Student Supports.--* * *
- 21 (b) The Department of Education shall have the power and
- 22 duty to implement the following:
- 23 (1) To collect, develop and disseminate information,
- 24 policies, strategies and other information to assist in the
- 25 development of programs that support students, reduce
- 26 unnecessary student disciplinary actions and promote an
- 27 environment of greater productivity, safety and learning,
- 28 including, but not limited to:
- 29 * * *
- 30 (viii.1) School-wide staff training programs conducted by a

- 1 <u>certified trainer to recognize and respond appropriately to</u>
- 2 indicators of mental distress and suicidal ideation in students.
- 3 The training program shall be offered to school entities and
- 4 <u>nonpublic schools no less than two times throughout a school</u>
- 5 year. No fee may be assessed for participation in the training
- 6 program implemented under this subparagraph.
- 7 * * *
- 8 (3) To assist in collaboration and coordination with the
- 9 School Safety and Security Committee established under section
- 10 1302-B and school entities and nonpublic schools on the
- 11 development of policies to be used regarding:
- 12 <u>(i)</u> possession of weapons by any person, acts of violence
- 13 and protocols for coordination with and reporting to law
- 14 enforcement officials and the Department of Education[.]; and
- 15 <u>(ii)</u> training programs implemented under paragraph (1)
- 16 (viii.1) for school-wide staff. The policies developed under
- 17 this subparagraph shall include, at a minimum, the policy
- 18 requirements for the Pennsylvania Mental Health First Aid
- 19 Training Program established under section 1303.2-A(a). A school
- 20 entity or nonpublic school shall not be required to provide a
- 21 training program or to adopt related policies if the school
- 22 entity or nonpublic school does not provide school-wide staff
- 23 training.

- 25 Section 3. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 26 <u>Section 1303.2-A. Pennsylvania Mental Health First Aid</u>
- 27 Training Program. -- (a) The Pennsylvania Mental Health First Aid
- 28 Training Program is established for the purpose of providing
- 29 <u>student supports and quidance to school entities and nonpublic</u>
- 30 <u>schools in identifying student mental health struggles and</u>

- 1 <u>deterioration in accordance with this section.</u>
- 2 (b) (1) A school entity or nonpublic school is not required
- 3 to offer student supports that include staff participation in a
- 4 school-wide staff training program. For a school entity or
- 5 nonpublic school that offers student supports that include staff
- 6 participation in a school-wide staff training program that was
- 7 <u>implemented:</u>
- 8 (i) by the department under section 1302-A(b)(1)(viii.1),
- 9 the school entity or nonpublic school shall adopt or amend
- 10 existing policy in accordance with section 1302-A(b)(3)(ii); or
- 11 (ii) by the school entity or the nonpublic school under this
- 12 <u>section</u>, the school entity or nonpublic school shall adopt or
- 13 amend existing policy in accordance with this section.
- 14 (2) No later than January 1, 2026, the department shall
- 15 <u>develop a model policy pursuant to section 1302-A(b)(3)(ii) on</u>
- 16 which a school entity or nonpublic school may model an existing
- 17 policy relating to a training program to be conducted by a
- 18 certified trainer for school-wide staff. The policy must
- 19 include:
- 20 (i) Training to recognize indicators of student mental
- 21 distress.
- 22 (ii) Training to recognize mental health decline and mental
- 23 struggle in students.
- 24 (iii) Training to learn appropriate responses and
- 25 intervention techniques to use when a student displays an
- 26 indicator of mental distress, mental health decline or mental
- 27 <u>health struggles.</u>
- 28 (iv) Providing up-to-date contact information for student
- 29 <u>self-care programs or mental health programs.</u>
- 30 (v) Any other school-wide staff skill development or

- 1 information that the school entity or nonpublic school deems
- 2 necessary to address student suicide awareness and educator and
- 3 staff preparedness.
- 4 (3) The policy amended or adopted under paragraph (1) shall
- 5 identify:
- 6 (i) The school-wide staff eligible for training under the
- 7 program.
- 8 (ii) The appropriate school staff person to receive reports
- 9 <u>of incidents of student mental health concerns. An incident</u>
- 10 report shall include the student mental health concern of the
- 11 staff person making the report and the course of action advised
- 12 to the student.
- 13 (iii) A process for submission of documented certification
- 14 of each school-wide staff completing the training to the
- 15 appropriate school staff person and a retention process that
- 16 <u>includes requirements for removal of expired certification and</u>
- 17 <u>any renewal of certification requirements.</u>
- 18 (iv) A process to notify school-wide staff of the
- 19 availability of training conducted by a certified trainer.
- 20 Training shall be provided by the school entity or nonpublic
- 21 <u>school at least two times each school year.</u>
- 22 (4) Each school entity and nonpublic school shall review the
- 23 policy amended or adopted under paragraph (1) every three (3)
- 24 years and annually provide the department with a copy of the
- 25 policy relating to student mental health, which shall also
- 26 include:
- (i) Information related to the development and
- 28 implementation of any student mental health distress prevention,
- 29 <u>intervention and education program.</u>
- 30 (ii) Data of incidents, with identifying information

- 1 <u>redacted</u>, of mental health concerns reported to the designated
- 2 school staff person under the school entity or nonpublic
- 3 school's policy.
- 4 (c) Beginning with the 2026-2027 school year, and each
- 5 school year thereafter, each school entity that offers a
- 6 training program conducted by a certified trainer for school-
- 7 wide staff to recognize and respond appropriately to indicators
- 8 of mental distress and suicidal ideation in students may include
- 9 the training in the continuing education plan submitted by the
- 10 school entity to the department for approval pursuant to section
- 11 1205.1 for no more than four (4) hours of training, every five
- 12 <u>(5)</u> years.
- 13 (d) Each school entity and nonpublic school shall make the
- 14 policy adopted or amended under this section available on the
- 15 publicly accessible Internet website of the school entity or
- 16 <u>nonpublic school</u>, <u>if available</u>, <u>and in every classroom</u>. <u>Each</u>
- 17 school entity shall post the policy at a prominent location
- 18 within each school building where notices are usually posted.
- 19 Each school entity shall ensure that the policy and procedures
- 20 for reporting bullying incidents are reviewed with students
- 21 within ninety (90) days after adoption and at least once each
- 22 school year thereafter.
- 23 Section 4. Section 1306-B(j) of the act is amended by adding
- 24 a paragraph to read:
- 25 Section 1306-B. School Safety and Security Grant Program.
- 26 * * *
- 27 (j) Specific purposes. -- The committee shall provide grants
- 28 to school entities for programs that address school mental
- 29 health and safety and security, including:
- * * *

- (17.1) Staff training programs conducted by a certified 1 trainer to recognize and respond appropriately to indicators 2 of mental distress and suicidal ideation in students, 3 4 including costs associated with participation in a training program implemented by the department under section 1302-A(b) 5 6 (1) (viii.1) for school-wide staff training or incurred by a 7 school entity or nonpublic school that implements a policy under section 1303.2-A. 8 9
- 10 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
