A RESOLUTION

1 Honoring all Pennsylvania veterans who served during war and
2 peace on the occasion of Veterans Day, November 11, 2022.

3 WHEREAS, In 1918, on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day in
4 the eleventh month, the world rejoiced and celebrated because,
5 after four years of bitter war, an armistice was signed that
6 declared the "war to end all wars" over; and

7 WHEREAS, November 11 was set aside as Armistice Day in the
8 United States to remember the sacrifices men and women made
9 during World War I in order to ensure a lasting peace; and

10 WHEREAS, On Armistice Day, soldiers who survived the war
11 marched in parades through their hometowns, and politicians,
12 public officials and veteran officers gave speeches and held
13 ceremonies of thanks for the peace they had won; and

14 WHEREAS, The Congress of the United States voted Armistice
15 Day a legal holiday in 1938, but Americans realized that the
16 previous war would not be the last one; and

1 WHEREAS, World War II began the following year, and nations
2 great and small again participated in a bloody struggle; and

3 WHEREAS, After World War II, Armistice Day continued to be
4 observed on November 11; and

5 WHEREAS, In 1953, townspeople in Emporia, Kansas, called the
6 holiday "Veterans Day" in gratitude to the veterans in their
7 town; and

8 WHEREAS, Soon after, Congress passed a bill renaming the
9 national holiday as Veterans Day; and

10 WHEREAS, Americans still give thanks to veterans for their
11 service on Veterans Day with ceremonies and speeches, and, at 11
12 a.m., many Americans observe a moment of silence in remembrance
13 of those who fought and for those who gave their lives to
14 preserve the freedoms we now enjoy; therefore be it

15 RESOLVED, That the Senate honor all Pennsylvania veterans who
16 served during war and peace on the occasion of Veterans Day,
17 November 11, 2022; and be it further

18 RESOLVED, That the Senate encourage communities to
19 participate in Veterans Day ceremonies across this Commonwealth
20 in recognition of the approximately 770,800 current Pennsylvania
21 residents who have served in the Armed Forces to protect the
22 United States and this Commonwealth during our greatest times of
23 need.
