## A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Petitioning the Congress of the United States to call a Convention for proposing amendments pursuant to Article V of 2 the Constitution of the United States limited to proposing 3 amendments that impose fiscal restraints on the Federal Government, limit the power and jurisdiction of the Federal 5 Government and limit the terms of office for its officials 6 7 and for members of Congress. 8 WHEREAS, The Founders of our Constitution empowered State legislators to be guardians of liberty against future abuses of power by the Federal Government; and 10 11 WHEREAS, The Federal Government has created a crushing 12 national debt through improper and imprudent spending; and 13 WHEREAS, The Federal Government has invaded the legitimate 14 roles of the states through the manipulative process of Federal mandates, most of which are unfunded to a great extent; and 15 16 WHEREAS, The Federal Government has ceased to operate under a proper interpretation of the Constitution of the United States; 18 and 19 WHEREAS, It is the solemn duty of the states to protect the liberty of our people, especially for future generations, by 20

- 1 proposing amendments to the Constitution of the United States
- 2 through a Convention for proposing amendments under Article V
- 3 for the purpose of restraining these and related abuses of
- 4 power; therefore be it
- 5 RESOLVED (the House of Representatives concurring), That the
- 6 General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby
- 7 apply to the Congress of the United States under the provisions
- 8 of Article V of the Constitution of the United States, for the
- 9 calling of a Convention limited to proposing amendments to the
- 10 Constitution of the United States that impose fiscal restraints
- 11 on the Federal Government, limit the power and jurisdiction of
- 12 the Federal Government and limit the terms of office for its
- 13 officials and for members of Congress; and be it further
- 14 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly of the Commonwealth adopt
- 15 this application expressly subject to the following
- 16 reservations, understandings and declarations:
- 17 (1) An application to Congress for an Article V
- 18 Convention confers no power on Congress other than to perform
- 19 a ministerial function to call a Convention.
- 20 (2) This ministerial duty shall be performed by Congress
- 21 only when Article V applications for substantially the same
- 22 purpose are received from two-thirds of the legislatures of
- 23 the several states.
- 24 (3) The power of Congress to call a Convention solely
- consists of the authority to name a reasonable time and place
- for the initial meeting of the Convention.
- 27 (4) Congress possesses no power to name delegates to the
- 28 Convention, as this power remains exclusively within the
- 29 authority of the legislatures of the several states.
- 30 (5) Congress possesses no power to set the number of

- delegates to be sent by any state.
- 2 (6) Congress possesses no power to determine any rules 3 for the Convention.
- 4 (7) According to the universal historical precedent of 5 interstate conventions in America, states meet under 6 conditions of equal sovereignty, which means one state, one
- 7 vote.
- 8 (8) A convention convened pursuant to this application 9 is limited to consideration of topics solely specified in 10 this resolution.
- 11 (9) This application is made with the express

  12 understanding that no amendment which in any way seeks to

  13 amend, modify or repeal any provision of the Bill of Rights

  14 of the Constitution of the United States is authorized for

  15 consideration at any stage.
- 16 (10) This application shall be void ab initio if ever used at any stage to consider any change to any amendment within the Bill of Rights.
- 19 (11) The General Assembly of the Commonwealth may 20 provide further instructions to its delegates.
- 21 (12) The General Assembly of the Commonwealth may recall
  22 its delegates at any time for breach of their duties or
  23 violation of their instructions.
- 24 (13) Under Article V, Congress may determine whether
  25 proposed amendments shall be ratified by the legislatures of
  26 the several states or by special state ratification
- 27 conventions;
- 28 and be it further
- 29 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly of the Commonwealth
- 30 recommend that Congress choose ratification by state

- 1 legislatures; and be it further
- 2 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly of the Commonwealth
- 3 appoint five delegates to any Convention called pursuant to this
- 4 application in accordance with the following:
- 5 (1) That the Senate choose two delegates. The House of
- 6 Representatives shall choose two delegates. Each chamber
- 7 shall nominate two additional persons to serve as alternates.
- 8 The President pro tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of
- 9 the House of Representatives shall jointly choose the fifth
- 10 delegate from the list of nominated alternates.
- 11 (2) That the President pro tempore of the Senate and the
- 12 Speaker of the House of Representatives shall each nominate
- five persons to serve as delegates. Each legislator may cast
- 14 a vote for not more than two persons on his or her respective
- 15 slate. The two candidates getting the most votes are the
- 16 Convention delegates appointed by each respective chamber.
- 17 The two candidates getting the next highest number of votes
- are appointed as alternate delegates.
- 19 (3) That neither the Governor, nor any current member of
- the Congress of the United States nor any sitting judge of
- any court be appointed as a delegate of the Commonwealth.
- 22 (4) That travel and per diem expenses of each delegate
- of the Commonwealth be paid by the Commonwealth on the same
- 24 basis as the reimbursement for such costs when members of the
- legislature travel on official business of the Commonwealth.
- 26 (5) That any delegate or alternate of the Commonwealth
- 27 who receives and accepts any item of value, excluding
- 28 education materials, from any person or entity in any
- 29 connection with their service be immediately disqualified and
- 30 shall be replaced by an alternate immediately.

(6) That each delegate of the Commonwealth take the following oath on penalty of perjury:

"I promise to faithfully conduct my duties as a delegate from Pennsylvania to the Convention. I will obey all instructions received with my commission. Specifically, I will not support, but will affirmatively oppose, any proposal that goes outside the subject matter specified therein. I further agree to immediately notify the President pro tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives if I believe that any Pennsylvania delegate or alternate delegate has violated his or her oath or instructions while participating in the Convention. I realize that I can and will be immediately removed from my position if I violate this oath and that I will be required to reimburse the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for all expenses paid to me as a delegate. I realize also that I may be punished for contempt by the General Assembly for failing to adhere to this oath."

- (7) That prior to the Convention, the General Assembly of the Commonwealth may by concurrent resolution provide further instructions to the delegates of the Commonwealth selected pursuant to this resolution regarding the scope of matters they may consider and vote on at the Convention, including rules of procedure and proposed amendments. The instructions may be changed by the General Assembly prior to or during the course of the Convention and may include:
- (i) an instruction that the Pennsylvania delegates may not support any voting rule other than the default

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1 rule whereby each state exercises one vote; and

2 (ii) an instruction that on all voting matters at
3 the Convention, the decision of a simple majority of the
4 delegates of the Commonwealth shall constitute a single
5 vote for Pennsylvania.

- (8) That after delegates of the Commonwealth have been selected, the General Assembly of the Commonwealth may by concurrent resolution recall delegates or alternates to the Convention or appoint new delegates or alternates.
- (9) That if the General Assembly of the Commonwealth is not in session, delegates of the Commonwealth be suspended pending a concurrent resolution by a joint legislative committee duly authorized by the General Assembly for that purpose. This joint legislative committee shall be authorized to conduct its business via telephone or other means of real-time electronic communication.
- (10) That a delegate who is recalled, disqualified or otherwise unable to perform his or her duties shall be immediately replaced by one of the alternates, as directed by the concurrent resolution or duly authorized joint legislative committee.
- (11) That any vote cast by a delegate of the Commonwealth or an alternate delegate at an Article V Convention that is outside the scope of the following be void:
- (i) the instructions established by a concurrent resolution adopted under this resolution; and
- (ii) the limits placed by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth in a concurrent resolution that calls for an Article V Convention for the purpose of proposing

- 1 amendments to the Constitution of the United States on
- 2 the subjects and amendments that may be considered by the
- 3 Article V Convention;
- 4 and be it further
- 5 RESOLVED, That this resolution constitute a continuing
- 6 application in accordance with Article V of the Constitution of
- 7 the United States until at least two-thirds of the legislatures
- 8 of the several states have made application for a Convention on
- 9 the same subject; and be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to
- 11 the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the
- 12 United States House of Representatives, each member of the
- 13 Pennsylvania delegation to Congress and the presiding officers
- 14 of each house of the state legislatures requesting their
- 15 cooperation in applying for a Convention limited to the subject
- 16 matter contemplated by this application.
