Mr. CISNEROS introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To require the Secretary of Defense to brief the Armed Services Committee of the House of Representatives on the feasibility of consolidating covered prevention services into a single facility for each military installation, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Defense Health Agency
5 Prevention Services Enhancement Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. BRIEFING ON CONSOLIDATING COVERED PREVEN-**
2 **TION SERVICES.**

3 (a) BRIEFING REQUIRED.—Not later than 180 days
4 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary
5 of Defense, in consultation with each Secretary of a mili-
6 tary department, shall provide to the Armed Services
7 Committee of the House of Representatives a briefing on
8 the feasibility of consolidating covered prevention services
9 into a single facility for each military installation (as de-
10 fined in section 2801 of title 10, United States Code) lo-
11 cated in the United States.

12 (b) CONTENT.—The briefing required by subsection
13 (a) shall include the following:

14 (1) An assessment of the feasibility and advis-
15 ability of consolidating covered prevention services
16 into a single facility for each military installation.

17 (2) A cost estimate for such consolidation.

18 (3) An evaluation of the efforts of each Sec-
19 retary of a military department to consolidate cov-
20 ered prevention services into a single facility for each
21 military installation under the jurisdiction of such
22 Secretary and successes and lessons learned from
23 such efforts.

24 (c) COVERED PREVENTION SERVICES DEFINED.—In
25 this section, the term “covered prevention services” means
26 services offered by the Secretary of Defense or a Secretary

1 of a military department to a member of the Armed
2 Forces or a dependent of such member relating to—

3 (1) preventing sexual assault, suicide, harass-
4 ment, domestic violence; and

5 (2) other related community-based prevention
6 services.
