## A BILL

To reauthorize United States-Israel cooperation to counter unmanned aerial systems.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “United States-Israel  
5 Cooperation to Counter Unmanned Aerial Systems Reau-  
6 thorization and Reform Act”.

7 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

8 Congress finds the following:

1           (1) Unmanned aerial systems (UAS) remain a  
2           threat to Israel and to the United States.

3           (2) Israel played a crucial role in the early de-  
4           velopment of UAS technology and is today still one  
5           of the top global innovators in this area.

6           (3) Since the establishment of the authority to  
7           provide United States-Israel cooperation to counter  
8           unmanned aerial systems under section 1278 of the  
9           National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year  
10          2020 (22 U.S.C. 8606 note), new technologies have  
11          been developed and are currently deployed by the  
12          elements of the Department of Defense and the De-  
13          partment of Homeland Security.

14 **SEC. 3. REAUTHORIZATION OF UNITED STATES-ISRAEL CO-**  
15                                   **OPERATION TO COUNTER UNMANNED AER-**  
16                                   **IAL SYSTEMS.**

17          Section 1278(f) of the National Defense Authoriza-  
18          tion Act, 2020 (Public Law 116–92; 133 Stat. 1702) is  
19          amended by striking “December 31, 2024” and inserting  
20          “December 31, 2026”.
