3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Federal Firearms Li5 censee Protection Act of 2019".

6 SEC. 2. AMENDMENTS TO ENHANCE CERTAIN PENALTIES.

7 Section 924 of title 18, United States Code, is8 amended—

1 (1) by striking subsection (i) and inserting the 2 following: 3 "(i)(1)(A) A person who knowingly violates section 4 922(u), or attempts to do so, shall be fined under this 5 title, imprisoned not more than 20 years, or both. 6 "(B) In the case of a violation described in subpara-7 graph (A) that occurs during the commission of— "(i) a burglary, the term of imprisonment shall 8 9 be not less than 3 years; or "(ii) a robbery, the term of imprisonment shall 10 11 be not less than 5 years. 12 "(2) In this subsection— "(A) the term 'burglary' means the unlawful 13 14 entry into, or remaining in, the business premises of 15 a licensed importer, licensed manufacturer, or li-16 censed dealer with the intent to commit a crime; and 17 "(B) the term 'robbery' has the meaning given 18 the term in section 1951(b)."; and 19 (2) in subsection (m), by inserting "or attempts to do so," after "or licensed collector,". 20
