- 9 2025, and ending June 30, 2026.
- 10 "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau
- 11 or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant
- 12 superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists,
- 13 engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries,
- 14 auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians,
- 15 marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and
- 16 other assistants in a department, board or commission.
- 17 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding
- 18 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies,
- 19 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and
- 20 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage,
- 21 telecommunication devices and telecommunication rentals and toll
- 22 charges, newspaper advertising and notices, public advertising-
- 23 by or through any medium, fuel, light, heat, power and water,
- 24 minor construction and renovation, repairs or reconstruction of
- 25 equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and
- 26 equipment, premiums on workers' compensation, insurance premiums
- 27 on policies of liability insurance, insurance premiums on
- 28 medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer
- 29 workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee-
- 30 and retired employee group hospital and medical insurance,

- 1 payment of Commonwealth share of Social Security taxes and
- 2 unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the
- 3 purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery
- 4 and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment-
- 5 to the Department of General Services of mileage and other-
- 6 charges for the use of motor vehicles and rental payments for
- 7 permanently assigned motor vehicles and of expenses or costs of
- 8 services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term-
- 9 "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the
- 10 treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must
- 11 be transferred to an outside hospital, provided that in no case-
- 12 shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that-
- 13 provided under the State medical assistance program.

- 17 other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for
- 18 the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and
- 19 for the purposes specified in this act for the current fiscal
