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This act shall be known and may be cited as the General
 Appropriation Act of 2025.

3 Section 102. Definitions.

4 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 5 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 6 context clearly indicates otherwise:

7 "COVID" or "COVID-19." The coronavirus disease 2019, an 8 infectious disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome 9 coronavirus 2 that was first identified during December 2019 in 10 Wuhan, China.

11 "Current fiscal year." The fiscal year beginning July 1, 12 2025, and ending June 30, 2026.

"Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau
or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant
superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists,
engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries,
auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians,
marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and
other assistants in a department, board or commission.

20 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding 21 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies, 22 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and 23 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, 24 telecommunication devices and telecommunication rentals and toll

charges, newspaper advertising and notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel, light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation, repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on workers' compensation, insurance premiums on policies of liability insurance, insurance premiums on

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medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer 1 workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee 2 and retired employee group hospital and medical insurance, 3 4 payment of Commonwealth share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the 5 6 purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment 7 to the Department of General Services of mileage and other 8 9 charges for the use of motor vehicles and rental payments for 10 permanently assigned motor vehicles and of expenses or costs of 11 services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term 12 "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must 13 be transferred to an outside hospital, provided that in no case 14 15 shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that provided under the State medical assistance program. 16

17 "Prior fiscal year." The fiscal year beginning July 1 of the
18 fiscal year immediately prior to the current fiscal year.

State appropriations. 25 (a) General Fund.--Except as provided in Part LI, the sums 26 specified in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, 27 are specifically appropriated from the General Fund to agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the 28 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 29 compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or 30

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appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the 1 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the 2 purchase or rental of goods and services, printing, public 3 4 advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by 5 6 law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes specified 7 in this act for the current fiscal year and for the payment of 8 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the prior 9 10 fiscal year.

(b) Special funds and accounts.--Except as provided in Part 11 LI, the sums specified in this act, or as much thereof as may be 12 necessary, are specifically appropriated from the special funds 13 14 and accounts in the State Treasury to agencies of the Executive 15 and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the 16 duly appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for 17 18 the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the 19 purchase or rental of goods and services and for payment of any 20 other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and 21 22 for the purposes specified in this act for the current fiscal year and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 23 at the close of the prior fiscal year. 24

25 Section 105. Federal appropriations.

Except as otherwise provided in Part LI, the Federal appropriations specified in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are specifically appropriated to the agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth specified in this act for the payment of the

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expenses of implementing and carrying out the programs specified 1 in this act for the current fiscal year and for the payment of 2 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the prior 3 4 fiscal year. Unless otherwise stated, the Federal appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal year. 5 6 Section 106. References to Department of Criminal Justice. In addition to the amounts specifically appropriated in this act to the Department of Human Services, all moneys 5 6 appropriated from the Federal Government during a previous fiscal year which are expected to be received as reimbursements 7 may be carried forward until the close of the current fiscal 8 year to the extent that obligations are carried forward. In 9 10 addition, reimbursements actually received to support the 11 obligations may also be carried forward.

12 Section 6104. Subgrants between Federal appropriations.

Subgrants may be made between Federal appropriations without 13 further approval of the General Assembly. The Secretary of the 14 15 Budget shall submit a list of subgrants to the chair and minority chair of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and 16 the chair and minority chair of the Appropriations Committee of 17 18 the House of Representatives quarterly. No subgrant to a State 19 agency, however, may be made from a restricted receipt account 20 without a specific appropriation by the General Assembly. 21 Section 6105. Utilization of emergency Federal funds.

(a) Natural disasters and civil disobedience.--Federal funds available for costs and damages resulting from natural disasters or civil disobedience may be added to an appropriation contained in this act or to funds otherwise appropriated or may be used for the purposes prescribed by the Federal Government.

(b) Other emergencies.--In addition to the moneys appropriated by this act, moneys received from the Federal Government for the purpose of disaster assistance or relief, or other moneys received as a direct result of terrorist acts,

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1 moneys for homeland security and defense and moneys for avian
2 flu/pandemic preparedness shall be paid into the General Fund
3 and are appropriated out of the General Fund to the departments,
4 boards, commissions or agencies designated by the Governor.

5 (c) Executive authorization.--In the event of an emergency 6 situation in which the General Assembly cannot act in sufficient 7 time, the Governor is authorized through executive authorization 8 to provide up to \$10,000,000 in Federal funds to alleviate the 9 emergency situation.

10 (d) Federal funding related to COVID-19 and the impact of 11 COVID-19.--The following apply to funds received from the 12 Federal Government for assistance with the response to the 13 COVID-19 pandemic and the economic impact of the COVID-19 14 pandemic:

15 (1) For Federal funds which are required by Federal law
16 to be allocated to a specific program which is in existence
17 prior to the effective date of this section, the Federal
18 funds are hereby appropriated to the program.

19 (2) For Federal funds which are required by Federal law
20 to be allocated by the Commonwealth according to a formula
21 mandated by Federal law, the Federal funds are hereby
22 appropriated for allocation according to the formula.

(3) All other Federal funds under this subsection shall
be deposited in the COVID-19 Response Restricted Account and
shall only be used upon appropriation by the General
Assembly.

(e) Definition.--For the purposes of this section,
"emergency" is defined as a situation in which there is a chance
of or which may result in substantial human suffering.
Section 6105.1. Federal funding relating to infrastructure.

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The following apply to funds received from the Federal
 Government for infrastructure projects:

3 (1) For Federal funds which are required by Federal law
4 to be allocated to a specific program which is in existence
5 prior to the effective date of this section, the Federal
6 funds are appropriated to the program.

7 (2) For Federal funds which are required by Federal law
8 to be allocated by the Commonwealth according to a formula
9 mandated by Federal law, the Federal funds are appropriated
10 for allocation according to the formula.

11 (3) All other Federal funds under this section shall be 12 deposited in the Federal Infrastructure Project Account and 13 shall only be used upon appropriation by the General 14 Assembly.

Section 6106. Transfer of funds from TANFBG to CCDFBG and SSBG. 15 16 In accordance with Federal law which permits the transfer of funds from the TANFBG to the CCDFBG and SSBG, the Department of 17 18 Human Services, upon approval of the Secretary of the Budget, 19 may transfer funds, provided that the transfer will not result 20 in a deficit in an appropriation from which funds are 21 transferred. The Secretary of the Budget shall provide 10 days' 22 prior notification of the transfer to the chair and the minority chair of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the 23 chair and minority chair of the Appropriations Committee of the 24 25 House of Representatives.

14 Section 7103. Contracts prerequisite to encumbering or 15 committing funds.

16 Funds available to agencies, boards, departments, commissions or other governmental entities under this act for the 17 18 procurement of supplies, services or construction shall not be 19 available for payment of or to be committed to or encumbered for 20 payment of the procurement unless and until the agency, board, 21 department or other governmental entity has complied with all of 22 the requirements applicable to the procurement that are specified in 62 Pa.C.S. (relating to procurement) and in the 23 24 policies, procedures and regulations instituted in accordance 25 with 62 Pa.C.S.

26 Section 7104. Minority business set-asides.

(a) Duty to report.--Each department or other
instrumentality of the Commonwealth listed in Subpart A of Part
II authorized to contract for buildings, highways, commodities,
equipment, supplies or services shall report to the General

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Assembly all information pertinent to anticipated procurement 1 needs at the beginning of each quarter during a fiscal year. 2 (b) Definition.--As used in this section, the term "minority 3 4 business" means a minority business enterprise as defined in the act of July 22, 1974 (P.L.598, No.206), known as the 5 6 Pennsylvania Minority Business Development Authority Act. Section 7105. Appropriation of funds from miscellaneous 7 8 sources.

9 In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act:

10 (1)Moneys received in payment for food and household 11 supplies furnished to employees and other persons, except 12 inmates, by an institution and moneys received from the proceeds from the sale of products of the soil, meats, 13 14 livestock, timber or other materials sold by a department or 15 agency of the Commonwealth shall be paid into the General 16 Fund and are appropriated out of the General Fund to the 17 several respective institutions for the operation and 18 maintenance of the institutions.

19 (2) Moneys received from any other source, except the 20 Federal Government, as contributions for the purposes 21 specified in the respective appropriations or as payment for 22 services or materials furnished by one institution to another, except those collections designated as revenues, 23 shall be paid into the General Fund and are appropriated out 24 25 of the General Fund for the purposes of the respective 26 appropriations.

Commonwealth from other sources, except the Federal
Government, as contributions or supplements to the department

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in this act shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to the appropriation for that program or administration of the act.

4 Section 7106. Lapsing of unused funds.

(a) General rule.--Except as otherwise provided by law or by
this section, that part of all appropriations in this act
unexpended, uncommitted or unencumbered as of the close of the
current fiscal year shall automatically lapse as of that day.

The appropriations in sections 241, 242 and 243 to the Supreme, Superior and Commonwealth Courts, respectively, for justice and judge expenses are contingent upon a vouchered expense account plan being continued by the Supreme Court. Section 7108. Transfer of excess funds.

30 The Governor may transfer moneys in funds receiving proceeds

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of Commonwealth of Pennsylvania general obligation bonds in 1 excess of the amount necessary for the purposes for which the 2 3 bonds were issued to the appropriate sinking fund for payment of debt service due on outstanding bonds. If the excess money, 4 together with any available balance, exceeds the amount of debt 5 6 service remaining to be paid, the money shall be transferred to the General Fund or to the appropriate special fund responsible 7 for the debt service. 8

Section 7109. Transfers for government support agencies. 9 During the current fiscal year, any prior year amount 10 11 unexpended on the effective date of this section may, upon the 12 written concurrence of the President pro tempore of the Senate, the Majority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of 13 Representatives and the Majority Leader of the House of 14 15 Representatives, be transferred between any of the following 16 accounts:

The appropriation in this act or in any other fiscal year to 5 6 the Legislative Reapportionment Commission remaining unexpended and unencumbered on the effective date of this section may, upon 7 8 the written concurrence of the President pro tempore of the 9 Senate, the Majority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of the 10 House of Representatives and the Majority Leader of the House of 11 Representatives, be transferred to any other account of the 12 Senate and the House of Representatives, as they deem necessary. Section 7111.
